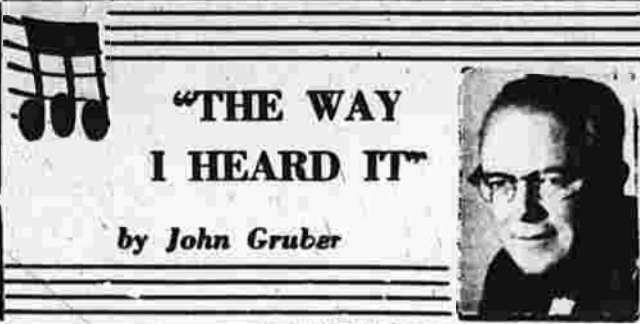

"THE WAY I HEARD IT"

This is our final column before Christmas, and I should like at this time, to wish each of you a joyous holiday season.

The Met is apparently going to open again. Bing is still talking about it. "Aha!" on Dec. 28, but since he put in a call for first rehearsal on Dec. 14, this only gives him two weeks to get his first production on the stage. It may be possible, but I doubt it. Further, James Meade, who was supposed to be the conductor, has been bound by other commitments.

Maybe you'll recall that two weeks ago I doubted he would be back. Tenor Glenn Raimondi, and soprano Marie Collier and Elena Kulikova, are likewise engaged elsewhere and won't be back for the abbreviated season now scheduled for 16 weeks.

Let's review things for a moment. In the first place, 14 unions were involved, not just the pit musicians who got the most publicity and the AGMA members who comprise chorus and ballet. All were willing to start the season on time with the contractual agreements being retroactive to the beginning of the season.

This was not according to the idea of Mr. Bing, who ruled that all workers should be signed up before he would open the house. In short, it was a "lock-out" of the pit musicians. Mr. Bing wanted his way, not a season of opera.

Mr. Bing now loudly crying that his deficit this season will be about \$7 million, twice the deficit of the 1966-69 season. Remember I told you to take his statements with plenty of sodium chloride? I give you some figures and you can decide just how much salt you'll need to make his story palatable.

One-half of \$7 million is \$3 1/2 million, of course. Now Mr. Bing hasn't actually said that this is caused by raises in time to orchestra, chorists, and ballet personnel, but he has only disclosed the raises for them and inferred they were the heinous offenders to cause the startling increase.

There are about 100 pit musicians. They got raises of 40 per cent last year. Of course, that is \$4,000 per week for the entire orchestra, and for

Arab Attack on Plane Draws Stiff Sentence

WINTERTHUR, Switzerland (AP) — A Swiss court sentenced three Arab commandos to 12 years each in prison for the killing of an Israeli pilot during a machine-gun attack on an El Al airliner at Zurich airport Feb. 18.

The court acquitted Mordchai Rachamim, 29, an Israeli security guard aboard the airliner who killed a fourth Arab commando.

The Arabs, Mohamed Abu el Heiga, 34; Tawfik Ibrahim Yousef, 34; and a 23-year-old woman schoolteacher, Aminia Dabbour, are members of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine. The 307 days they have been under trial in the El Al plane at Athens airport in December 1966.

According to the evidence, Yousef was the only one of the three who actually fired at the pilot. He was charged with the murder of the pilot. The prosecution defended that the commando, Abdel Mehem, had thrown down his gun before Rachamim fired.

The three Arab defendants were found guilty on six charges, including premeditated killing, causing grievous bodily harm, endangering and disturbing public air traffic and the lives of many persons.

The trio heard the translation of the verdict without flinching. They remained silent, when I suggested this idea while the house was still building. "Who wants to go to a 'Paradise' Public' theater to see opera?" Who wants to see Mr. Bing's very questionable deficit after?

I mentioned, last week, my hand to a class of students to see how well they can guess. "Which diamonds will succeed?" I ask. "Clubs or diamonds?" And I urge members of the class to guess the diamonds they prefer. They get what voters usually get — cynical.

South dealer.

Opening lead — Three of spades.

South should not choose a finesse until he sees what happens at the first trick. Declarer plays dummy's queen of spades and awaits developments.

As the cards lie, the queen of spades is the best lead. The South is safe if West leads a later trick because South's king of spades will win a trick.

West leads spades. East is the dangerous opponent since the king of spades will win a trick if East leads a spade.

