Airport meeting draws parties to talks

Representatives from more than 14 state, county, municipal, and private agencies sat down at the table Wednesday, June 22, at the Apopka Community Center/VFW, to discuss their differences and how they might work together to create an airport in Apopka that would bring economic advantages to the areas surrounding Lake Apopka, yet leave the increasingly diverse wildlife population untouched.

WOAA Chairman Guy Haggard said the purpose of the meeting was to get everyone pushing the ball in the same direction, and according to what individuals shared at the meet-

ing, that goal was met, as long as their individual concerns are addressed in the process of making the plan a reality.

West Orange Airport Authority (WOAA) invited everyone who has an interest in the airport project to the table, and that included representatives of FDOT, Orange County Planning Department, Orange County director of transportation, Lake County Economic Development, St. Johns River Water Management District, the cities of Apopka, Ocoee, and Winter Garden, members of the XO4 Condo Association, the Friends of Lake Apopka-an environmental group, and numerous representatives from private businesses and financial institutions.

Haggard shared the history of WOAA, previously known as the Tri-City Airport Authority, and the goals in the early

part of the workshop. "We have four airstrips in the area," he said. "Our goal is to make the whole area one

of economic development for aviators. We have rail in the

Update on Errol, Highland

Apopka police are still investigating the operations of the former Highland Manor restaurant that was housed in the city-owned building at 604 E. Main Street.

In addition, city officials are continuing to work with those who had special events scheduled when the restaurant was closed down by the city due to more than \$300,000 in rent owed by Richard Wilhelm, who ran the business.

In an unrelated matter, the Errol Estate Resort and Country Club dining room and bar are still shuttered, but the member-owned club's board of directors began meeting Thursday, June 23, past press time to try to chart a course of action for the 40-year old country club.

Mike Robinson, interim general manager of the club, said the board of directors would also meet today, Friday, June 24.

The golf course, golf pro shop, tennis courts, and swimming pool are open for business.

In the investigation of Highland Manor, Apopka Police Chief Rob Manley said his department was at a standstill while waiting on various documents. "Right now, we're waiting for (Highland Manor) bank records to come back," he said. Those documents have been subpoenaed and the banks have two weeks to get them to the police, Manley said.

In addition, Apopka police will interview the restaurant's account and events coordinator, and are seeking a warrant to get information off the business' computer, the police chief said.

"We're still plugging along every day," Manley said. "Usually, these cases do take time because you're waiting on someone else to get the information. I'd like

City considering system that would aid hearing-impaired

With modern technology reaching the point that physical disabilities can be accommodated without embarrassing and unsightly assistance, the city of Apopka might soon see one being implemented for its hearing-impaired citizens.

Jim Scott, president of Complete Hearing Solutions

based out of St. Petersburg, was asked by the Foilage Sertoma Club of Apopka to make a presentation Tuesday, June 21, about his company's Induction Loop Systems and the feasibility of implementing it inside the City Council chambers at Apopka City Hall.

"Several of us are members of the Sertoma and City Council," City Commissioner Marilyn Ustler McQueen said.

"As such, we are always keeping our eyes and ears open for ideas which will positively affect the city and community, so we wanted to get more information. The city wanted the Sertoma Club to take the lead and then present the information to it. Mr. Scott coming to the meeting and doing the presentation was one of the steps

Record numbers of birds love Lake Apopka's shores

Officials at the St. Johns River Water Management District have been increasingly excited about the numbers of birds and the new species that are being sighted on the marshland on the north shores of Lake Apopka.

"We have seen record numbers of white ibis," said Jim Peterson, a field program supervisor with the St. Johns River Water Management District. "This time of year, they are finishing up their nesting and so they fly back and forth from their roosting area to Lake Apopka to feed."

Record numbers of roseate spoonbills, a long-legged pink bird similar to a flamingo, have been seen. A main obvious difference is a flat "spoon-shaped" bill. During the second week of June, more than 50 of the birds were spotted, a record number

for Orange County, since the birds typically are found in south Florida.

"I think they may have come here because, due to the

drought, areas where they have been may be drying up and there is still water here," said Peterson.

Whooping cranes, the largest bird in America, have also re-

cently visited the marshland. The white birds can stand taller than five feet and have a wingspan of approximately seven-and-a-half feet. They have red crowns and dark-colored bills. When they fly, their necks stay straight, but their long dark legs trail behind.

"We believe the female is about five-years-old and the male is about eight-years-old," Peterson said. "The Fish and Wildlife Department track them, so we have a pretty good idea."

White pelicans, which usually winter in Florida but fly to North Dakota to breed, during the summer, have also been seen on the marshlands.

"It's really unusual to have them in the summer in Florida," Peterson said. "There were 16 white pelicans counted on Wednesday."

Harry Robinson, a renowned birder from England, is often found on the property.

Robinson's grandfather, Edward Kay Robinson, the founder of the British Naturalist Association and who taught a young Rudyard Kipling in India, passed on his love of birding to his son, Warhan Robinson. Warhan was Harry's father and a correspondent for the *Times* newspaper of London. Warhan then passed his love of birding to his son, Harry.

"Harry has a knack for finding rare birds," Peterson said. "He knows birds so well that he can see detailed differences between species. He is responsible for identifying at least three new species to our area - one of which is the Eurasian kestrel."

"We have had people fly into the Orland airport from the West Coast, come out to see the Eurasian kestrel, and fly back home again," Peterson said.

Talk: Getting a commercial airport off the ground won't be easy to do

area, and the Wekiva Parkway is coming through. We understand that no other airport in the state of Florida have all three of those modes of transportation. We plan to tie the airports together through roadways."

Haggard said the Orange County government approved the Orlando North Airpark, which is located off Jones Avenue in the Zellwood area, as an airport growth center on Tuesday, June 21.

Susan Caswell, manager of the Orange County Planning Division, said the designation is a county legislative process that changes the future land use designation from agriculture to an aviation growth center in the county's 20-year-comprehensive plan.

Rodger Anderson, manager of the Orlando North Airpark, said the designation approved approximately 450 acres of land, which includes 2.8 million square feet for industrial use on the north side of Jones Avenue and 750,000 square feet for aviation use, such as airplane hangars and a passenger terminal.

"They set 50,000 square feet for commercial business and 150,000 square feet for office space," he said. "We should be approved for zoning by the end of July and it should go before the Orange County Board of Commissioners a month later. It is the only

land designation for an aviation growth center in the state."

Caswell said a growth center is a designated area that affects the county's economic development, but of which the county does not provide services and facilities, such as fire and law enforcement services.

"In this case, the city of Apopka will provide those services," she said.

Jim Wikstrom, FDOT District 5 Aviation and Seaports programs supervisor, said the two most critical factors they use in the approval process are the capital improvement and the demand shown. He said the next step typically would be the airport master plan in which FDOT looks to see how cost effective an airport in WOOA's geographic area would be and a survey process, where local people and businesses are asked if they would use such a facility, and, if so, how much. He also said a wildlife management plan is always part of the approval plan for the FAA.

"We will look at all the airports in the area to see if there would be a better airport or location that would suit the local needs better than the current location as well," Wikstrom said. "We are here to help you, but our first concern is safety and birds are an issue. The incident on the Hudson River is an example." In that situation, a jet taking off from New York City's LaGuardia Airport in January 2009 struck a flock of

birds and was forced to land on the Hudson River. No one was killed in the situation.

Wikstrom said he asked the FAA and a general consultant to review WOOA's concept and he expects to receive a response from them in the next two weeks. The state's aviation manager will make the final decision regarding WOOA's plan.

"If the plan is approved, becoming a part of the state system plan does not promise national funding," Wikstrom said. "The national plan doesn't say there is a need for an airport in this area at this time."

He also said a he expected the plan to come before a regional committee in September. Haggard asked if it could be considered before a state-wide FDOT committee meeting in July, and Wikstrom said he would ask the appropriate authorities for consideration.

Haggard also mentioned that a similar plan had already received FDOT approval in 2004, but that the plan had expired before action was initiated, and Wikstrom replied the economic climate is considerably different today than it was then.

Richard Anderson, the city of Apopka's chief administrative officer, disagreed.

"Things haven't changed that much in Apopka," he said. "We are looking at rail improvements now and we have all we need in one place."

Anderson shared the city's position in a positive and aggressive manner.

"West Orange County is the fastest-growing area in Central Florida," he said. "We have put a lot of money in the infrastructure and other areas to focus on the economic side of the issue. We are having meetings right now with aircraft manufacturers who are interested in relocating here. We have land zoning, an improved railroad coming, the Wekiva Parkway coming, water sewer and reuse all out there and ready to go. We have been working closely with the cities of Ocoee and Winter Garden and we are putting all our eggs in one basket – that is the city of Apopka's vision.

"We have had two competing properties," Anderson said speaking of the Orlando North Airpark and Orlando-Apopka Airport. "We believe we need to work together, not against each other. In the long-term we need to think bigger. The only thing that is holding us back is money. We need the government to step up. We want all around the runway to be privately owned business to get taxes to help build and grow our communities."

Apopka's Anderson said the city's purchase of the fixed base operations of the Orlando-Apopka Airport, located off U.S. Highway 441, should close this month, and they plan to contract the services out to be managed for the city, so they can receive government perks at the location, such as the ability to offer lower gas prices and property tax breaks.

of that process.

"He is currently doing an evaluation for our particular situation. When Mr. Scott is done, he will give us the information we need to make the decisions we need to. Then, we will present it to the city."

The Sertoma Club has specifically set aside \$2,000 for the cause.

"We (the Apopka chapter) are working through the Sertoma Club's Adopt-an-Agency program to implement these types (looping) of projects," Greg Spurlock, president of the Sertoma club, said. "A series of presentations will be held around town over the next several weeks. We welcome the public. The Audio Frequency Induction Loop systems will make it better for those who are hearing impaired to hear. They will have more access because it is much more convenient to follow what is going on."

The Sertoma Adapt-An-Agency program is a subsidiary of the Sertoma organization, which funds projects. The

Florida Hospital Apopka, and Hand and Wires across America are affiliated with the Foliage Sertoma chapter in their efforts to implement the project. However, hearing tests, as well as Camp Endeavor, a summer camp for speech and hearing impaired children, are the other projects being pursued by the three entities.

The Audio Frequency Induction Loop System is a loop of cable around a designated area, usually a room or a building, which generates a magnetic field picked up by a hearing aid.

Scott spent a portion of the presentation discussing the reasons the need for public hearing assistance now exists. Currently, one out of 10 Americans has some hearing loss. Sixty-five percent of those suffering some level of hearing loss are younger than retirement age. That total includes 3 out of 1,000 children born with some sort of loss of hearing.

Why the resistance to using hearing aid devices because of vanity makes the Induction Loop System the preferred de-

vice was included in the presentation. The Induction Loop System is the only assisted listening system which can be used with a hearing aid.

Several other reasons were also discussed.

It delivers personalized sound in each individual ear. Like glasses, each person's ability to listen is based on a variety of factors which make everyone's hearing level different. The Induction Loops System can determine that level for each user.

It is also inconspicuous, hygienic concerns (ear wax getting stuck in the device) are not an issue and background noise does not exist, because it can be used without microphones. No external equipment is needed, nor is there any maintenance cost for belt packs, batteries and headphones. All of this makes it the most effective device on a per-user basis.

