

Why Statewide, Summative Assessment Data?

- Provides comparable, criterion-referenced data based on the depth and breadth of:
 - Michigan Academic Standards
 - Michigan's Alternate Content Expectations
- Snapshot data that can be used to help inform:
 - Curricular alignment discussion
 - Impact of implemented programs
 - Review enacted curriculum vs. stated curriculum
 - Educational programming decisions
 - Identify equity gaps in student achievement

OEAA Secure Site – What is it?




The Secure Site is a web-based application used for managing Michigan's state assessments.

- Available to <u>authorized</u> district and school staff that require it as part of their role in state assessments.
- Primary functions of the Secure Site are:
 - Pre-identification of students for online and paper/pencil testing
 - Ordering paper/pencil testing materials
 - Incident Reporting
 - Review of Accountable Students and Test Verification
 - Accountable Students Enrolled and Demographics
 - Answer Documents Received and Not Tested
 - Retrieval of assessment score files and reports

Scores are available for all state assessments if the school is the student's primary educational providing entity (PEPE). To change the student's PEPE, an enrollment record must be submitted in the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS) for the student by the district authorized MSDS user.


If the school is not the PEPE, then scores for tests taken at the school are only visible.

No change in meaning or in interpretation





Adequate

Blue indicates the student is making **adequate** progress in the standards that make up the claim.

Attention

Yellow indicates **attention** may be needed in the standards that make up the claim.

At Risk

Orange indicates the student is most at risk of falling behind in the standards that make up the claim.

2021 and later

Above

Blue indicates the student's performance on the standards that make up the claim is **above** the overall proficiency cut.

At/Near

Yellow indicates the student's performance on the standards that make up the claim is **at or near** the overall proficiency cut.

Below

Orange indicates the student's performance in the standards that make up the claim is **below** the overall proficiency cut.

The Michigan Academic Standards (www.michigan.gov/academicstandards) set learning expectations for what students should learn and be able to do at each grade level. The standards help to ensure that students are ready to graduate from high school and are prepared to pursue their chosen postsecondary opportunities.

As required by state and federal law, your student took the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress (M-STEP) this spring. The M-STEP measures student progress based on the standards for Grades 3-8. Students in Grade 4 were tested in English Language Arts and Math. Your child's test results are included in this report.

Please remember that these assessments are simply a snapshot of a student's achievement. I encourage you to discuss these results with teachers who know your student personally. The M-STEP results should be used with classroom performance information from your child's teachers, benchmark assessment results, and other reflections of those who work closely with your child to provide the most complete picture of your child's progress. Under no circumstances should you or anyone else judge where your child is academically solely based on results on M-STEP, particularly when administered during a pandemic.

Parents/guardians have an Important role in setting high expectations and supporting their child in meeting them. If your child needs additional help or wants to learn more about a subject, I encourage you to work with your local educator(s) to find helpful resources. Families, schools, and teachers succeed when they work together to support and inspire student achievement.

What do my student's overall scores mean?

Student overall scores reflect what students know and can do in relation to Michigan's academic standards. Overall scores are reported in one of four performance levels.

Advanced The student's performance exceeds academic content standards and indicates substantial understanding and application of key concepts defined for Michigan students. The student needs support to continue to excel

Proficient The student's performance indicates understanding and application of key academic content standards defined for Michigan students. The student needs continued support to maintain and improve proficiency.

Partially Proficient The student's performance is not yet proficient, indicating a partial understanding and application of key academic content standards defined for Michigan students. The student needs assistance to improve achievement.

Not Proficient The student's performance is not yet proficient and indicates minimal understanding and application of key academic content standards defined for Michigan students. The student needs intensive intervention and support to improve achievement.

Students who are Advanced or Proficient have met the 4th grade proficiency standards for the content area. Students who are Partially Proficient or Not Proficient have not yet met the grade level proficiency standards for the content area.
