Barry, Lawrence voters turn down library levy increase

Voters in both Barry and Lawrence counties soundly defeated a proposed 7 cent property tax levy increase that would have added an additional \$600,000 annually to the Barry-Lawrence Regional Library budget.

Barry County voters went against the issue with only 36 percent of the 3,141 voters in favor of the issue. The vote was split by 883 votes. Yes votes totalled 1,129 with 2,012 in opposition. Lawrence County voters were more favorable to the issue with 1,443 in favor versus 1,744 opposed. Around 45 percent of Lawrence County voters were in favor. A simple majority among the two counties would have been necessary for the increase to pass.

The library board proposed the property tax levy increase to combat budget issues that have been plaguing the library system of ten branches since 2008 when the property tax levy was rolled back from 17 cents per \$1,000 of assessed value to 15 cents.

Barry-Lawrence Regional Library board president Ann Hall said, "Obviously, we're extremely disappointed because we're looking to expand our services. Right now, we're going to have to fall back and relook at ev-

erything to determine what is the best use of the library funds and find out what our patrons want."

Multiple branches within the library system that covers both counties have had staff and hours cut to compensate for the budget constraints. The board hoped to use additional funds from the increase to purchase new materials, do maintenance projects and put the library branches back up to full hours of operation. However, now the board will have to come up with other options with the property tax levy remaining the same.

Hall said, "I can't see that we increase hours in our branches. With our income we have and the branches we have, we can't do that."

"We're going to have to make hard decisions. We're not going to be able to continue out expansion of existing services with the funding we currently have. We're not going to be able to stretch the budget that far."

Hall did want to reassure library patrons that the library would continue to operate, just with different priorities. She said, "We're going to continue to offer print books and ebooks, but the quantity is the question."

Cassville man arrested for meth in church charity closet

A Cassville man was arrested last week after being found unresponsive in a charity clothes closet in Washburn. Christopher Ray Pulliam, 31, was charged with possession of a controlled substance and resisting arrest.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by Barry County Sheriff's Deputy Chris Hutson, Pulliam was found in the Washburn First Baptist Church's clothes closet on Wednesday, March 30.

When Pulliam was approached by law enforcement, he allegedly presented his middle finger and refused to comply with orders. Then being taken into custody, Pulliam tried to pull away to run, as well as

tucking his arms under his body to try to avoid being handcuffed. Once detained, officers found a bag of crystal methamphetamine under his body.

Pulliam is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$15,000 cash-only bond.

Marple, Yarnall take school board seats

In the Cassville R-IV School board race, Chad Yarnall and Jeremy Marple were voted in by Cassville district voters in Tuesday's election. Marple and Yarnall were two of four running for the seats left by Greg Allen and Hal Smith who did not seek reelection.

Marple finished first with 769 votes, Yarnall second with 695, Gamon Sparkman came in third with 535 votes and Doyne "Damon" Brown finished last with 175 votes.

Marple said, "I was very pleased and humbled by the turn out and number of votes. I'm ready to get in with the other members and get to work."

Regarding his second place finish, Chad Yarnall said, "Mainly I'm honored and humbled by the support from the community to be elected to the school board."

When asked what their priorities will be when they are sworn in at the April 14 meeting, Marple said, "The first priority is to get in and work with the other members and understand procedure and ask questions when they need to be asked. We have to have priority with the teachers and the students."

Yarnall said, "My priori-

ties are to do the best job to make sure Cassville School is the best school it can be for the children and be there for any of the teachers and faculty. I just want to make sure that the kids are getting the best education they can get and our teachers are feeling appreciated. Good people make good schools."

Voters approve \$1M bond for Wheaton Schools

School to use funds for FEMA building

Wheaton School District voters passed a \$1 million bond issue in yesterday's election. Just Barry County voters passed the initiative with a 75 percent yes vote, 165 to 55.

The funds will be used to build a FEMA shelter on campus which will be utilized by both the students and community members.

Wheaton Schools Superintendent Dr. Lance Massey said, "We are combining bond issue funds with FEMA dollars to build a multipurpose community safe room for both our students and the community."