But the most important statistic or the one the user cares about the most is a significant increase in his or her ability to hear. The comprehension for the user increases from 0-20

percent without the Induction Loop System to 85-95 percent with it.

"The addition of the Induction Loop System will be an asset to the community," City Commissioner Billie Dean said. "Anything which (the city government) can assist the citizens with their physical needs and, in particular, their hearing is valuable to this community. It would be a positive and fruitful endeavor to provide our citizens with the means for more of them to be able to follow what is going on in the city's government. The presentation was well done and it is something whose time has come."

Scott also evaluated and analyzed the City Council chambers for the potential implementation of the hearing assistance system after the presentation.

This will reduce infection among the family alone by just implementing this easy daily task.

According to the CDC, hand washing should occur before, during, and after preparing food, before eating food, after using the restroom, after changing diapers or cleaning up a child who has used the restroom, before and after caring for someone who is sick, after blowing your nose,

coughing or sneezing, after touching an animal or animal waste, after touching garbage, and before and after treating a cut or wound.

The CDC states that there are about 411 deaths per year due to the influenza virus. Children need to receive all of their vaccines year round as well, especially at the

tender ages from birth until age six.

An example of the importance of regular vaccinations comes from the idea of measles making a comeback in our society. For whatever reason, parents are not getting their children regular vaccinations as frequently as in the past. In regards to herd immunity, if the majority of school children were vaccinated for measles, then the five children that weren't would be immune as well due to their company during school hours. Unfortunately, the majority is not being vaccinated anymore and therefore these once rare sicknesses are now making a comeback.

Ways to be a safe patient...

1. Speak up-talk to doctors and health care providers if there are any worries or questions about safety
2. Keep hands clean
3. Ask questions for your health care provider
4. Be careful with medications
5. Get smart about antibiotics. Make sure to take your full course of prescribed antibiotics even if you begin to feel better before you've finished your course.

Pledge of Allegiance editing beyond the pale

Perhaps you were watching the introduction to NBC's Sunday coverage of golf's U.S. Open. But, if you weren't, you probably have heard the firestorm that quickly built after the introduction aired.

In case you missed it, NBC began its coverage of one of golf's majors with a classroom of elementary school students reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. It was edited to intersperse poignant scenes from America's military. The introduction ended with scenes from well-known memorials in Washington, D.C., near where the U.S. Open was held at Congressional Country Club in Bethesda, Maryland.

NBC had a chance to build American pride and give itself many brownie points with Americans of all stripes with the introduction. As it was, the television network absolutely blew it.

Instead of presenting the Pledge of Allegiance as it has been written since 1954, the network decided, on its own, to edit out the words "under God" twice and "indivisible" once during the introduction, which included two recitations of the abbreviated Pledge of Allegiance.

A couple of hours later, during the broadcast, the network issued an on-air apology, but it was way too little, and it was certainly much too late.

Instead of having to issue an apology, the network should have presented the Pledge of Allegiance as it is written. Why would anyone even think about leaving out words from the Pledge of Allegiance in the first place? Why does

one even think about that, much less actually do it?

At first, NBC tried to say that it had to do with time issues. Huh? In a broadcast that lasted most of Sunday afternoon? A few more seconds to make sure all the words of the Pledge of Allegiance were recited is only logical.

What else is logical is that the people responsible for the horrendous mistake should be fired from their jobs. On something like that, it takes several people to make the decision and approve the editing of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Each one of those people who were involved in approving the introduction as it was broadcast should lose his or her job.

There is no excuse for what happened. None.

We are sure the corporate attorneys at NBC would be all in a tizzy if someone referred to NBC as just NC. Well, the people of the United States of America are the ones who NBC slighted with its production, as our Pledge of Allegiance is much more important than the television network's initials.

Oddly, the introduction mentioned America's virtues that have been handed down from generation to generation. Is changing the Pledge of Allegiance one of these virtues, now?

The bottom line is that NBC deserves all the criticism it has received. We can only hope that those out-of-touch employees also receive what they deserve, the unemployment lines.



EPA water rules drown jobs

There is good news, and there is bad news.

I dread that phrase. Frequently, it is a disguise for, "There is bad news and worse news." That may be the case herein; however, at the present, we must wait to find out.

I remember the line, "It is better to cushion the bad news with the good. Therefore, I will give you the bad news first."

The director of the federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Lisa Jackson, said the agency does not consider economic impacts when issuing regulations. The assistant director of the Environmental Protection Agency explained that, while they may study some economic impacts, they do not calculate job loss

from new rules.

The good news is about the EPA's numeric nutrient criteria. You may recall that little more than a year ago a special interest group got a federal judge to allow the EPA to impose a set of rules for Florida different than the other 49 states.

Florida's existing rules for water quality are in narrative form. The EPA and their spe-

cial interest lackey want Florida to impose rules far more stringent than any of the other states. These rules will have a hugely negative impact on Florida's economy and especially on its dismal job condition. The positive impact of these regulations upon water quality remains speculative.

The outcry against the EPA proposal has been huge. Homeowner groups, business owners, government agencies and elected officials all implored the EPA not to impose its heavy-handed regulations. Until now, all was for naught.

Recently, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) requested that the EPA consider DEP's revised water quality rules be-

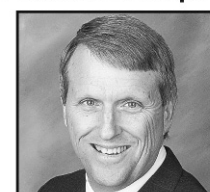

Apopka home values dropped 44.5 %

Property values and a lack of available financing has been a major factor in the continuing economic crisis facing our country. It was forecast that 2011 would be the last of the decline and the real estate markets would begin to rebound. Unfortunately, in the first quarter of 2011, property values all over the country continued to drop. Only two markets either gained ground or remained flat over the last year, neither of which is in Florida.

One of the areas that experienced the sharpest decline over the last year has been the Ocala area, where property values declined by 22.7 percent. In 2008, the point at which many considered to be the beginning of the economic downturn, the average just value for a home in the Apop-

ka area was \$211,343. In 2009, this average took a major hit and was down by 21 percent to \$166,658. Year 2010 brought a continued property value slide, and the average home in Apopka was down another 17 percent to \$137,694. So far this year, the slide has continued another 6.5 percent and the average home just value is around \$128,812. In March of this year, a record number of homes were sold at a loss throughout the country

which totaled 37.7 percent. In the Apopka area, this is much more pronounced. Around 70 percent of all sales are for a loss, and this number is up again in the month of April to 73 percent of all sales.

During the recent legislative session, the Florida House and Senate passed two joint resolutions which will become amendments on your 2012 ballots regarding property taxes. The first is Senate Joint Resolution 592 which, if passed by Floridians, would expand the property tax breaks for injured veterans to include veterans who did not live in Florida when they entered the military.

The second property tax amendment which will appear on your ballot will be regarding first-time homebuyers,

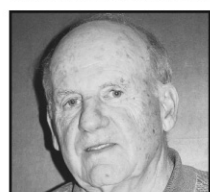
Fear of own incompetence, ignorance drives Socialists to seek power

Special day for media specialist announced

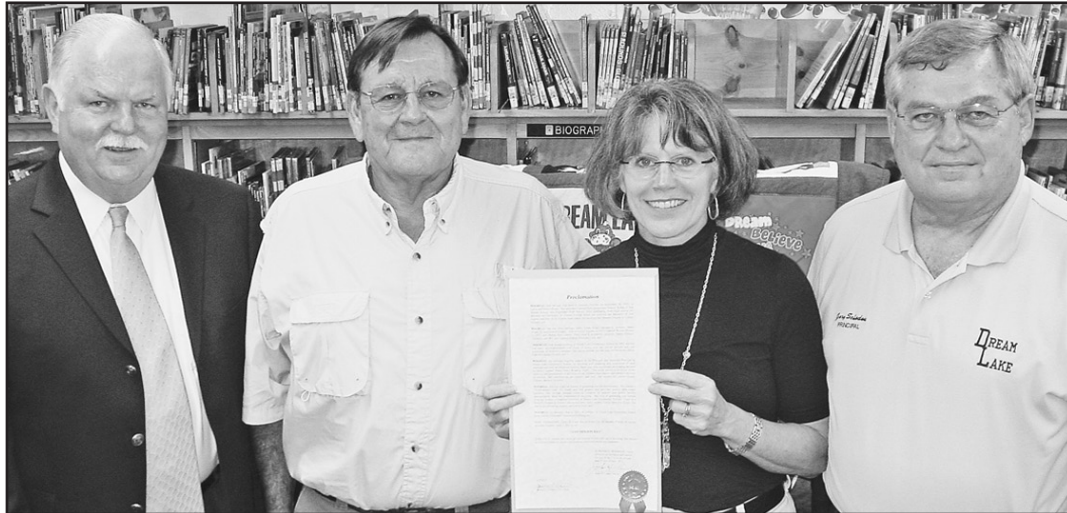

Historic houses were once joined

Historic data sources for this article include the 1992 *Historic Properties Survey of Apopka, Florida, Dr. Jerrell H. Shofner's History of Apopka, Florida and Northwest Orange County, Florida and Angela Nicols' Northwest Orange County Register of Historic Places.*

This week's historical house story is doubly an attention grabber, because it is a most unusual story of two houses that, for a while, were

joined to become one house. And, each housed early Apopkans who were very important to the building of this community.

The larger and older frame vernacular W. T. (Wallace) Champneys House was constructed in Clarcona circa 1895. The F. E. (Francis) Zepp House was built in Apopka about 1910.

In 1916, the Champneys House was relocated to Apopka. On its new site on Main Street (U.S. Highway 441), it was

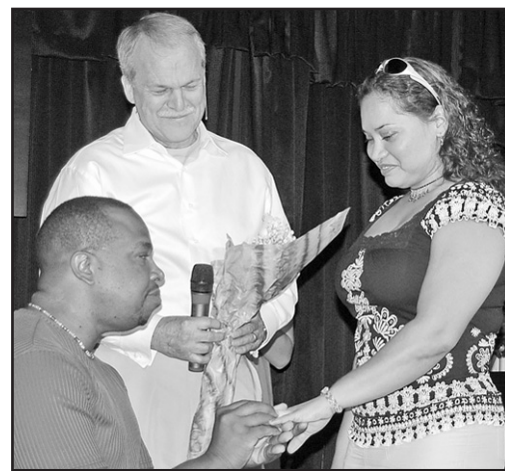

If the city had done so back then, the amount of back rent would have been almost \$100,000 less. The city could have been looking for another tenant, or, better yet, put the property on the market.

If this city's commission-

ers really are pro business, they would create a level playing field for anyone who would like to start a business. Their decision to remain in the rental and restaurant business means a lack of competition.

Why would someone start a good restaurant somewhere in the city knowing full well that the city has a vested interest in the success of another one? Seven or eight people should not decide who can and cannot run a business. Competition is the answer to a better Apopka.

Kathy Till said, it is a real black eye on the community.

The Highland Manor building and other surrounding properties need to be sold and let our government get back to governing our city. The idea of a town center owned by the city is a terrible idea.

First of all, you can't get there from here. The location is as bad as it can get. The traffic pattern at that intersection does not allow easy access or exit. 7-Eleven stores will build a new store across the street from an existing location to make it easier to access.