Declarer must therefore try to establish a trump suit even though the finesse loses. West cannot make a damaging return, and South is treated to one spade, three hearts, two diamonds and three clubs.

What might you say?

Answer: Pass. You have only 8 points, and partner's bidding shows a minimum opening bid. Game is out of the question, and you should pass at any convenient par-score contract, such as one notrump.

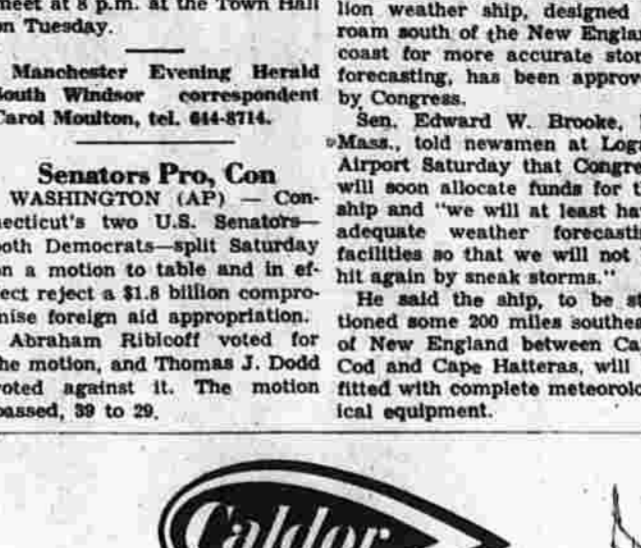

Italy Survives Labor Strife But Stormy Sailing Ahead

ROME (AP) — Italy appeared today to have weathered four months of labor rebellion topped off by a string of terrorist bombings. But officials and commentators agree the nation has more stormy sailing ahead in 1970.

The strike-filled autumn of labor unrest attracted the economy. Often there were street demonstrations and violence. Bombings that caused 14 deaths and more than 100 wounded in Milan and Rome Dec. 12 stirred fears of revolution or coup d'etat.

There was a wage agreement Sunday between the biggest striking labor group, the 1.2 million metal workers, and industrialists but not an end to the "hot autumn." Relatively few labor disputes remain unresolved.

The bombings in the words of the Milan daily Corriere della Sera, "could have exacerbated the state of violence and led to death already weakened republican and democratic institutions." Instead they brought widespread horror, and Corriere said: "There is no doubt the democratic system, as a whole, has withstood the test. There was no splitting of the country in two, as was feared by the opposite extreme."

There has been no significant violence since the bombings, and Premier Mariano Rumor's Christian Democratic government is still in office.

Many have likened the situation in recent months to the atmosphere of desperation that preceded the rise of Mussolini's fascism in the 1920s. But the Italians now are better off financially, better educated and more mobile than they were then. There is no evidence that any of the present extremist cliques are headed by any significant organizations with power and money.

Although some think there is a possibility that rightists might try to take over in reaction to leftist extremism, most knowledgeable Italians dismiss the idea.

Economically and politically, many difficulties lie ahead.

Rome Suspends Passport For Leftist Chief

ROME (AP)—Authorities yesterday ordered the suspension of the passport of Gian Giacomo Feltrinelli, one of Italy's leading leftists in the wake of terrorist bombings eight days ago.

The order followed a search of Feltrinelli's Milan office on Friday.

Feltrinelli, whose politics are further left than the Communist party's, has been on a foreign tour since Dec. 4 to seek material for his publishing house, run under his own name.

Authorities said neither the search nor the passport order meant that they thought Feltrinelli had anything to do with the

bombing of a Milan bank Dec. 12 that killed 14 persons and wounded 90.

Rome police on Friday charged five youths with taking part in simultaneous terrorist bombings in Rome. A 34-year-old cancer, Pietro Valpreda, had been charged earlier with carrying out the Milan attack.

All six belong to a Rome anarchist club.

The persons charged on Friday included the son of a Supreme Court judge, the son of a well-known orchestra conductor and the nephew of an ex-senator.

Bastogne Still Builds Monuments to 'Nuts'

EDITOR'S Note — Twenty-five years ago the great German counter-attack known as the Battle of the Bulge swept across the snowy forest of the Ardennes. Twenty-two divisions, nearly a quarter of the Allied lines in a desperate lunge at the key port of Antwerp, the little town of Bastogne became an island of resistance in the awesome flood tide.