Aside from being a storm shelter, the district plans to use additional funds to make the building more multipurpose for students. The FEMA building will host events like music programs, speech and drama and K-12 physical education classes.

The overall project is right around \$2.06 million with \$1.54 million coming from FEMA grant funding and \$516,000 coming from

the bond issue passed by voters. The district plans to use the additional \$484,000 to make upgrades to the building to make it more useful to the district and community.

Upgrades will include making the doors automatically sync and unlock when the storm sirens go off. Massey said, "We want to make it automatically unlock to make sure that it's available and we don't have to have someone to get up here to get it open and consider their travel time."

"The only question we've got is to make sure that our system and the city system is compatible when the sirens go off. "That's one of the things our architect has started looking into because we've told him that is a priority. It'll be a real community combination of us working with the city."

As far as a time frame, there is no set answer, but they hope to start the project in the spring. Massey stated, "At this point, we are awaiting approval of

FEMA funding. FEMA has informed us that their next release of funds will be in the late August time frame. We're hoping to be a part of that round of funding, if not, they'll be another round of funding later in the late fall or early winter. It's just a waiting game to receive those FEMA dollars and grant approval and then we'll move forward with that project."

Once complete, the building will be approximately 8,500 square feet and be able to safely house 1,280 people in the case of an emergency.

The building will be constructed on campus between the high school and elementary buildings.

Massey added, "It'll be easy access to the community and all students K through 12. I think that's one of the selling points that helped us. Our folks wanted it on campus and easy access for everybody. We didn't build it on some remote place on campus that would make it difficult to get to."

Make the most of mulching

Lawns and gardens can often benefit from the laying of mulch. Mulch serves various purposes in lawns and gardens, and many experienced lawn and garden enthusiasts lay mulch to ensure their properties make it through spring, summer and fall unscathed.

First-time homeowners with little or no landscaping experience may not understand the benefits of mulch, which can be used to strengthen soil and protect properties from the elements.

Mulch refers to a material spread around or over a plant to enrich and/or insulate its soil. Many homeowners prefer mulch made of wood chips, which is both effective and readily available. When laid correctly, mulch deprives weeds of the light they need to grow. Organic mulches can even provide homes for crickets and a type of beetle that feed on weed seeds.

Mulch also can deter harmful pests depending on the type of mulch homeowners choose. When purchasing mulch, homeowners will have to choose between the aforementioned organic mulch or man-made mulches, which may be made of plastic or rubber. While man-made mulches may repel pests, they also can have adverse effects. Plastic, for example, can heat up in the summer and cause plants to burn. Certain organic mulches can repel insects that can threaten plants. That's because the majority of organic mulches increase the amount of beneficial bacteria in the soil, and they also increase the presence of helpful insects that do not pose a threat to plant life. Those helpful insects help keep

harmful insects at bay. Compost is a type of organic mulch that may attract harmful insects. While that does not mean homeowners should shy away from using compost as mulch, they should know that they may need to employ organic insecticides to combat their unwanted guests.

A new store is filling a niche in the Rocky Comfort community for those wanting healthier and more affordable options.

The Amish and More Store is owned and operated by mother-daughter team Gerri Bertalotto and Vicki Intessimone. Initially, they opened in 2008 as a variety store before making the transition to Amish store that offers a variety of bulk natural products for those wanting fewer preservatives and chemicals in their lives.

Bertalotto opened the store after she retired. She said, "We've been open eight years, and I was a surgery nurse and I retired and I thought I'm either going to have to get a job or something. I remodeled a building completely inside and insulated it and put a variety store in."

However, they closed down for about a year in 2015 when Bertalotto's other daughter was diagnosed with cancer. She said, "We closed down for a year while I took care of my daughter who had cancer. After she died, the store reopened in October."

After that, the pair were approached by the Amish community about working with them. Bertalotto said, "The Amish wanted to know if we would supply them bulk items because we are right in the middle of the Amish community. We decided we would go ahead and try it, and it went over so big, we put in a lot of Amish goods."