Second of all, I believe a private developer at some point will legally challenge the city of Apopka for using public funds to compete against private industry. I personally saw this type of challenge in another state when a public gas utility was beginning to go into the business of servicing gas water heaters, stoves, dryers, and furnaces. The heating and air conditioning contractors and their association brought suit, and the public utility was ordered to immediately cease and desist this operation, as you cannot use public funds to compete against private industry. Incidentally,

the decision was not appealed either. This is not rocket science, just common sense.

We have two private entities. Errol Estate Country Club and Sweetwater Country Club, in the nearby geographical area that have facilities for and are in the business of providing services for wedding receptions, banquets, luncheon meetings, and other gatherings of this type. This building that housed Highland Manor is set up for the very same type of operation and is in direct competition with those privately owned country clubs for any gatherings of this nature.

If our city is so flush with funds to purchase millions of dollars of property other than for city operations and services buildings, why don't we use these funds for additional public safety and economic development in our city?

We are the second largest city in Orange County, approximately 41,000 residents covering 25 square miles, and we do not have even one Darden restaurant in our city. Does anyone see anything wrong with this picture? The city should be avidly pursuing businesses to operate in our city. Could it have been a conflict of interest to have a restaurant in a building

the city owns and not pursue other restaurants to build in the city? I am not trying to necessarily promote Darden in particular, just some additional popular restaurants that will provide the citizens variety and employ citizens.

How about also using some of these funds to employ a police bike patrol in the downtown area?

The downtown area has a beautiful million-dollar bridge over U.S. Highway 441 and three traffic lights in less than a mile and yet people are still crossing a major U.S. highway in many uncontrolled locations. People standing in left-turn lanes, and some with children or on bicycles are continually seen jaywalking and obstructing the normal traffic flow - a very dangerous situation, to say the least.

When the bridge was built a few years ago, supposedly tickets would be given for jaywalking. Have any tickets been written or warnings given? Are we waiting for a life to be lost before action is taken? Let's get proactive instead of reactive!

While I feel that generally our city government is doing well, the mayor, manager, and City Council need to get out of the private sector. If you want

to play in the private sector, form your own private group and do what you like with your own money, not our taxes. In my normal day-to-day travels, I have had many conversations with Apopka residents and from those, I know I am not the only citizen who has this opinion.

Apopkan in Price is Right

Apopka native Jessica White, 24, thought she had lost the opportunity to be in the television audience for The Price is Right game show when the episode she had tickets for was cancelled. Talk: Birds are a concern for airport

"I think we are the largest land-owners in the area," said Robert Christiansen, director of the St. Johns River Water Management District Department of Operations and Land Resources. "As neighbors, I don't think we have any qualms, but it does have one of the highest densities of a variety of species of birds in the continental U.S. How does the bird/airplane situation work out is our biggest question. The area is developed to attract birds, so it is a definite issue. If it can be demonstrated that the birds and the airplanes can co-exist, we are open to the idea."

Christiansen said the federal government is also involved with the wildlife in the Apopka area. "As long as there are endangered species in the area," he said, "and there are a lot of endangered species there, then there is a lot of federal involvement. I can assure you that they keep their eyes open and they are very interested in the health of the area. I believe the required continued studies will reveal the problems."

Much of the land belonging to the water district could not be used, Christiansen said, because grants have been received that forbid that it not be used for conservation.

Major William Maxwell cited a precedent to Christiansen, in which the Orange County Convention Center swapped acres of land with the district that were more useful for conservation. Christiansen replied the district would definitely be interested if land was offered that was more accommodating to conservation needs than some of the land currently occupied by the water district.

"Every hill is climbable," said Roger Anderson. "What we want to do is work out a win-win for everyone and bring economic development to the area that will give people jobs so they can feed their families.

The economic development from the WOOA project is designed to bring 2,400 jobs to the area, that usually pay 10-15 percent higher than other jobs in the area, and there will be no houses - it will be all businesses. "Northwest Orange County has kind of been a step-child; it has been neglected in Orange County," he said. "We have got to do something to improve our economy."

Jim Thomas, spokesman for the Friends of Lake Apopka, said his group is neither for nor against the project.

"The airport scares us," he said. "Sanford has had a terrible time with birds (at its airport). They spend a lot of money every day to deal with the impact of birds on planes and they had to buy an expensive permit that lets them shoot bald eagles as well. You talk of expanding the length of the runway, which will allow corporate jets. There is a liability issue. There are large flocks of pelicans - great flocks that fly at high altitudes and it seems that would be a real problem with us. Who's liable when there is an accident with birds? The city of Apopka? The state? I think it would be the taxpayer who ends up paying. I don't personally see how the issue can be resolved. We are not opposing it, but we are not supporting it either."

Mona Phipps, an Oakland town commissioner and another spokesperson for the Friends of Lake Apopka, said she felt there would be a battle with people who are environmentally sensitive.

Bob Loomis, one of the owners of the Orlando North Airpark off Jones Avenue in the Zellwood area, said he felt the WOOA plan would improve the situation between birds and airplanes. "We are currently approved as a training area," he said. "If we are approved, then there will be a specific air traffic control in the area, and it won't have people flying low directly over the sensitive areas

of concern. All aircraft will be required to come in at a certain heading and depart at a certain heading, kind of like a highway. If we can have that corridor, it will be a lot more controlled."

"I can say we are on board with what is going on," said Allen Brinkerhoff, a representative from the X04 Condominium Association Board at Orlando-Apopka Airport, off U.S. 441 near the entrance to Zellwood Station.

Ninety-year-old Capt. Leroy Brown, director of the Airlines Industry Museum at the Orlando-Apopka Airport, said the board of the museum felt Apopka was a developing area and a good location for the museum. Brown has been a pilot for approximately 70 years.

"I have flown over Lake Apopka since 1939 or '40," he said. "I have flown as a pilot for Pan Am Airlines and as a crop-duster, and I have spent many hours in the air and I have never had bird problems. In all those years, I have only hit one bird, and that was not over Lake Apopka."

Brinkerhoff said he has been flying for 42 years, in both military and commercial planes, and he too had only hit one bird in all those years.

Haggard said the plan calls for a runway of approximately 6,000 feet and instrument approach system, both qualifiers for corporate jets. Plans are for a general aviation airport, similar to the Kissimmee facility.

Commercial lending bankers were present at the meeting to better understand the economic development impact the project could bring to Apopka.

"I thought the meeting went well," Haggard said. "It was nice to have everyone concerned at the table, so we can all discuss the issues and push the ball in the same direction. In the sixth chapter of the book of Micah, there is a string of questions concerning how one should "come before the Lord." That is, should one come before Him bowed down with burnt offerings, with year-old calves or rams, or with offerings of oil? Should one offer up one's firstborn? Micah's answer is a summary of the Law and the prophets, telling us that "He has showed you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" (Micah 6:8) We hear this message again and again in the prophets, i.e., that God doesn't want sacrifice but loving kindness and justice, but Micah's twist on this is unique. He tells us to walk humbly with our God. Why didn't he simply say to walk humbly with God? Micah recognizes that we all have different visions of God. We tend to think that our view of God is the true one, that somehow our view of God reflects His true nature. But, that is just another version of creating God in our own image. Just because God created us in His image does not mean that we are in possession of the truth about God. We may have some small sliver of truth about God, but we certainly don't have the entire truth. So, we should walk humbly with our God, and allow others to walk humbly with theirs.

The world's financial markets are all connected

What is the deal with Greece? You may have heard about a "crisis" going on in Greece, but it is something that has been building for years. The Greek debt crisis has recently been headline news because it has the potential to rock the world in the same way the 2008 collapse of Lehman Brothers caused financial turmoil in the United States and world economies at that time. The bankruptcy of U.S. investment bank Lehman Brothers was a defining moment in the financial crisis. Lehman's losses from the subprime mortgages saw it enter liquidation on September 15, 2008.

The secondary effects spread across the financial markets, in the U.S. and abroad. Investors lost confidence in the markets, and hedge funds and asset managers who used Lehman's prime brokerage arm were suddenly unable to trade. Investors who had bought so-called low-risk securities backed by big Wall Street investment banks suddenly found themselves exposed to a major corporate col-

lapse. The \$700 billion in bad debt on Lehman's balance sheet was a surprise to investors.

The Greek debt crisis has not been a surprise to anyone. The fact that Greece would eventually not be able to repay its huge debt has been known for more than 18 months, giving investors and policymakers time to make important fiscal decisions. This is not to say, however, that all that extra time has made it possible to resolve the debt crisis.

Even with increases in taxes, cuts in spending and European Union bailouts, there is not much of a light at the end of the tunnel for the Greeks. The recent riots in Greece show that the tax raises and spending cuts have taken their toll on the Greek people, but there will be more to come. Earlier this week, the heads of the European Union committed to give Greece its second bailout, provided the country keeps to its strict economic reforms and cutbacks. Times will be tough for the Greeks for quite some time.

Why should I be concerned about Greece's economy? As long as my favorite Greek din-

er keeps making those awesome Greek omelets, I should be fine, right? Wrong. The world financial markets are all very much connected. According to former chairman of the Federal Reserve, Alan Greenspan, default by Greece could "almost certainly" trigger another recession in the U.S. I take what Mr. Greenspan says with a grain of salt, but I do agree that what happens in Greece could set off a chain reaction. Other countries such as Spain, Portugal, and Ireland are in similar situations. Even with bailouts and government cutbacks, they may end up in the same state as Greece. U.S. banks alone have millions of dollars in Greek debt instruments, meaning they will be experiencing losses directly. This is directly reflected in our stock market, which seems to fluctuate wildly in reaction to any world event. In addition, as European economies deal with their financial turmoil, they will have less money to spend on American goods, further contributing to job losses.

In conclusion, we should recognize that Greek economic troubles do affect us in America.

The troubles that the Greek citizens are experiencing are unusual, and may never happen to us here. We will experience some shockwaves from the problems being experienced in Greece. Most importantly, I believe we should prepare ourselves for our government to take its own austerity measures. Our government debt is at a high level, interest rates have been as low as they can get for too long, and we have historically low tax rates and loopholes available. We need to personally take advantage of those things now.

Even though our elected politicians will always put the hard decisions off for the next guy to make, I believe eventually taxes will have to go up and spending will need to be cut. Nobody wants to be the guy to run on that platform, but the day will come when those measures will be unavoidable.

commercial properties, and second homes in Florida. If passed, first-time homebuyers would receive a tax exemption equal to 50 percent of the market value of their home, which would decline by at least 20 percent over the next five years.

The amendment also adjusts the cap a property appraiser can raise property values on commercial and non-homestead, or second homes.

Currently, an appraiser can raise the property values on these properties by 10 percent.

If passed, it would lower the cap to five percent.

The aim of the proposed amendment is to make Florida more attractive to first-time homebuyers, individuals looking for a second property and businesses interested in opening operations within the state.

It would also help deal with our excessive property supply which continues to hurt all our property values.

The legislature is committed to doing everything within its power to stabilize and, hopefully, increase the values of properties in Florida.