BASTOGNE, Belgium (AP)—The "nuts" word that stopped a German army has added immensity to the tourist delights of this lovely little town.

The "Nuts" Museum and the Nuts Bar and the Nuts Garage are as much a part of the local scene as the front stream babbling through the surrounding Ardennes Forest and the hams hanging in shop windows.

Place MacAuliffe, Bastogne's main square, is named, although unapplied, for Brig. Gen. Anthony MacAuliffe, the artillery officer who 28 years ago today wrote the one-word reply, "Nuts," to the German invitation to surrender.

On the third floor of the Nuts Museum the whole scene is done up in wax effigy, with the German surrender team clad in their white snowsuits and MacAuliffe, in crisp fatigues, smiling a waxy smile, as if the "nuts" is in fact a laughing matter.

But a reply by air was promised for the night or Christmas Eve at the latest, and already, despite the two-inch fall of snow, the 89 Air Force was sending in a liaison officer to coordinate the promised air attacks.

Despite everything, things were going so well that the Americans thought it was the Germans who wanted to surrender. As word of the white-flag incident spread down the line, a block of German soldiers emerged from their foxholes, building fires to get warm and dry their clothes, shaving and visiting their neighbors.

"We are parliamentarians," said the German captain in dictatorial English to Sgt. Oswald Butler of the 27th Glider Regiment, who first saw them coming across the fields. Butler tore off a portion of the white flag, blindfolded "the four Krauts," as he called them in his field phone report, and had them taken to headquarters.

The whole camp was sleeping in four-hour shifts. MacAuliffe had to be awakened. "The fortune of war is changing, and this time the U.S.A. forces in and near Bastogne have been encircled by strong German armored units. There is only one possibility to save the encircled U.S.A. troops from total annihilation: That is the honorable surrender of the encircled force. If this proposal should be rejected, six heavy antiaircraft battalions are ready to annihilate the U.S.A. troops in and near Bastogne. All serious civilian losses caused by the antiaircraft fire would not correspond with the well-known American humanitarianism."

MacAuliffe had his acting chief of staff, Lt. Col. Ned Moore, read the note. "What's it say, Ned?" "They want us to surrender." "Aw, nuts."

The word later was made the formal reply to the Germans. MacAuliffe—Moore's dialogue is reproduced in several languages on the walls of the Nuts Museum, and even today German tourists can't quite dig what is so funny about a general replying "nuts."

Gen. Hasse von Mantzfeldt, commander of the 5th Panzer Army, was furious at von Lattwitz for sending the surrender offer. He considered it a bad show, and besides, the artillery batteries threatening to devastate the town didn't exist.

As for the heavy antiaircraft batteries, most of them now lay buried in the German military cemetery west of town, among the 6,785 Germans buried there from the battle.

Patton and Army finally got through on the day after Christmas, as evidenced by the Patton tank on the railroad station. The general, killed a year later in a Jeep accident in Germany, was buried in the U.S. military cemetery at Luxembourg City, along with 5,078 other U.S. soldiers.

Bastogne gives the statistics for the entire Battle of the Bulge along the whole 80-mile-long front: Allied: 78,800 killed, wounded or missing.

Yuletide Plea Tied to Tree Gets Answer

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—When Lee Gillipie placed a plea for help tied to a tree at a shopping center, he found attached to it a note from Mrs. Gillipie's sister.

"Dear Christmas Tree Buyer, I am a 12-year-old girl a little handicapped with writing due to cerebral palsy. My sister writes for me. Should I be lucky enough to get a sweater for Christmas, she'll thank you."

The girl, who included her address, was Adele Perry, one of eight children of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Perry, of Merigomish, Pocahontas County, Nova Scotia.

A phone call to the Canadian province confirmed that Adele, the daughter of a lumberjack, had the note written Nov. 20 and tied to a tree destined for the United States.

On Sunday, Gillipie, a foreman at Westinghouse Corp., and his wife bought a sweater and scarf set and sent it to Adele.

"I'm glad Lee picked that tree," Mrs. Gillipie said. "Remember, this must have been intended for us."

Mrs. Gillipie has a son and a daughter by a previous marriage but both died of multiple sclerosis, the daughter last April.

FBI Nabs Man Said One of Ten 'Most Wanted'

GREENWICH, Conn. (AP)—Police early Monday morning were holding a man they say is 41-year-old Francis Leroy Hohimer, one of the FBI's 10 most wanted fugitives.