While they do provide a lot of items that are desirable to the Amish community, they also cater to a more modern clientele, as well. Some of the variety

includes toys, snacks, automotive and beauty products, as well as a tanning booth on site. It's a wide array of items that line the shelves and service they provide.

The store opened because the Amish needed a local store to buy their bulk items, so they started carrying 50 pound bags of different white and wheat flours, as well as oats, beans, rice and raw sugar. The business has grown to include a multitude of bulk items that

both the Amish and community can enjoy.

Other options at the store include Amish groceries such as Troyer's Beef Jerky, Backroads Candy, a variety of Amish butter and cheeses, as well as homemade soaps and pastas.

"We supply the bulk food We went ahead and put in a line of jar food, candy and beef jerky from the Amish," said Bertalotto. All of the foods labelled as Amish come from special sourcing. She said, "We order it

"The goal is to supply the community an old time country store," according to the mother-daughter duo.

As far as their more modern customers, Bertalotto said that a lot of people come in just for the Amish-made goods they carry. "The Amish food is more like a health food. If someone wants to eat healthy, it

has less chemicals and less preservatives and no cholesterol. It's much healthier food, even the candy. A lot of people buy for the health part of the food."

Use tax continues for county, Cassville

In Tuesday's general Municipal Election, 15.7 percent of Barry County voters turned out to the polls to vote on three different tax initiatives that impact Barry County as a whole and the City of Cassville. Voters voted to continue use taxes on out-of-state vehicle purchases and the 1/2-cent county-wide road tax.

For the county-wide use tax, 55 percent of voters were in favor of continuing to allow the county to collect tax on vehicles purchased out of state. Proponents of the measure said that it harms local dealer-

ships if people know they can get cheaper vehicles by driving across state lines and avoiding the sales tax. The State of Missouri already collects a use tax, but both county and city governments who wished to continue to collect the tax had to put the issue before voters.

The City of Cassville's use tax also passed. The voters were in favor of the vote 56 percent with the total 388 to 216.

Barry County's 1/2 cent road tax that provides dedicated funding for roads and bridges was also on the ballot for renewal. Voters fa-

vored the tax by 74 percent with 2,324 voters in favor and only 824 opposed.

Twelve of the county's road districts had property tax levies up for renewal to continue funding. All road districts with levies on the ballot will continue to collect funds for road maintenance. Most districts passed with large majorities. Districts continuing tax levies are: Ash, Butterfield, Corsicana, Flat Creek, Greasy Creek, Kings Prairie, Mineral Springs, Ozark, Pioneer, Pleasant Ridge, Purdy and Wheaton.

Barry County courts felony sentencing for March

• **Christopher Dion Anderson, Jr.**, of Exeter, pled guilty to two counts of burglary in the second degree and two counts of theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Anderson received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Anderson's charges stemmed from two separate incidents in May and September 2015. On May 25, Anderson forcibly entered Norm's Grocery in Seligman and stole \$2,042.70 worth of merchandise and money. According to a witness, Anderson asked him to stop at a trailer behind Norm's where he then ran behind Norm's and went back with a television, box of meat and a sealed bag of merchandise.

In September, Anderson broke into a residence on Main Street in Seligman and stole \$3,850 worth of items, including collectible coins, watches, knives and rocks.

• **Joseph Lee Bass**, of Branson, pled guilty to five counts of burglary in the second degree and one count of tampering with a

motor vehicle in the first degree. Bass received a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

Bass broke into several residences around Eagle Rock, stealing televisions and other goods.

• **Herbert Omar Bonilla II**, of Monett, pled guilty to assault in the third degree. Bonilla received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years supervised probation.

In September 2013, Bonilla punched another man in the face multiple times as well as hitting him in the legs with a baseball bat. According to Bonilla, he was acting in self defense, and a witness claimed the victim was highly intoxicated. The victim suffered a broken nose, probable broken jaw, swollen here and multiple contusions of the thigh.