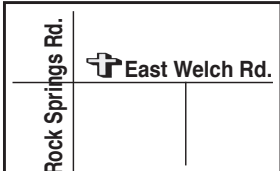

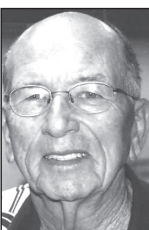

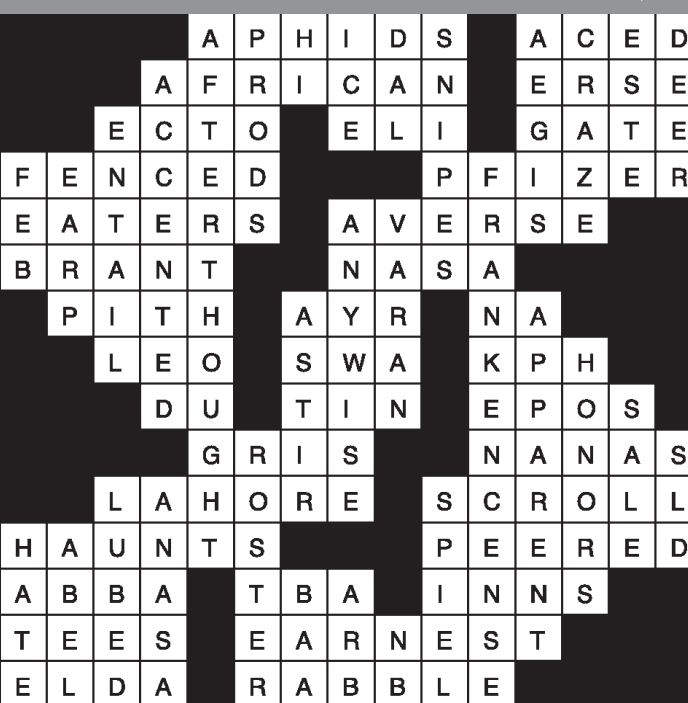

Eligibility for WIC program outlined

The Orange County Health Department's Women, Infants and Children Program (WIC) is a Special Supplemental Nutrition Program that provides eligible participants a combination of supplemental nutritious foods, nutrition education, breastfeeding information as well as referrals to health care and social services.

Eligible women and children participating in the WIC program receive food checks that specify which nutritious food items may be purchased. These WIC food checks can be redeemed at any of the 2,000-plus authorized grocery stores in Florida. In addition to of-

fering supplemental healthy foods, WIC provides the following additional services at no cost: nutrition education and counseling, breastfeeding support and referrals for health care.

To be eligible for WIC you must be a pregnant or breastfeeding woman, a woman who has recently been pregnant, an infant, or a child under age 5.

The applicant must also have a low or moderate income, live in Florida, and have a nutrition need that can be helped by WIC foods and nutrition counseling. Applicants can be income-eligible for WIC if they are currently receiv-

ing Medicaid, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families. Applicants do not have to be on a public assistance program to qualify for WIC.

WIC is a federally funded nutrition program for women, infants and children who are determined to be at nutritional risk. A review of each applicant's current health information (height, weight, and hemoglobin) along with past and/or present medical conditions that have a clear link with dietary choices are considered in determining each individual's nutritional risk.

WIC saves lives and improves the health of nutritionally at-risk women, infants and children by reducing fetal deaths and infant mortality, reducing low birth weight rates and increasing the duration of pregnancy.

The program also improves the growth of nutritionally at-risk infants and children, decreases the incidence of iron deficiency anemia in children and improves the dietary intake of pregnant and postpartum women.

Joined: The Zepp and Champneys houses remained connected until 1993

connected to the smaller and younger Zepp House. The two structures remained connected until 1993.

"The (Champneys) house was moved about 1916 to Apopka from Clarcona, a small community south of Apopka," states the Apopka Historical Society's **Northwest Orange County Register of Historic Places**.

Transported via roller logs, the Champneys house first was relocated in west Apopka, then was moved "next to the filling station on Main Street," the Register states.

"In 1912," according to information researched and documented by the Society's Historic Preservation Council chairman Angela Nicols for the Register, "it was the home of William T. and Chattye H. Champneys."

"Wallace and Louise Champneys (later) moved into the big house and used their home for their office. Louise's sister, Verna H. Finney, lived upstairs in the big house and taught second grade in the school across Main Street, now City Hall."

By the 1980s, however, the historic home's longevity till then and future survival had become highly endangered.

Wallace Champneys

passed away on October 26, 1983. Louise died on November 16, 1989.

"Their estate sold the property and was going to tear the two houses down to make room for the Walgreen's store.

"With that dark cloud of doom and destruction suddenly hanging low over the house's destiny, yet another move was the only way to save this historical heritage for future generations. A moving company convinced the estate that the old house could be moved to another location - again - and the higher cost of demolition and removal thus could be avoided.

"Robert and Deborah Gillis, and three other interested people put a deposit on the house. After the other three (bids) were eliminated, the Gillises got the house. In November 1993, the Gillises moved the original Champneys house from U.S. 441 to their property on Ustler Road. They received the Certificate of Occupancy and have been living there ever since."

The 15-years-younger Zepp House, constructed in Apopka circa 1910, was not included in the move.

That house's story, however, still is very significant to Apopka history. The small one-and-one-half story building that once was

connected to the east side of the two-story Champneys House originally was the residence of Francis Zepp, a builder who came to Apopka in 1884 and constructed many buildings in the community over the following decades, the Register states.

Historian-author Dr. Jerrell Shofner recorded in his 1982 **History of Apopka and Northwest Orange County** that F. E. (Francis) Zepp arrived in Apopka in 1884. Here he began a 40-year career as a construction contractor.

Zepp became one of Apopka's biggest builders, along with being one of the organizers of the Apopka Board of Trade in 1912.

"After the Apopka School was destroyed by the 1918 tornado, plans for a new building were completed within a month. F. E. Zepp was given the contract and the school was constructed in time for fall classes," Shofner wrote.

"In 1924, the area's growth and consolidation of several country schools a second school building was needed in Apopka and Zepp again was the builder."

Among Francis Zepp's many other construction projects was the expansion of the ice plant in Plymouth.

"Francis Zepp, a builder who moved to the community

in 1884, was responsible for the construction of many commercial and residential buildings over the next several decades," sums up the Register.

W. T. Champneys was a local merchant. He owned a dry goods general store in Apopka's late 19th and early 20th century's very early days' developing downtown business district.

He was also a prominent city official. His extensive public service included several terms on the City Council, and, in 1927, being named to the board of State Bank of Apopka.

Champneys was also an early local land developer who filed his plat for his Champneys' Portion of Apopka as early as November 1895.

Shofner relates in his local history book an intriguing story about William T. Champneys and the infamous tornado of 1918 that destroyed much of early Apopka's downtown

"In the early evening of January 11, 1918," Shofner wrote, "a vicious tornado swirled across Lake Apopka, mowed a wide swath though the pines in between and ripped into the center of town.

"W. T. Champneys was lying on a sofa in his living room when the storm struck. When it was over, he was still on the sofa, but it was out in the yard."

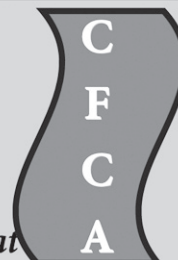

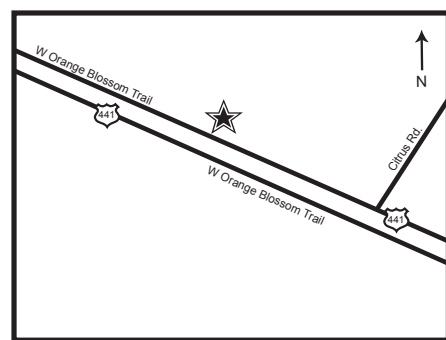

often paid as a contractor for the water district, but has such a passion for the birds, he often works gratis as well.

"This area is not touched a lot," Robinson said. "There are so many birds out here that it varies all the time. This week, we had the highest count ever of white ibis - a total of 11,210 - the most in any one location."

Two trails are open to the public that enable bird-watching, the North Shore Trail and the Clay Island Trail. The latter has an observation tower near which a bald eagle was sighted earlier in the year. Bicycles, hiking, and horseback riding are currently permitted on the trails.

The Apopka Loop Connector Trail, scheduled to open early in 2012, will begin at Magnolia Park and lead to district trails.

More bird species have been noted at Lake Apopka than any other inland site in the U.S. As a result, birders currently visit Lake Apopka from all over the world, said Hank Largin, a spokesman for the water district.

Other wildlife species include numerous turtles, frog species, snakes, otters, alligators, green herons, native rats, foxes, bobcats, coyotes, panthers, deer, wild turkeys, and black bears.

The district is working to restore the wetlands through a variety of means, Peterson said. One means is through the planting of native wetland trees such as cypress, ash, and Tupelo. "Although we are currently managing the land to restore the wetlands, it has become such a bird habitat that we can see the land being managed in the future for the bird population," he said.

'Gray' matters

Teams look for competitive edge in fuzzy parts of rule book

It's long been a fact that for NASCAR teams to improve the performance of their cars and gain an edge on the competition, they have to work in the "gray area" of the rule book. That is, they have to come up with something that isn't specifically prohibited and hope it will be ruled illegal by series inspectors.

But the "gray area" for fans and people outside NASCAR is whether those enterprising mechanics are innovators or cheaters.

The issue arose again last week at Michigan International Speedway, where all three Sprint Cup cars from Joe Gibbs Racing were found to be equipped with engine oil pans that had not been previously approved by NASCAR. Many in the garage said the pans, which were changed before the race, were significantly heavier than a normal oil pan. A heavy oil pan would allow a team to have weight in an advantageous place on the car, as Ford driver Carl Edwards pointed out in his weekly meeting with the press.

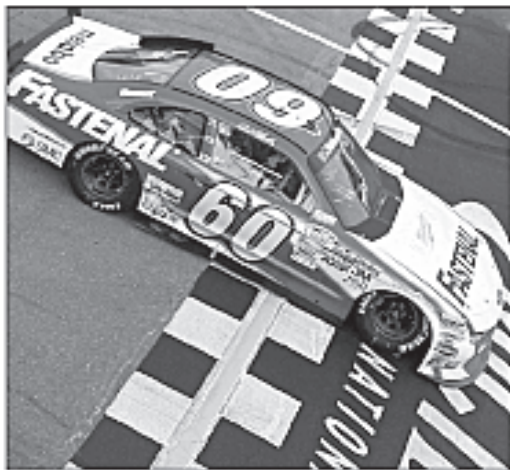
"I am certain that they were trying to achieve some balance with the car," he said.

Edwards, who has seen his own team have a run-in with NASCAR officials over technical issues, said it's tough for a driver, the most visible member of the team, to defend the work of his crew in a situation that looks like cheating.

"It is hard to explain," Edwards said, adding that he got an eye-opener on the subject when he was chosen for the President's Council for Fitness, Sports and Nutrition.

"There is a big vetting process that goes with that. I had to be on a 30-minute phone call about every bad thing I have done in my life.

"They really wanted to talk about these times that our team had been caught cheating. They were like, 'Why were you fined these points and this money? You guys were cheating.'"

Edwards said he answered by saying that auto racing is different from other sports, at least as far as "cheating" is concerned.

"I am like, No, you don't understand, this is auto racing. The guys at the shop build the most trick thing they can and bring it to the race track. I hop in and drive it, and if you run well or some part falls off or the heights aren't right, then it looks like we were cheating, but that is just part of the sport," he said. "It is hard to explain that to some people. They think that if it didn't fit the rules, then I was cheating."

Edwards also said that if a team isn't being creative, the driver won't be winning many races.

"You want your guys at the shop pushing every edge of the rule book," he said. "That is what you want."