He was expected to be arraigned today in federal court in New Haven, but federal officials and police said they were not sure when he would be turned over to federal authorities.

Greenwich police and FBI agents from Stamford arrested the man they say is Hohimer late Saturday night at a restaurant he had been operating with his wife under the name John P. Reynolds.

He was wanted for interstate flight to avoid prosecution of the alleged gunpoint robbery of a Denver philanthropist, Temple Buell, two years ago.

According to deputy police chief Thomas Burke, Hohimer came to Greenwich with his wife and a baby daughter in September, purchased the franchise of the International House of Pancakes in the One Oak section, and had been operating the restaurant with his wife.

The FBI, according to Burke, had traced Hohimer from a Midwest through jobs as a bartender and chef in New York, and on to Connecticut.

Four more of Hohimer's children are living with his mother in the Midwest, Burke said.

The FBI says that Hohimer and an associate robbed Buell of about \$200,000 in jewelry, cash and money orders on Aug. 17, 1967.

Buell is an architect-builder who gave \$25 million to a school called Colorado Women's College and gave the school the name Temple Buell College after him.

On Sept. 8, 1967, Hohimer was arrested at Alton, Ill., for possession of burglary tools and illegal possession of firearms. He was released in December, 1967, on \$25,000 bond, according to the FBI.

About two months later, he was charged in Denver with interstate flight to avoid prosecution for robbery.

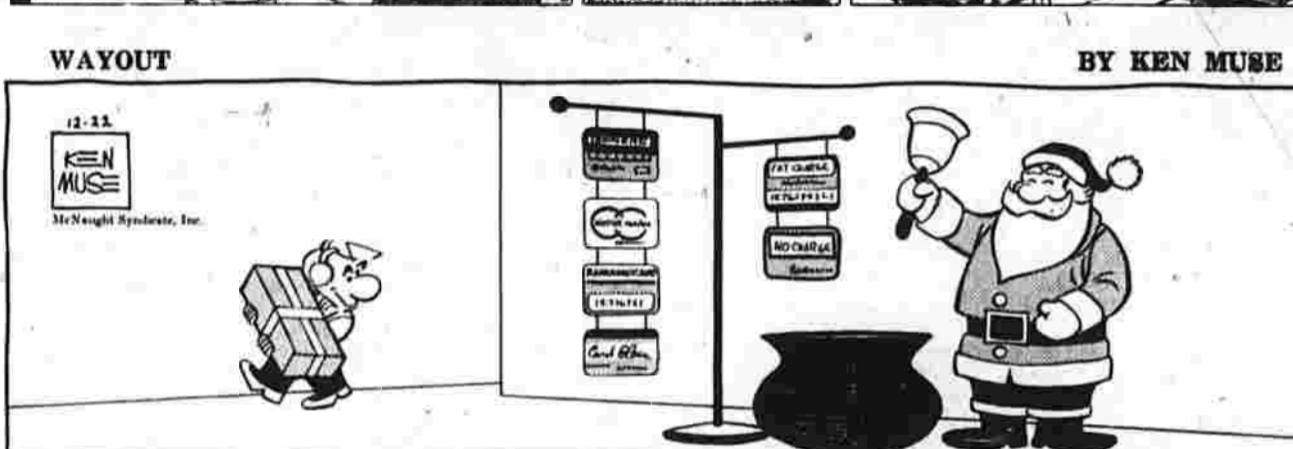

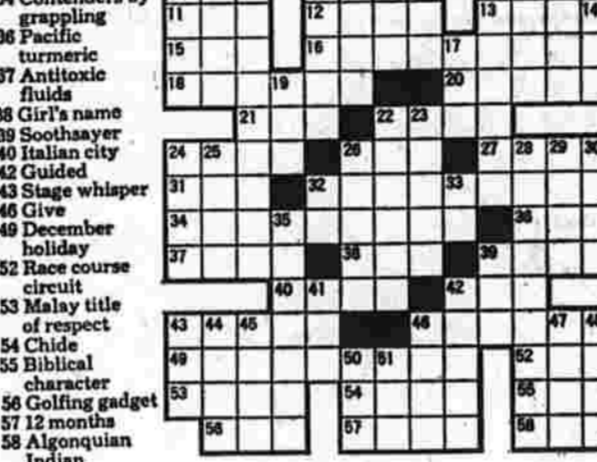
