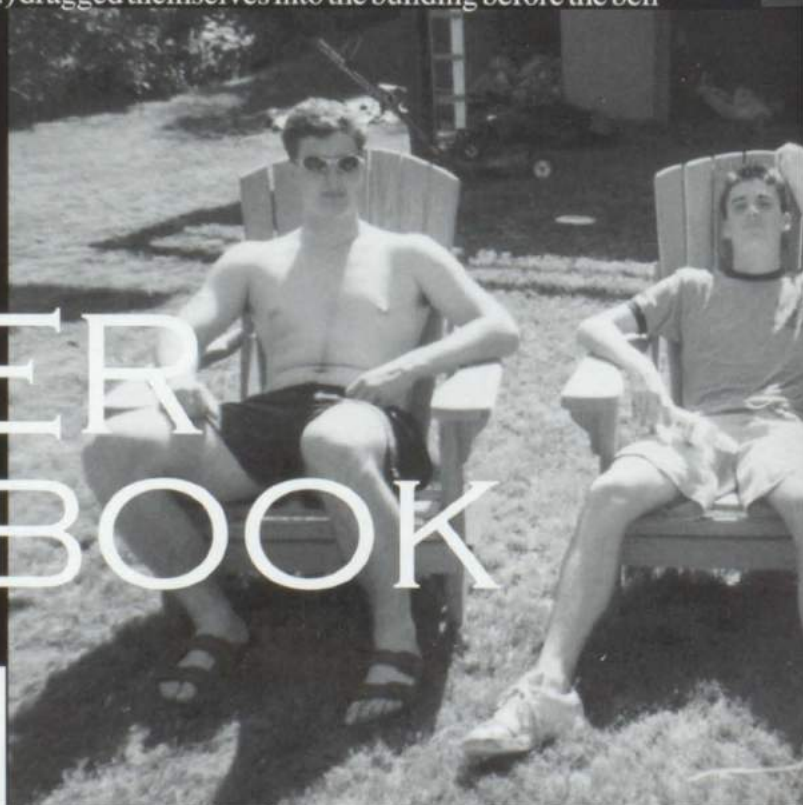

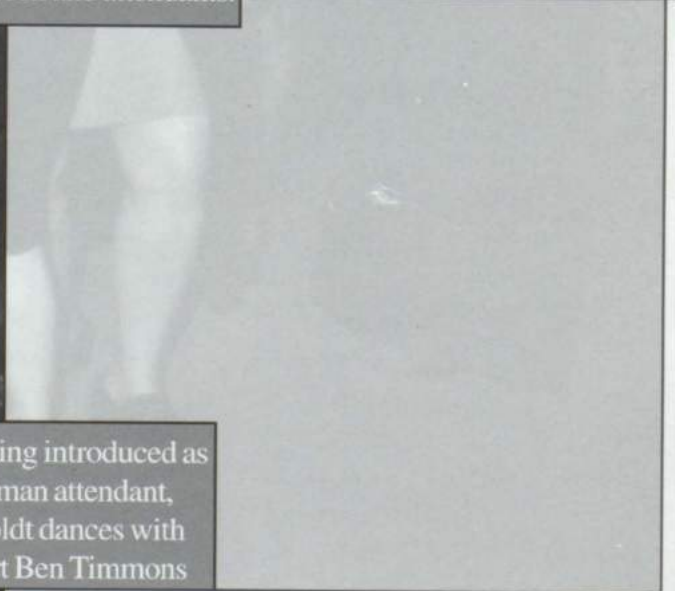

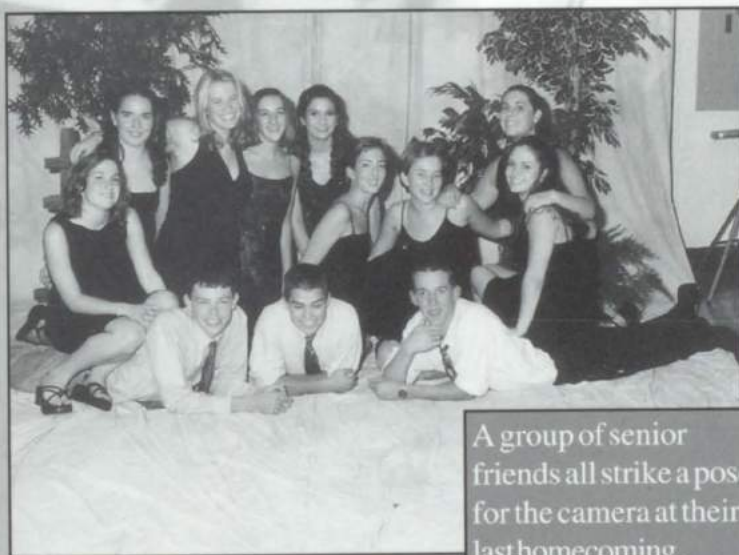

# POWDER PUFF

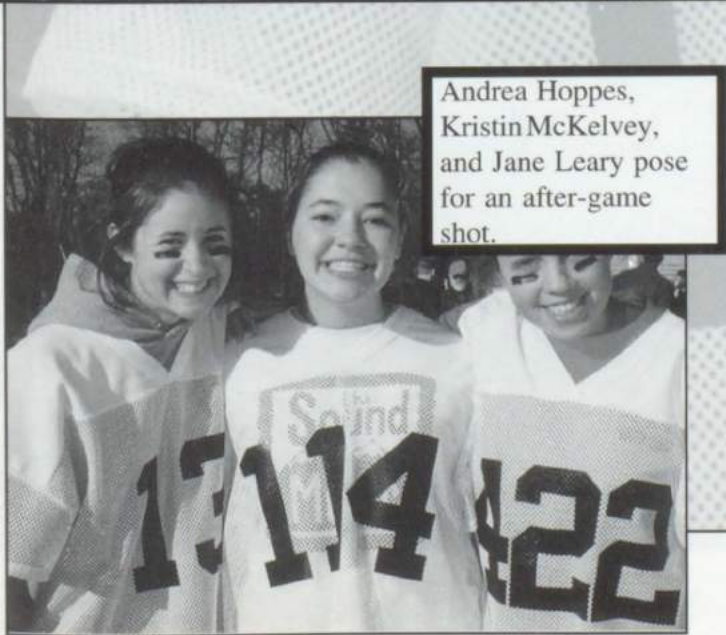

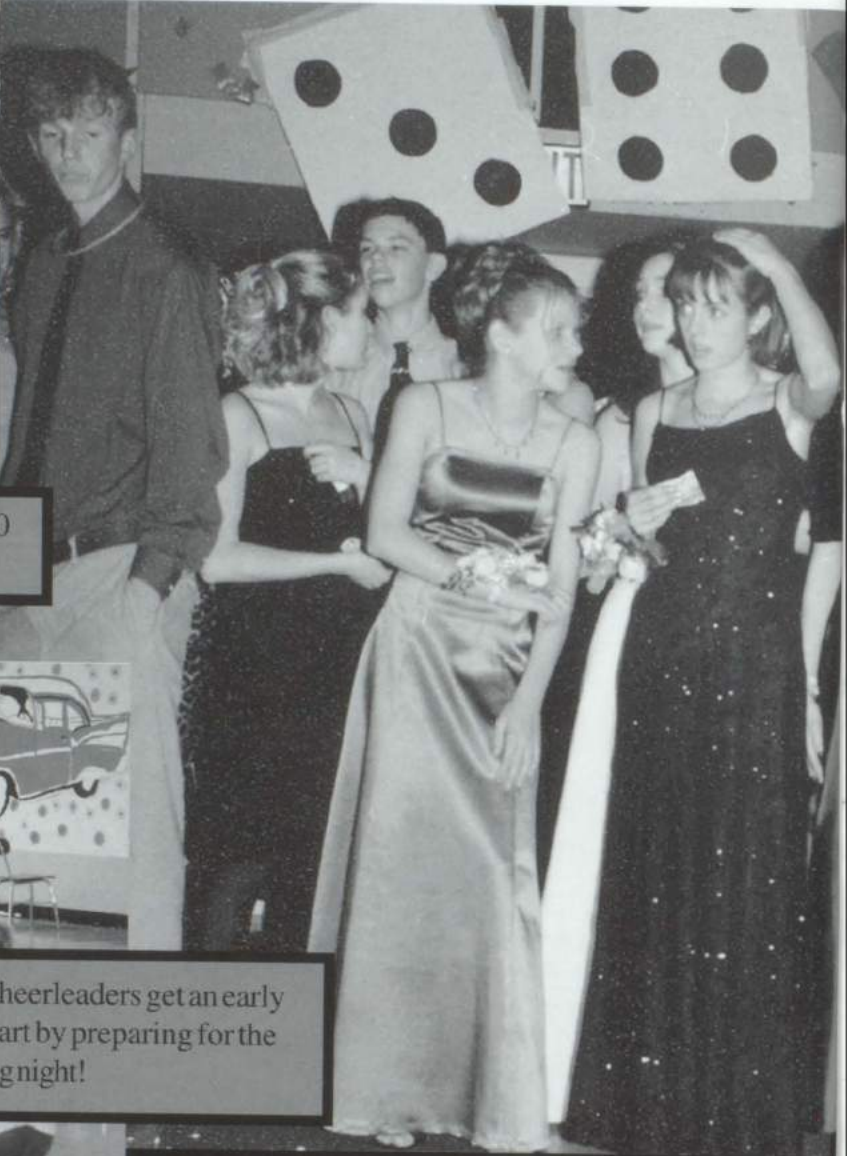

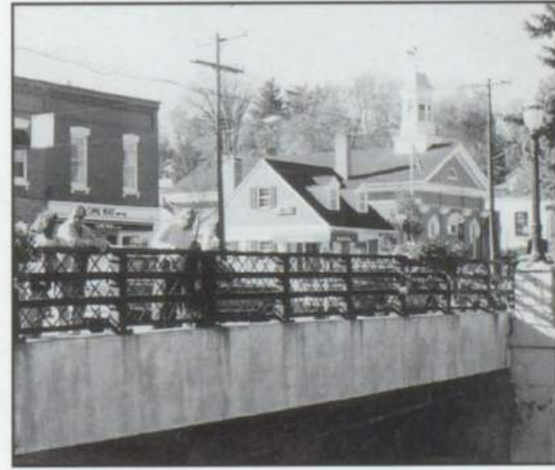

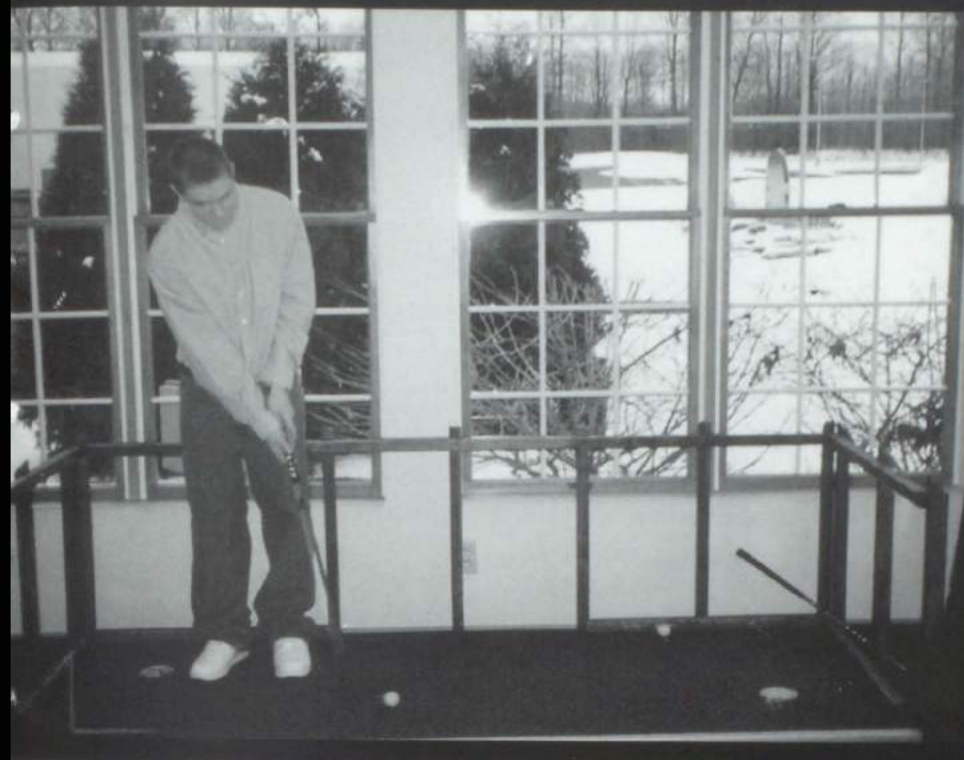

While some students at CFHS stay after school for sports practices and others