Vienna, July 31—(P)—F. H. La-Guardia, UNRRA director general, planned an investigation today of published reports that oil from the Russian zone of Austria was being shipped elsewhere, in violation of UNRRA regulations, and that some of it had been sold in Czecho-

elovakia.

He told a news conference yesterday that he also planned to determine whether all of the natural produce of the zone was being used for Austria's recovery, as required by UNRRA.

Questioned about the oil, he said: "That's the issue I'm going to find out."

The former New York mayor said that observers of the relief agency had not been allowed to go freely into the Russian zone of eastern Austria, but asserted he was "going to see to it they get that right."






