

Dismal Days At The UN

This session of the General Assembly of the United Nations opened with Angle Brooks of Liberia, assuming her office as President of the Assembly, making an eloquent plea for the nations of the earth to begin taking the United Nations -the one clear hope any of them has for survival-seriously.

The same Miss Brooks delivered an other speech, the other day, as the General Assembly closed its 24th annual ses-

She made another eloquent appeal, this time for specific things, like ceasefires in Nigeria, in the Near East, in

There is small chance that her appeal will be heard, or even picked up and

many contributions to what was as dark and mournful an adjustment of this potential world legislature as could be

With the world visibly engaged in three armed conflicts in defiance of the wrangling over just which motto it should adopt for next year's celebration of the 25th anniversary of the United

Should it be, the weighty debate went, "Peace, Justice and Progress," as the Assembly voted, back in October, or should it be reduced back to just "Peace and Progress," a version for which some stamp sets had already been printed?

The United Nations General Assembly finally settled this important question by voting to make both versions official, and issue both kinds of stamps.

While the Assembly itself was concern ed with such vital last day business, its most powerful member was, off in a news conference, giving an example of how seriously it was taking the world organization it helped create.

One of the things the Assembly had managed to do, on the day before adjournment, was ring up an 80 to 3 vote for a resolution declaring that tear gas and defoliants are to be included in the chemicals banned from warfare by the 1925 Geneva Protocol which the United States has finally declared its intention of signing.

At the last day press conference the U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations, Charles W. Yost, was making it clear that the United States did not accept and would not be bound by such a resolution referring to weapons the United States plans to continue to use in Vietnam.

This is the way the world, which in cludes all of us, seems unable to do anything more than watch while the only concept and the only system which might hold mankind together in a condition of survival are being weakened and disnantied, step by step, until the time will once more arrive when men and nations no longer have any protection against

Perhaps, by some miracle, the future is going to be different.

But what past history says to us is that this present process of letting the United Nations wither away by the carelessness, neglect, indifference, and do-itthemselves preoccupations of even its great founding members can only end in disaster of criminal proportions. We ought to be shuddering, all of us. If, somehow, we are not shuddering, that shows how far down the wrong road we have already gone.

In any case, as a general proposition, it might be asked: What is the hurry on Main St., anyway? Do we want Main St. to be a thoroughfare or a shopping center, a place to race through or a place to visit and see at a reasonable pace? The superhighways are being built to get people from one place to another Main St. is one of the places to get to.
