French Delegates Cross to British Lines for Parley

Super Rule For World Plan Urged

London, July 12.—(AP)—An authoritative source said today that hostilities ceased in Syria last midnight and dispatches from Jerusalem reported that a Vichy-French delegation crossed the British lines this morning under a flag of truce to begin armistice discussions. This source said the Vichy delegation was told to meet an allied delegation at a designated spot and that presumably the meeting occurred according to schedule. It was said that nothing could be stated now about the terms, but that the discussions were of military and not of political significance.

British Fliers Make Attack On Navy Base

London, July 12.—(AP)—Heavy British bombers were reported to have attacked the German Navy base at Heligoland in the North Sea today. The attack was said to have been made by a force of 15 bombers, which dropped a large quantity of incendiary bombs. The base was reported to be a well-protected harbor, and the attack was said to have been a surprise. The British government said that it was confident that the base would be destroyed.

Told to Take 16 Axis Ships

Washington, July 12.—(AP)—Customs collectors in nine U. S. ports held orders today to take over 16 German and 16 Italian merchant ships as a preliminary to formal legal steps by the government to confiscate the vessels. The ships were among 28 Italian and two German merchant ships taken into protective custody by the Coast Guard on March 30. Some had been seized at sea, while others had been taken into custody by the Coast Guard at various ports. The ships were to be held until they could be formally confiscated.

40,000 Motor Workers Idle

The strikers are demanding a new contract which would provide for a 10 percent increase in wages and a shorter work week.

Ecuador Again Makes Attack Along Border

Peruvian Troops Ordered to Repulse Any New Aggression; Protest Seen as Useless. Lima, Peru, July 12.—(AP)—The Peruvian Foreign Office declared today that fresh Ecuadorian attacks had been experienced at several places along their eastern frontier and that since it would be useless to protest an order has been issued to Peruvian troops to repulse with arms any new aggression. Washington, July 12.—(AP)—Immediate withdrawal of British troops from Iceland, to forestall a possible Nazi attack which would place American Marines and sailors there under fire, was demanded today by Senator Bone (D-Wash.), a member of the Naval Affairs Committee. Describing the joint occupation of Iceland by American and British forces as "fraught with danger," Bone asserted that if United States troops were to take over the British ought to get out at once. "As long as the British are in Iceland, they are a liability," Bone said.