And he said that it doesn't hurt, from a competitive standpoint, for the Gibbs teams to be under some extra scrutiny from NASCAR officials. (Gibbs also had a problem at Pocono where Kyle Busch's car was found to be too low in a post-race inspection.)

"It is good for us because NASCAR will be watching those [Gibbs] guys harder and paying attention to their cars a little more," Edwards said. "That is good for the rest of us."

Denny Hamlin, who drives the No. 11 Toyota at Gibbs, went on to win at Michigan, breaking a 16-race winless skid by capitalizing on a quick pit stop that put him in position to lead the final eight laps. In his pre- and post-race interview sessions, he found himself in the awkward spot of answering questions about his team's issues with the rules.

"For me, I don't know a whole lot about it, to be honest with you," he said during his regular pre-race press conference. "We continue to evolve our cars and things like that through the course of a season. It's just, all teams do. And usually when you have something new — a new part — sometimes you submit it and sometimes you don't and I feel like this is probably one of the parts NASCAR wants you to submit."

Hamlin's crew chief Mike Ford said the team's victory on Sunday, after the controversy related to the oil pans, says a lot about the team.

"I think it speaks volumes to the experience and the resilience of this 11 car that you can start the week off with a down note and put that behind you, and make sure that it doesn't affect what's getting ready to happen," he said. "We turned a negative for us to a positive, and we'll see where it goes from there."

"This team usually comes out swinging when its back is against the ropes. Sometimes we connect and sometimes we get dotted in the eye."

Martin, Earnhardt have words

Dale Earnhardt Jr. had some unusually harsh words for his Hendrick Motorsports teammate Mark Martin after the two bumped late in Sunday's race at Michigan.

"I perceived that he didn't know I was on his outside," Earnhardt said. "He came up there. He knew I was up there, but he was just running hard."

"If the tables were turned, I would have been smarter and given plenty of room ..."

"He is older than me, been racing forever and knows a lot more than I'll ever get — or he has forgot more stuff than I'll ever know. Still, I take better care of people than that."

Martin's response: "I don't have a history of having problems. I don't think I have one now. I think we will get it sorted out. I feel like I give everybody on the race track respect. I made a mistake."

Edwards hopes for car changes

Carl Edwards, who finished fifth in Sunday's Sprint Cup series Heluva Good 400 at Michigan, said he hopes NASCAR will make changes to the 2013 cars to make passing easier than it is with the current car.

"Sadly, downforce is such a big factor in these cars, and I am really hoping that NASCAR will take the opportunity in 2013 to take downforce away so the fans can see the guys race race cars and not race downforce," he said, explaining that with the way the air affects cars, the leader of a pack has a great advantage over those behind him.

"Let's say all of the cars are a tenth [of a second per lap] apart, and you are behind two or three cars, your car is two-tenths of a second slow," he said. "You can't make it up."

"Denny [Hamlin] earned this win and those are the rules we are under. Track position was huge, and I just wish it wasn't like that."

Michigan track to be repaved

In an effort to prevent the possibility of potholes developing in the track and causing embarrassing delays such as the ones during the Daytona 500 last year, Michigan International Speedway officials are repaving that two-mile track.

The work will begin this week, with the repaving of pit road. The track itself will be tackled after the Aug. 19 Cup race.

The track, built in 1968, has been repaved three times already, in 1977, 1986 and 1995.

During the upcoming project, workers will remove the top two inches of asphalt and replace it with two layers, each about 1.5 inches.

The first will be a leveling course and the second a final wearing course.

Not resting on laurels, Gordon preps for Infineon road race

Even after scoring 84 victories on the Sprint Cup circuit, Jeff Gordon is still willing to go the extra miles to try to make his race cars faster. He recently traveled to the Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course near Lexington to work on his team's preparation for this week's race at Infineon Raceway in Sonoma, Calif.

The Mid-Ohio track has two primary configurations: a 2.4-mile, 15-turn, and a 2.25-mile, 13-turn circuit.

Gordon tested alongside road racing specialist Boris Said, who will be driving the No. 51 Chevrolet, which is built by the same Hendrick Motorsports people that prepare Gordon's car.

"I thought we had a good test," he said. "I thought Mid-Ohio was a departure from what we normally do to try to learn something and make some gains."

"I feel like we made some gains and I hope it shows up out on the track out in Sonoma."

Gordon acknowledged that his team hasn't been as good as it should have been in recent road races, especially at Sonoma, where he leads all drivers in wins with five, top-five finishes with 11 and top-10s with 15, but hasn't won since 2006.

"We have not been competitive enough to win there," he said. "Probably better there than at Watkins Glen, but even at Sonoma the last couple of times felt like we haven't been good enough."

He said testing at Mid-Ohio made sense to him, especially compared to the other road courses that teams use now that testing is banned on tracks where the NASCAR circuits actually race.

"None of [the road courses] are anywhere close to the tracks that we go to," he said. "VIR (Virginia International Raceway) — it's a nice track and there are some hard braking sections, so if you want to go test out your transmission and get used to doing some

shifting and down shifting and check out your brakes, great, go to VIR.

"If you want to try to get handling characteristics for Watkins Glen or Sonoma, forget it. We got to Road Atlanta because it's a faster road course, which is more like Watkins Glen, which is a fast road course. Again, handling characteristics I think are really minimal."

Gordon said that Sonoma is a low-grip road course with a lot of elevation changes, and he feels that Mid-Ohio offers some of the same challenges.

"It's not Sonoma, but I kind of like some of the transitions in the corners and some of the elevation changes that I thought could help us for Sonoma," he said. "We'll find out."

Herrera reflects on win-win decision he must make

It was no surprise that the University of Miami Hurricanes wanted Wekiva's Jace Herrera to play for them as he is tall and lean, and he looks the part of the ace of a pitching staff. But after spending the four years of his high-school career proving he is as good as advertised and to put himself in a good position with his commitment to Miami, he finds himself in an even better position as June comes to an end.

It is the best possible kind of position for a recently graduated high school player, as major league baseball's Boston Red Sox concurred with the local assessment and drafted him. He is the first Mustang to be drafted by a major league baseball team.

"Of course, it's a great position to be in," Herrera said. "It's what every player strives for because it's a win-win situation. But for me, it is special because, I can finally say it has happened. It is something I really didn't think a lot about it as a child because it just seemed so far down the road even if I was good enough to be drafted. Now, I have accomplished both (college signing and pro draft). I felt a big sense of success accomplishing one, but successfully accomplishing both is a huge deal because it is unique.

"Not a lot of players are in this position and even more so in the position of choosing be-

tween two premiere programs at either level of baseball. I am very aware of just how special it is to be where I am."

Herrera signed with the University of Miami in November. While he was offered scholarships and there was heavy interest from other schools, Miami, as a part of the very select group of elite programs, was by far the best option. The Hurricanes have won four national championships and earned berths in the NCAA College World Series 23 times

while advancing to the postseason every year since 1973. Miami has also compiled a 1,964-716 overall record, a winning percentage of .733 since 1968.

Of course, the Boston Red Sox are not only one of major league baseball's most identifiable teams, but the franchise is among that group for all of professional sports, as it is steeped in tradition and has been a part of some of baseball's most iconoclastic moments. However, in the past decade or so, Boston has raised itself from

one of major league baseballs better franchises to an elite championship team as it has won two World Series championships and earned playoff berths in seven of the past eight years.

As of Tuesday, June 21, the Red Sox were in first place in the American League East division with a 44-28 record, 1.5 games ahead of the New York Yankees.

Herrera was taken by Boston during the 36th round of the major league baseball draft. He was also named the Florida Athletic Coaches Association's district Player of the Year.

"Herrera is good enough to play for Miami because he throws three pitches for strikes," recently resigned Wekiva coach Eric Entrekin said after Herrera signed with Miami. "That is unusual for a high school pitcher. He also throws them in the upper 80s. He throws strikes consistently because his two off-speed pitches, when combined with the other one, make for an effective combination. He will probably be a middle reliever and make an occasional start with the intention of him growing into a full-time starter.

"When we (the coaching staff) took over the program, Herrera couldn't bench 100 pounds. Now, he benches 225 pounds. He trusted us and our plan, but he was the one who did the work and put the time in. He was the one who made the commitment to the plan and

believed in it. He was the one who lifted the weights. He was the one who did the running. He was the one who played travel ball."

Herrera expects to meet with Red Sox officials within two to three weeks. He will make his decision after the meeting.

His decision will be based on the contract offered to him, both financially and its length, as well as if he is ready to give up his desire to earn a college degree at least for now.

If he chooses to go into the Red Sox farm system, he will not be able to pursue a college degree, as in his words "he will have to eat, sleep and, in general, live baseball," leaving no time for academic study.

"If I go to Miami, I am going there to play baseball, but also to get a degree, and academics is the other primary reason players go to Miami," Herrera said. "But, again, either way, it is a great honor. Miami has been a collegiate power since the '70s and they put ballplayers in the major leagues. Boston is one of the few teams ballplayers hope to get drafted by, because they are

a major league baseball tradition.

"Having the opportunity to add to the organization's tradition is an honor. It is one of the historic teams of the sport and it has a great fan base. I am where I am because I have a will and want to train hard. I was willing to put in the work and time. My work ethic is my greatest asset and that is what has been the most important reason I am facing the decision of going to Miami or playing in the Red Sox system.

Herrera, who graduated from Wekiva High earlier this month with honors, compiled a 6-2 record and 1.74 earned run average during his final season at Wekiva. He pitched a total of 68 innings and gave up 17 earned runs. He struck out 84 batters while giving up only 15 walks.

"I think the Red Sox picked me because I am almost 6 feet, four inches tall and can throw upwards of 91 mph," Herrera said. "There is a lot of potential for me to continue to get better at understanding how to use my physical attributes as an advantage and how to use them to improve my skill set."

Mustangs: 12 seniors graduated from the 20-7 Wekiva baseball team

gassner, who had 619 victories as of 2010. Anderson led the team to its best season ever. Freedom put together a 25-5 season while claiming its first district and Metro Conference championship.

Most importantly, they also won the Class 6A-District 4 tournament championship to qualify for the regional play-offs. They advanced to the regional semifinals before losing to Timber Creek, which went on to the state semifinals.

The new Wekiva coach takes over a program which went 20-7 last season, its most

successful. But the Mustangs lost 12 players to graduation. On the other hand, the feeder programs were greatly improved during the last three years and most of those players were already considered talented and ready to step into varsity competition.

Anderson also decided to join the Wekiva staff because he will be a physical education teacher. After teaching history, he is looking forward to the change. He is certified in both teaching disciplines.

"We feel in the end we got the man we wanted," athletic director Lamarr Glenn said. "We like his high energy and,

most importantly, we feel he is a teacher of baseball. With the 12 seniors graduating, that is what the program needs. That is an element which the program and the players need. That is one of the qualities which coach Entekin has. The two coaches have several qualities in common and approach the game the same way.

"We felt like we weren't making a drastic change in how the program will be managed with hiring Anderson. He is straight forward, upfront, honest and a goal-setter. That makes him a good communicator and will work well with the Wekiva community. As far as

his abilities to coach baseball, he is well organized, has a good practice plan and is aggressive, especially on offense. Those characteristics are what 15- and 16-year-olds need to become better ballplayers. They need somebody who will lead and set expectations for them."

Glenn finished by saying Anderson's willingness to get his hands dirty, doing maintenance on the field, was the other deciding factor and all of those factors, as a whole, are the keys to winning.