Bonilla is to serve probation until March 8, 2018.

• **Stephen M. Brody**, of Everton, guilty to two counts of child molestation in the first degree. Brody received a suspended execution of a ten year incar-

ceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

In March 2015, Brody touched a 15-year old girl inappropriately under her clothing against her will. The girl was interviewed by the Monett Children's Center in March 2015.

Brody is to serve probation until March 21, 2021.

• **Sarah Leighann Brooks**, of Seligman, pled guilty to theft/stealing of less than \$500, trespassing in the first degree and possession of alcohol by a minor. Brooks received a suspended imposition sentencing, two years unsupervised probation and must pay restitution.

In May 2015, Brooks entered the Super Stop Store in Seligman by entering the store when she knew that she was banned from the premises and stole a bottle of Artistocrat vodka when she was underage.

Brooks is to serve probation until March 10, 2018.

• **Anthony Dale Buck**, of Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Buck received a suspended execution of a three year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

On September 1, 2014, Buck was pulled over for nearly pulling out in front of a tractor and trailer and causing a collision on MO-37 near Purdy. When the Missouri State Highway Patrol pulled him over, he did not have a drivers license. He admitted to having a baggie that had contained methamphetamine and a syringe in his vehicle at the time of the stop.

Buck is to serve probation until March 24, 2021.

• **John A. Craig**, of

Eagle Rock, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Craig received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

The Cassville Police Department stopped Craig on February 26, 2016, when the Cassville Walmart asset protection suspected him of concealing alcohol. He had an oxycodone pill in his possession when he was stopped.

Craig is to serve probation until March 22, 2019.

• **Michael Wayne Creswell**, of Glen Arm, MD, pled guilty to sexual misconduct in the first degree. Creswell received a suspended execution of a two year incarceration sentence and two years unsupervised probation.

Creswell, who was the Stone County Fire Marshall, was charged after an incident in 2013. The victim was doing fire fighter training and riding with Creswell. He told her that in order to get her training, she had to have sex with him. He had also made inappropriate comments and touched her inappropriately before that. The victim quit fire fighter training because of the incident. The case was from Lawrence County.

Creswell is to serve probation until March 21, 2018.

• **Rebecca Marie Drye**, of Exeter pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance. Drye received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Drye was found to be in possession of methamphetamine twice in 2015.

Drye is to serve probation until March 21, 2021.

• **Michael L. Gamel**, of Monett, pled guilty to non-support. Gamel was sentenced to two years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

As of June 2014, Gamel was in arrears for child support in the amount of \$13,021.

• **James M. Gamroth**, of Aurora, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Gamroth received a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

Gamroth was found to be in possession of a baggie of methamphetamine by the Wheaton Police Department in June 2015 in the same home with three minor children.

Gamroth is to serve probation until May 3, 2021.

• **Joseph Neal Griffith**, of Pea Ridge, Ark., pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree and driving while revoked as a first offense. Griffith received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence, a \$75 fine and five years supervised probation.

In January 2016, Griffith tried to take a truck without permission from Washburn and the owner held him at gunpoint with a shotgun until officers arrived.

Griffith is to serve probation until March 22, 2021.

• **Harley Ray Harris**, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Harris received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

In September 2015, Harris was found to be in possession of a glass methamphetamine pipe as well as a bag of marijuana on Highway 39 in Shell Knob.

On August 17, 2015, Koop attacked a woman, holding her down and choking her at a residence on State Highway 37 in Cassville. He was intoxicated at the time of the altercation, and held a screwdriver against her stomach, leaving a red mark.

• **Johnathon Michael Larson**, of Cassville, pled guilty to three counts of driving while revoked. Larson received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years unsupervised probation.

Larson was pulled over on three separate occasions while his drivers license was revoked in 2013 and twice in 2015.

Larson is to serve probation until March 22, 2019.

• **Corey William Lewallen**, of Branson, pled guilty to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Lewallen was sentenced to four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections of which he will serve 120 days of shock time.