Applications were accepted immediately after Entekin resigned two weeks ago. The field was reduced to three last

week. Anderson was then selected.

"The fundamentals are always the most important aspect of baseball and the starting point where a coach is," Anderson said. "That is where we will start. We will focus on pitching and defense and be aggressive on offense. That is my nature to try to put pressure on the defense, not react to it. But it is going to be even more so at Wekiva because of the district it plays in. With the district being so competitive, in order to win it, teams have to play good defense and put pressure on the opponent's defense.

"But it is also where good

coaches start from, because in order to know what they have to work with, they need to know the players can execute the fundamentals first. Specifically, a coach can't move on as far as being able to develop a style according to his players' strengths unless they can throw strikes and get hitters out first. As far as joining Wekiva's staff, I am impressed by the vision of Dr. Gruber and Glenn. They are focused on developing young people who will contribute to society. The coaches believe in developing strong student-athletes and that is as important as putting a competitive team on the field."

Entrekin remembers his time at Wekiva High fondly

When Eric Entrekin took over the Wekiva High baseball program after its first year of existence, he was hired because he had proven himself as a head coach.

With his hiring, the program quickly began to develop an optimism of decisively moving in the right direction as Entrekin nurtured, yet exerted and pushed the athletes into becoming better baseball players. Unfortunately for the Wekiva faithful, that success and ability was to its detriment as the head coach accepted the same position at Lake Brantley last month.

Longtime Lake Brantley head coach Mike Smith was relieved of his duties in early May. As Smith's right-hand man for a significant portion of his time there, Entrekin was the natural choice to follow his mentor.

"I have been very happy and enjoy working at Wekiva, but the one coaching position I would leave Wekiva for opened up," Entrekin said. "The Lake Brantley coaching position is the only one I would even consider leaving Wekiva for because it is where I started my teaching and coaching career. When I was starting out, coach (Mike) Smith gave me my opportunity to learn how to manage as a third base coach. It is always good to go back home and I have the opportunity to further build on the success of coach Smith.

"However, it is not easy to

leave Wekiva. It has been difficult for me to leave the players, the athletic director (Lamarr Glenn), the parents, and the community, in general. It has been a great three years and experience which is not easy to leave behind."

The head coach began his coaching career while a student at the University of Central Florida in the early 1990s. While playing baseball for the university, he also served as a coach in the Valley and Cape Cod summer leagues from 1991-1994. After graduating from UCF in 1994, the then coach of the University of Central Florida, Jay Bergman, hired him as a student assistant.

Entrekin then served as an assistant coach at Lake Brantley High School for 11 years. The stint included the 1997

Class 6A state title as the Patriots defeated Apopka in the finals. He was hired by Ocoee High as its first baseball coach, when the school reopened in the fall of 2005. It was also Entrekin's first head coaching position. In only three years, he guided the program to its winning record during 2008. He then came to Wekiva during the summer of 2008 and 2009 was the first season with him at the helm of baseball program.

After a 6-21 record during Entrekin's first year as a Mustang, the program enjoyed its first winning season (15-11) during 2010. Wekiva won nine of its last 11 to finish the regular season. However, the Mustangs were whipped in the Class 6A-District 5 tournament's first round by the then three-time defending champion

West Orange.

Learning from that disappointment, the team came back in 2011 with unfinished business on its mind and it was clearly felt from the start to end of the season. The result was the program's first 20-win season at 20-7 and Wekiva become a legitimate contender, as well as relevant among the state's landscape for the sport. His personal reward was being named the Florida Athletic Coaches Association's district coach of the year.

Unfortunately after defeating Apopka in the opening round of the district tournament, there was one factor the team just couldn't prepare for, nor find an answer for, top-seeded Dr. Phillips (18-9). For the Mustangs, the season of so much promise ended one game short of the postseason regional tournament with a 1-0 loss to Dr. Phillips.

Reflecting on his time at Wekiva and after winning the 2011 FACA district coach of the year award, Entrekin is animate in his appreciation of the players' hard work. As he moves on, he talked about that work being the key to his success as Wekiva's coach and the bright future the program he is leaving has.

"The players showed what hard work will do, first hand," Entrekin said. "They didn't just show up and win games. There was a lot of behind-the-scenes work. I told them (the players) when we (the coaches) came to Wekiva, it won't be easy. If winning was easy, everyone and every team would be able

to do it. They lifted weights during the summer and winter. They hit the ball during the summer and off-seasons. They fielded balls during the summer and winter.

"Again, they put in the time and had the commitment, as well as dedication it takes to get better. Because of that, we can now say we won 20 games. Not a lot of teams win 20 games per year. We also have a good eighth-grade program. It won the fall championship of the league it played in. All of these play into being as successful as we were last season and the program having continued success."

He continued to say 12 of the players played for him all three of the years he was Wekiva's head coach and four of them were four-year starters. "They set a standard. The coach of the year award is because of them. It is an honor to them and setting that standard," Entrekin said.

"The Mustangs will continue to be a good team and program," Entrekin said. "It is not going to fall apart because I am leaving. There is a lot of talent coming in and they have an example of what it takes to be good to follow."

Eddie Doyle, Ocoee's former head coach, coached with Entrekin at Lake Brantley, and will join him as the top assistant at Lake Brantley. When Entrekin coached at Ocoee, Doyle was one of his assistant coaches. When Entrekin accepted the head coaching position at Wekiva, Doyle was promoted to the same job at

Ocoee. With Entrekin accepting the head coaching position at Lake Brantley, Doyle will once again join him. The other coaches have yet to announce.

"It (Lake Brantley) is one of the top five coaching jobs in the state of Florida, maybe even the country," Entrekin said. "It has tremendous resources, including its feeder system. That was the other reason besides me returning to where I started I took the position. We (the coaches) have big shoes to fill taking over for Smith and our goal is to build on the tradition he set. We will make some changes, but keep a lot the same. In particular, I want to get the alumni more involved with what is currently going on.

"But, again, it is not easy leaving Wekiva. I am proud to say we did what we did, turning the program into a very good one. I am grateful to Dr. (Elise) Gruber (principal) and Lamarr Glenn (athletic director) for giving us that opportunity and my hope is they feel we not only left the program better than we found it, but it is now among the top ones. I built some great life-long friendships working at Wekiva and that is never easy to say goodbye to. I will miss those friendships and working with them every day."

Entrekin also said those friendships were among the whole athletic department, not just the baseball coaches and wishes all of the sports' programs the best of luck, as well as he hopes to see them win championships in the near future.

While the rain we've had is good, we certainly need more

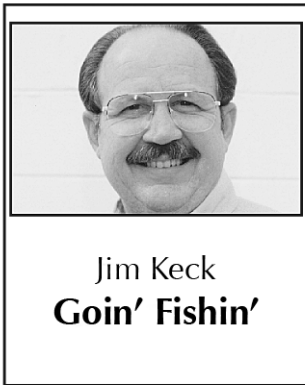
Hello Folks,

with two Apopka entries will have an Apopka American and Apopka National team.

Last year, the Apopka 11-12 National team won its pool and advanced to the Florida District 23 championship game, where it lost to Oviedo.

It was the only Apopka Little League entry to advance out of pool play.

This year's managers are Ron Anderson (9-10 American), Greg Hemming (9-10 National), Matt Johnson (11-12 American), George Feltner (11-12 National), and Chris Thompson (13-14).

The 13-14 team (called the juniors during the regular season and Tournament of Champions) won the Tournament of Champions title for its age group two weeks ago.

All of the players from that team are members of the all-star entry with several additions. The team compiled a 20-1 overall record. It won

the only game it played during the Tournament of Champions pool play by a 16-6 score. The squad then won its second game by forfeit to earn a berth in the championship game.

In the championship game, the Red Sox made short work of the Maitland Cubs as they relied on the tried-and-tested formula of taking a quick lead and then relying on pitching and defense to close out the game en route to a 5-1 win. Four runs were scored during the first inning, as the first five batters reached base. Then, Hunter Rotarius put on a pitching clinic. He pitched a complete game, giving up three hits and didn't issue a walk while striking out six batters. Through the first six frames, he faced only 19 batters and only one runner reached second.

"With the 13-to-14 year olds being the same team with some additions, they are the obvious favorites for that age group," Odom said. "They are deep and strong on the mound.

That is as good a place for a champion to start as any. But they will have to be ready to play again."

Taking the 13-14 team's lead, the 9-10 year old American team also has a strong and deep pitching staff.

Most of the members of that team play travel ball and that should come in handy at the tournament.

While not quite as deep, the 9-10 National team also has a pitching staff capable of winning the pool, which makes it the dark horse for that age group.

"This is a great opportunity to see good baseball," Odom said. "These players are very good and deserve the support of the community. It would be great to see it at our home facility."

The games between the younger age groups will start at 6 p.m. First pitch for the other games is scheduled for 8 p.m. Those games match the teams in the older age groups.

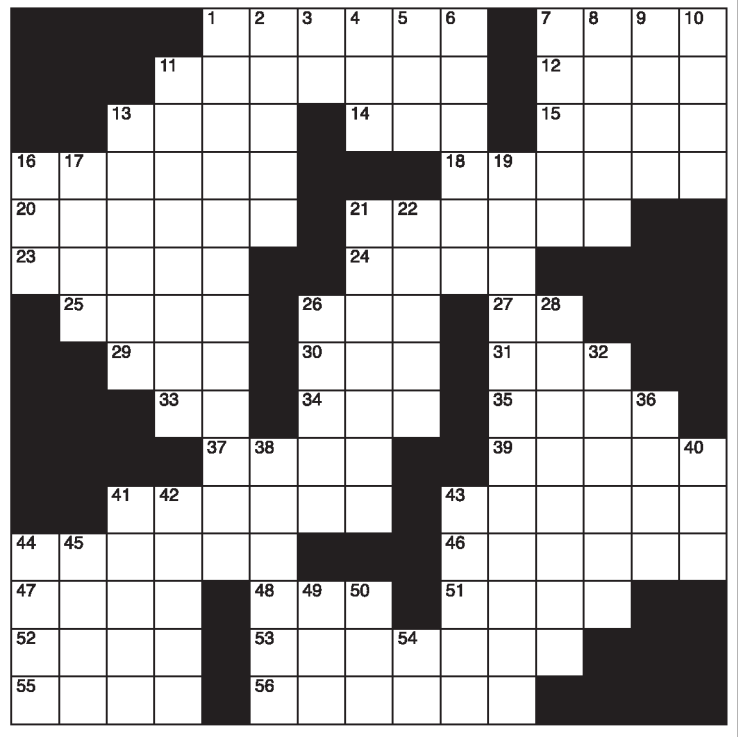

This tasty collection of some of this community's best home cooking was compiled by the Presbyterian Women's group of the First Presbyterian Church in Apopka in 1990.

Enjoy cooking and eating these delicious dishes, especially the pies.

BETTY LAND'S GREEN TOMATO PIE

- 4 medium sized green tomatoes, unpeeled, diced
- 1 tablespoon vinegar
- 1 tablespoon plain flour
- 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 cup brown sugar
- Grated rind of 1 lemon
- 1 tablespoon butter
- Pastry for 2-crust pie

Mix flour, cinnamon and brown sugar. Stir into diced green tomatoes, along with vinegar, lemon rind and diced butter. Spoon mixture into unbaked 9-inch pastry shell. Make slit in top pastry and roll pastry onto pie filling. Seal edges. Brush lightly with cream and sprinkle with sugar. Bake at 450 degrees for 10 minutes. Reduce heat to 350 degrees and bake for 30 to 40 minutes longer. Lay foil under dish while baking. (Pie sometimes will run over.)