Lewallen and another person went into both the Cassville and Aurora Walmarts. At Cassville, he left with a Dell computer without paying for it.

Nolen is to serve probation until March 14, 2021.

Patterson is to serve probation until March 21, 2021.

Sarcoxie shines with debut of new track facilities

Coach Mike Busselman waited 15 years for a track at Sarcoxie. Surveying the crowd of athletes, coaches, fans and officials at his first home meet on Saturday, Busselman agreed it was worth the wait.

The new Sarcoxie sports complex is nothing short of wow. The football field is turf, and is a surface second to none in the state. The 8-lane track is "mondo," not recycled tires. It is as fast as it is attractive. The track is protected by a chainlink fence that protects the competition area, limiting access and preventing jaywalkers from impeding runners during events. Outside of the fence is a cement sidewalk that completely encircles the track, and guides spectators to the concessions and necessary rooms. New bleachers and a modern press box complete the facility.

Busselman has hit the ground running with his new digs. Besides the meet Saturday, the Bears will host their conference meet this year and have already been awarded the district meet for 2017. The site will almost certainly be considered for sectional competition in future years.

It is no stretch to say that this facility is superior to the one at Lincoln University in Jefferson City, home to the MSHSAA state track and field championships. With a couple of Donald Trump hotels, a casino and a strip mall

of fast food outlets, Sarcoxie could make an argument for being named the new site for the state meet.

Eighteen schools attended the meet on Saturday, aptly named the "One Inch At A Time Classic," including local entrants Purdy and Southwest.

It was a good day to be a redhead. Southwest's Jarrett Pike placed in both the 1600 and 3200 meter races, while the Renkoski twins, McKenzie and Madison, led the Purdy girls to a strong showing.

Dr. Hunter to offer free oral cancer screenings

In recognition of April being oral cancer awareness month, Dr. Carolyn Hunter's office in Cassville will offer free oral cancer screenings over a four-day span the last week in April.

Monte Wolf, Dr. Hunter's office manager, said that the initiative was to help give back to the community. "She wants to educate the community and offer this service to them."

Part of the risk of oral cancer is that it often affects young, healthy, non-smoking adults, not just those with obvious risk factors like tobacco and alcohol use. Wolf said, "Dr. Hunter had gone to a conference and one of the speakers gave a phenomenal talk about the dangers of oral cancer. It's things we don't think about. You think it's a smoker or someone who chews, but the prevalence of contracting it through HPV is really high. It can be young, healthy, non-smokers."

Estimates for HPV have risen in recent years with the Center of Disease Control releasing data that most adults will have it at some point in their lifetime.

According to the Oral Cancer Foundation (OCF), oral cancer kills one person every hour in the United States, and it's that risk that

drove Dr. Hunter to offering the screenings.

Wolf said, "They don't have to have an appointment. They can just come in. It takes less than five minutes for the screening."

According to the OCF, oral cancer has a 80 to 90 percent survival rate if caught in the early stages. Dr. Hunter uses a special light to help detect oral cancer that will continue to be available as part of all her initial exams, as well.

"When we have a patient come in for an initial exam, it is part of the initial comprehensive cleaning, but she wanted to do more during April."

The screening consists of looking at variety of areas in the oral cavity, upper portion of the mouth and the teeth as well as tongue, hard and soft palates. They check for any abnormal tissue growth, as well.

Early signs of oral cancer can be hard to detect and can include changes in gums and hoarseness of the voice. Having a screening increases the likelihood of

catching it in the early stages of development. While Dr. Hunter won't diagnose whether any abnormalities are cancerous or not, she will give patients information to proceed with.

Free oral cancer screenings will be available from Monday, April 25, through Thursday, April 28, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Dr. Carolyn Hunter's office. The office is located 77 Smithson Drive in Cassville. For more information, call (417) 847-2461. Her website is www.carolynhunterdmd.com.

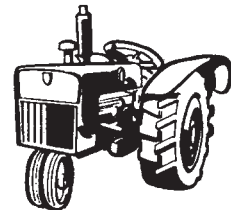