JOY STOKES' CORN PIE WITH MEAT CRUST

- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 1/2 cup milk
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper

- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tablespoon chopped onion
- 1 cup soft bread crumbs
- 3/4 pound ground beef or turkey
- 1 (10 ounce) box frozen corn
- 1 cup tomato sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon basil
- 1 tablespoon butter or margarine
- Green pepper rings, parboiled (optional)

Combine egg, milk, seasoning, onion and crumbs. Let stand for five minutes. Add meat and mix well. Pack mixture firmly onto bottom and sides of a 9-inch pie plate. Press another pie plate firmly on top to hold mixture in place. Bake at 350 degrees for seven minutes. Remove top plate and bake for 3 minutes longer.

Combine thawed corn, tomato sauce and seasonings. Turn onto hot meat shell in pie plate. Dot with butter. Arrange parboiled green pepper rings on top. Return pie to oven and continue baking for 20 to 25 minutes. Serve from pie plate.

JANET USTLER'S CAVATINI

- 1-1/2 pounds hamburger or ground chuck
- 1 bell pepper or amount to your taste
- 2 medium onions or amount to your taste
- 1 (3.5 ounce) jar sliced mushrooms
- Salt and pepper (amounts to your taste)
- Garlic powder (amount to your taste)
- 3-1/2 ounces sliced pepperoni, heated
- 1 cup twisted macaroni
- 1 cup seashell macaroni
- 1 cup rigatoni noodles
- 2 cups Mozzarella cheese
- 1 cup Cheddar cheese
- 1 or 2 (14-ounce) jars pizza quick sauce

Brown the meat, onion and green pepper. Season to your taste with salt, pepper and garlic powder. Add mushrooms, then the heated pepperoni to this mixture. Cook

macaroni and noodles according to package directions. Place a layer of the noodles in baking dish. Add small amount of pizza sauce over noodles. Cover with grated cheese and the meat mixture. Alternate this layering until all ingredients are used up. Bake at 350 degrees long enough to melt the cheese.

PATRICK CONNELLY'S HUSH PUPPIES

- 2 cups cornmeal
- 1 tablespoon flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 egg, beaten
- 2 cups milk
- 6 tablespoons chopped onion

Mix all ingredients and beat until smooth. Drop by teaspoons into deep hot grease. Cook until golden brown. Drain and serve hot.

CHERYL S. BECKERT'S STUFFED BAKED POTATOES

- 4 medium potatoes, washed
- 1 stick margarine or butter
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1/2 cup shredded cheese
- 1 package onion-bacon dip
- 2 tablespoons chopped onion

Oil the potatoes, sprinkle Lawry's seasoned salt on potatoes and wrap potatoes in foil. Bake for 1 hour at 350 degrees. Scoop out potato pulp into mixing bowl and add butter, sour cream, cheese, dip and onion. Beat until mixture is smooth. Spoon mixture into potato shells. Bake in 300-degree oven for 20 minutes.

THE COOKBOOK COMMITTEE'S GERMAN CHOCOLATE PIE

- 1 pound Hershey chocolate bar
- 1/2 stick butter
- Handful of coconut

- Handful of chopped pecans
- 1 large tub whipped topping
- Graham cracker pie crust

Melt butter and chocolate. Let mixture cool. Stir the cooled melted chocolate into whipped topping. Add coconut and pecans. Freeze mixture in graham cracker pie crust. Optional: Pie may be garnished with chocolate sprinkles or some chocolate saved from the bar and shaved onto top of the pie.

HAROLD ETTY'S PEANUT BUTTER PIE

- 1 (8-ounce) package cream cheese
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup creamy peanut butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup whipping cream
- 1 to 2 tablespoons chopped salted peanuts
- 1 (9-inch) commercial graham cracker crust

Combine cream cheese and sugar. Beat at medium speed until smooth. Add peanut butter and vanilla. Beat well and set aside. Beat whipping cream until soft peaks form. Fold into peanut butter mixture, and then spoon mixture into crust. Sprinkle top of pie with peanuts. Chill for at least three hours.

KIT NELSON'S PECAN PIE

- 1 stick butter or margarine
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup dark Karo syrup
- 3 eggs, well beaten
- 3/4 to 1 cup chopped pecans
- 1 teaspoon vanilla (optional)
- 1 (9-inch) pie shell

Mix together and heat in saucepan the butter or margarine, sugar and Karo syrup. Add vanilla and beaten eggs and mix well. Place chopped pecans in pie shell. Cover pecans with this syrup mixture. Bake pie at 350 degrees for 35 to 45 minutes or until filling is set.

that Schall has to do with the Apopka High baseball program will be as a competitor, as of this week, he was named the baseball coach at Ocoee High School.

Neither Schall nor the powers that be at Apopka High wanted the change, but a lack of a physical education teaching position at AHS set the stage for the coach's departure.

"It just didn't work out," Schall said. "The teaching position is what it came down to."

Ironically, Schall was hired in June 2010 when Bill Floyd was principal at Apopka High. Now, Floyd is the head man at Ocoee High after having been transferred there a month after hiring Schall, who will be teaching physical education at Ocoee.

Schall taught science at Apopka High, but that position was not available for the upcoming school year. Doug Guthrie, principal at Apopka, said Schall was given the choice of staying as the baseball coach, but without the

teaching position.

"As far as the coaching goes, we wanted him back as baseball coach. I just did not have a teaching position," Guthrie said. "We were very pleased with what Chuck was doing (as baseball coach)."

If Schall had accepted the offer to just coach the baseball team, he would have had to find another full-time job elsewhere and work around that situation to be at the team's games and practices. "I don't blame him at all (for taking the Ocoee job)," Guthrie said. "He's got to feed

his family."

"We appreciate the hard work that he put in," Wambles, the Apopka athletic director, said. "He did a great job as coach. We wish him the best at Ocoee, except when they play us."

Wambles said he immediately began accepting applications for the Apopka job. "We'll have a good coach, too. We've already had quite a bit of interest. We'll be interviewing (applicants) very soon but don't have a definitive time line (on making a final decision)."

Part of the issue is matching available teaching positions with the new coach. "Hiring someone who is a quality teacher is important," Wambles said.

For Schall, the departure from Apopka was difficult. "It was really hard. There are a lot of really good people in Apopka."

But, he's looking to the future as coach of the Knights.

"I've got to close that door and get myself energized for Ocoee."

Lock-Ups are one of MDA's signature fundraising programs, benefiting local individuals living with muscular dystrophy, ALS and related progressive muscle diseases in the Apopka and Altamonte areas.

The event also will help send Central Florida youngsters to a special week at MDA summer camp at Camp Suwannee in Dowling Park, west of Lake City and Live Oak. Youngsters with muscle diseases, as well as the

many volunteers who help create magic at MDA summer camp each year, enjoy a wide variety of activities designed specifically for youngsters with limited mobility. Some activities include horseback riding, swimming, football, and arts and crafts.

MDA is the nonprofit health agency dedicated to curing muscular dystrophy, ALS and related diseases by funding worldwide research. The association also provides health care services; advocates for the families it serves; and invests significant resources educating the medical and scientific communities, as well as the

general public, about neuromuscular diseases affecting more than 1 million Americans.

MDA maintains a nationwide network of some 200 hospital-affiliated clinics - 38 of which are designed as MDA/ALS centers - that provide medical and health care services to adults and children with neuromuscular diseases. Families in Central Florida can visit the MDA Clinic at Orlando Regional Lucerne Hospital.

Apopka professor works to clear up fungus on grapes

Dennis Gray may not be able to control Florida's humidity, but he wants to help popular grape varieties shrug off fungal diseases that thrive in muggy weather, and open up new markets for the state's growers and winemakers.

Gray, a professor with the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences in Apopka, is the first researcher to boost fungal-disease resistance in grapes by giving them an extra helping of protective genes that occur naturally in grapes.

The process, known as cisgenic engineering or precision breeding, could be a major asset to Florida's \$20 million-a-year grape industry, he said. Nationwide, the Sunshine State is traditionally the second- or third-largest market for table grapes and wine. The study appears in the online version of the journal *In Vitro Cellular and Developmental Biology (Plant)*.

"In creating these kinds of new versions of existing varieties, we think we can energize the Florida viticulture industry," said Gray, at UF's Mid-Florida Research and Education Center in Apopka.

Many popular grape varieties are susceptible to disease in Florida, especially the bacterial malady called Pierce's disease, because the state's weather is hot and humid during much of the growing season, Gray said. Consequently, growers

have mostly been limited to producing muscadine grapes, a large, thick-skinned variety developed from native grapes.

In the current study, Gray found that he could dramatically enhance the disease resistance of Thompson Seedless grapes by inserting a gene from the Chardonnay grape.

When grown under greenhouse conditions, the cisgenic Thompsons fended off powdery mildew disease seven to 10 days longer than unmodified counterparts.

In the field, the grapes showed a 42 percent reduction in sour-bunch rot disease, compared with control grapes, and the incidence of black rot was reduced by about half.

Gray is using the technology in hopes of creating cisgenic Thompson grape varieties and hopes to produce similarly disease-resistant varieties of Chenin Blanc, a traditional wine grape he believes could also work well in Florida.

Creating more disease-resistant grapevines isn't just good for Florida, it may enable UF to license patented varieties to growers in other parts of the world, Gray said.

Many grape-growing regions of the world have fungal-disease issues, and growers spray fungicides more than a dozen times in a season, he said.

"If this resistance can break the spray cycle, we could not only save a lot of money, but there would be a lot less pollution for the environment," Gray said.

Sea turtles deserve special attention

Some of the most routine habits we engage in on a daily basis can occasionally have some serious, unintended consequences for wildlife, and that is especially so for imperiled species.

Beachcombers out for a relaxing walk with the family dog may not recognize the signs that their presence has become a threat to nesting shorebirds and that they should detour around the area. Homeowners who leave a dirty grill in the backyard overnight, or unsecured trash or foodstuffs where wildlife can access it, can inadvertently create the catalyst for nuisance wildlife behaviors – with solutions that are palatable to no one.

Young sea turtle hatchlings, trying to make their escape from the dangers of their sandy birthplace to the relative safety of the water's edge, may be the poster children for wildlife that suffer from the unintended side-effects of human habitation and habit.

Under the best conditions, young sea turtles still experience high death rates, and only a very small percentage survive to adulthood. Even before these hatchlings make it to the relative safety of deeper water, predation by gulls and threats lurking in the nearby surf are heavy.

Furthermore, if these hatchlings don't head toward the water to begin with, there's virtually no chance even a small percentage will survive to return to the same beaches where their ancestors were born, to lay the eggs that are the foundation for generations to come.

It usually happens after dark on beach-

es throughout Florida on both the Atlantic and Gulf coasts. Sea turtles begin nesting in March on the central-east Florida coast, with peak nesting from May through August. Nests incubate in the beach sand from 45 to 60 days during peak nesting season, and hatching season extends through October 31.

As baby sea turtles start to hatch, a depression in the sand forms over the nest. The young turtles work their way to the surface and almost immediately head for the brightest horizon. Instinct tells these baby turtles that the sea reflects the greatest amount of light, and their only chance for survival lies in that direction – away from the darker shadows of the dunes that line the back of an undeveloped beach. Even when clouds obscure the stars and moon, the sea surface provides sufficient reflected light to lure the hatchlings – unless artificial light from beachfront homes and businesses interferes with Mother Nature's grand plan.

The bright light at the front door of people's homes acts as an after-dark guidepost, welcoming them to a place of safety. But for baby sea turtles, bright, artificial lights splashing from a home or business toward the beach send them a false message – that the safety of the water lies in the direction of the building. It's usually a deadly piece of misinformation for baby turtles.

Adult female turtles also can suffer from light-disorientation when they come ashore at night to lay their eggs. Bright, artificial lights can cause adult turtles to head in the direction of a busy highway or toward other land-based dangers.

Fortunately, there's an easy and inex-

pensive fix to protect sea turtles from the disorienting effects of beach lighting: Simply shield your lights from shining toward the beach.

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) recommends lights be shielded starting on March 1 in Brevard and Broward counties, and May 1 in all other counties, through October 31 everywhere. If there is a need to light development landward of the sea turtle nesting beach, special lighting systems are available. They are designed to eliminate the turtle's confusion as to which way the water really is.

There's still another common habit that can have very serious consequences for baby turtles. During sea turtle nesting season, furniture should be removed from the beach at night because it acts as a barrier to the hatchlings. The delay exposes them to a greater risk of predation. Sometimes furniture proves an impenetrable barrier that hatchlings can't negotiate.

Some of the simple things we do and take for granted on a daily basis can have serious consequences for wildlife. No matter where you live in Florida, be it on a rural dirt road or on the beachfront where sea turtles and shorebirds nest – take a little time to find out about the wildlife in your area and check local lighting ordinances if you live on the coast.

Fishing with children can be the delight of anyone's day

If you really want to know why fishing is fun, all you have to do is take children out and watch the stream of emotions that light up their faces as they learn to bait a hook, cast and finally hook and retrieve a fish. The joy of learning, the reconnection with nature and our heritage, and the fulfillment of knowing they can catch their own – just like the pioneers – contribute to those sensational smiles.

Conservation agencies, guides, facility planners, anglers and boaters share roles in making fishing more fun and satisfying for everyone on the water. They all have an abiding love for aquatic resources and the conservation stewardship ethic that help keep our natural resources pristine.

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) is striving to create the next generation that cares through a variety of education and outreach programs across the state. For instance, Mike Lesso and Dave Morse, who work

with the FWC's Jacksonville Youth Summer Fishing Clinics, have taught more than 50,000 children to fish.

"Mike, a high school teacher and avid sportsman, and Dave, a retired businessman and tournament fisherman, have been teaching children how to catch fish for so long that many of their earliest pupils now have children of their

own," said Eddie Leonard, their supervisor from the FWC's Division of Freshwater Fisheries Management.

"It's apparent when observing these two that they love what they are doing," Leonard said.

Youth summer fishing clinics help kids appreciate freshwater resources and teach them the skills needed to catch fish. "These incredible experi-

ences are delivered completely free of charge to participants," he added.

The duo typically conducts two workshops per day in the Jacksonville area, throughout the summer, reaching more than 5,000 students during summer break some years. Classes begin with a 30-minute lecture on ethical angling, water pollution, fish biology, tackle and techniques, and several other topics.

"Then the fun starts," Leonard said. They take the kids to the water's edge. Some children get frustrated easily or seem distracted at first. However, once someone catches the first fish, they are all very much in the moment.

"The expressions on the faces of the kids catching that first fish are nothing short of fantastic," Leonard said.

There always seems to be that one kid who stands out as a true angler, Leonard explained. "One little girl at a recent event was so successful that she offered to show the other kids how it was done. The student became the teacher in 90 minutes."

The FWC maintains more than 80 fish management areas

in rivers and lakes. Partners help by providing bait, tackle, advertisements, supporting materials and fish camps around the state.

"This is a great program showcasing multiple partnerships and the incredible work of dedicated volunteers," Leonard said. To learn more about fish camps in freshwater and fishing clinics in saltwater, visit MyFWC.com/Fishing.

The following checklist makes fishing more enjoyable, safe and sustainable for everyone, including future generations.

- An Ethical Angler:**
- * Promotes, through example and mentoring, an ethical use of aquatic resources.
 - * Values and respects the aquatic environment and all living things, including other anglers and boaters.
 - * Never dumps pollutants, such as gas or oil, or tosses pieces of fishing equipment or trash on the ground or in the water.
 - * Purchases required fishing licenses and permits. (See MyFWC.com/License.)
 - * Learns and obeys angling and boating regulations and can identify fish to adhere to the rules.
 - * Keeps no more fish than

needed for consumption. Uses tackle and techniques that minimize harm to fish and carefully handles and releases alive all fish that are unwanted or prohibited by regulation.

- * Takes precautionary measures to prevent the spread of exotic plants and animals and does not use diseased or non-native baits.
- * Participates in conservation efforts such as cleanups, transplanting, tagging and creel surveys.
- * Practices safe angling and boating.
- * Protects animals and the environment from damage caused by careless boat operation.
- * Conserves energy and water on a daily basis, knowing how it affects local fish and wildlife.

Fishing license sales, matching federal funds and donations support these programs. The law generally requires fishing licenses if you are between 16 and 65 years old. However, many anglers know that buying a license helps fund fish and wildlife conservation, so they voluntarily buy one as a way of showing their stewardship ethic. In addition, you can donate to Florida Youth Fishing and Hunting Programs when you purchase a license.

This story represents the meaning of the flag of the United States of America to those who are in the U.S. Armed Forces and who have fought and who do fight to protect our freedoms

The story is true and taken from a speech that John McCain gave before the 1988 Republican National Convention.

A real example of the story as it has been circulated:

From a speech made by Capt. John S. McCain, USN, (Ret) who represents Arizona in the U.S. Senate: As you may know, I spent five and one half years as a prisoner of war during the Vietnam War. In the early years of our imprisonment, the NVA kept us in solitary confinement or two or three to a cell. In 1971 the NVA moved us from these conditions of isolation into large rooms with as many as 30 to 40 men to a room. This was, as you can imagine, a wonderful change and was a direct result of the efforts of millions of Americans on behalf of a few hundred POWs 10,000 miles from home.

One of the men who moved into my room was a young man named Mike Christian.

Mike came from a small town near Selma, Alabama. He didn't wear a pair of shoes until he was 13 years old. At 17, he enlisted in the US Navy. He later earned a commission by going to Officer Training School. Then he became a Naval Flight Officer and was shot down and captured in 1967.

Mike had a keen and deep appreciation of the opportunities this country-and our military-provide for people who want to work and want to succeed. As part of the change in treatment, the Vietnamese allowed some prisoners to receive packages from home. In some of these packages were handkerchiefs, scarves and other items of clothing. Mike got himself a bamboo needle. Over a period of a couple of months, he created an American flag and sewed on the inside of his shirt.

Every afternoon, before we had a bowl of soup, we would hang Mike's shirt on the wall of the cell and say the Pledge of Allegiance. I know the Pledge of Allegiance may not seem the most important part of our day now, but I can assure you that in that stark cell it was indeed the most important and meaningful event.

One day the Vietnamese searched our cell, as they did periodically, and discovered Mike's shirt with the flag sewn inside, and removed it. That evening they returned, opened the door of the cell, and for the benefit of all us, beat Mike Christian severely for the next couple of hours. Then, they opened the door of the cell and threw him in. We cleaned him up as well as we could.

The cell in which we lived had a concrete slab in the middle on which we slept. Four naked light bulbs hung in each corner of the room. As I said, we tried to clean up Mike as well as we could. After the excitement died down, I looked in the corner of the room, and sitting there beneath that dim light bulb with a piece of red cloth, another shirt and his bamboo needle, was my friend, Mike Christian. He was sitting there with his eyes almost shut from the beating he had received, making another American flag.

He was not making the flag because it made Mike Christian feel better. He was making that flag because he knew how important it was to us to be able to pledge allegiance to our flag and our country.

So the next time you say the Pledge of Allegiance, you must never forget the sacrifice and courage that thousands of Americans have made to build our nation and promote freedom around the world. You must remember our duty, our honor, and our country.

"I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Summertime safety a must this season

Summertime and the livin' is easy; Fish are jumpin' and the cotton is high ...

George Gershwin wrote these lyrics for the 1935 opera "Porgy and Bess." They seem fitting to many people, as summertime is seen as a time to kick back, relax and enjoy a slower pace.

With a greater number of people out and about enjoying the warm weather, the risk for accidents and injuries increases. The National Safe Kids Campaign says statistics indicate children will be rushed to emergency rooms around the country nearly three million times this summer. Higher rates of drowning, motor vehicle accidents and bicycle injuries occur this time of year.

There are a number of potential summertime hazards you can safeguard yourself against.

Sun-Related Injuries

While skin cancer and sunburn are the most obvious dangers from the sun, there are other hazards as well. Failure to protect the eyes from UV sun exposure can result in photokeratitis, irreversible sunburn of the cornea. While it may cause temporary vision loss, recurrent incidences of photokeratitis can lead to permanent vision loss as well. Individuals who are exposed to sunlight between 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. without UV protection may become sunburned, increasing their risk for skin cancer. According to the American Cancer Society, this year more than one million Americans will be diagnosed with skin cancer and about 9,500 people will die from it.

Dehydration and heat stroke are other potential hazards. Drinking plenty of water and other hydrating fluids (not diuretics like alcohol) can keep the body cool and refreshed. Headaches, acting angrily, dizziness, and excessive sweating or cessation of sweating may be signs of a serious sun-related health condition.

Water Hazards

The Maryland CARES Program, which educates health care professionals and the public about pediatric care

and safety, offers that drowning incidents increase 100 percent over the summer months. It takes only inches of water to drown a person, especially a young child. Every year the news broadcasts stories of children who fell into backyard pools or adults swept out to sea by choppy waves.

People should never take bodies of water for granted. Swimming only where there is a certified lifeguard can make water recreation safer. Individuals should follow the guidelines posted regarding swimming and avoid oceans when storms are brewing because of rip tides and undertows.

Children should always be carefully monitored around water. Self-latching gates around pools can help deter entry as well as safety covers or retractable pool ladders. Remember, pool floats and water wings (swimmies) should not be used as a substitute for a life vest.

Wildlife Dangers

Tick bites are common when the weather is warm. Experts say that the months of May, June and July are peak times for exposure to ticks, which may carry Lyme Disease or another dangerous parasite. Ticks are small and can be difficult to spot. People can do a tick check after coming in from outside, paying careful attention to the areas to which ticks tend to migrate: In ears, in and around the hair, under the arms, behind the knees, around the waist, and between the legs.

Mosquitoes, biting flies, bees, wasps, and other insects are in full force. Using an insect repellent can help keep them at bay and avoid bites.

In addition to insects, animals like bats, squirrels, raccoons and bears are more active in the warm weather. During the time of dawn and dusk deer may be on the prowl for food before the heat of day. People can pay attention to wildlife when driving, hiking or bicycling to avoid altercations.

Most individuals can enjoy the summer if they make safety a priority when planning recreational activities.