head home to relax, a surprisingly large number of students rush to work following a hectic school day. These students, many of whom give up their opportunity to sleep in on weekends, deserve to be commended for their abilities to manage a work schedule on top of school work, and occasionally sports practices. In a recent survey of all grades in the high school, in which students were asked if they had a job or if they would like to have a job, the numbers showed that sixteen percent of the freshman class have jobs. Of those who don't work, 58% wish that they did work. Ten percent of sophomores work, and 50% would like to work. Of the juniors, 38% have a job and 50% would like to find a job. While 68% of the senior class hold jobs, eight percent say they are looking for a job. Undoubtedly, the biggest reason high schoolers at Chagrin like to work is for the money. While some find it difficult to manage their time, most feel that they benefit and even improve their time management skills when they have to balance homework, a job, and other extracurricular activities.

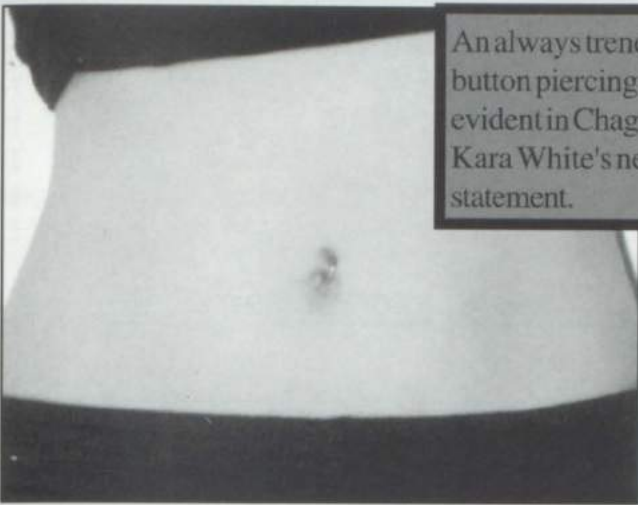

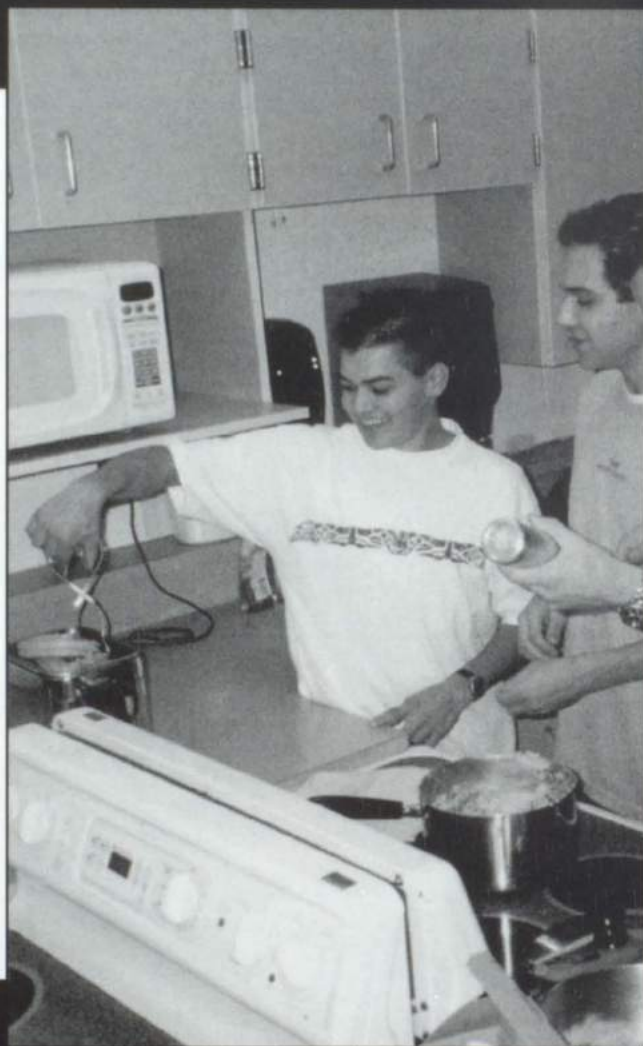

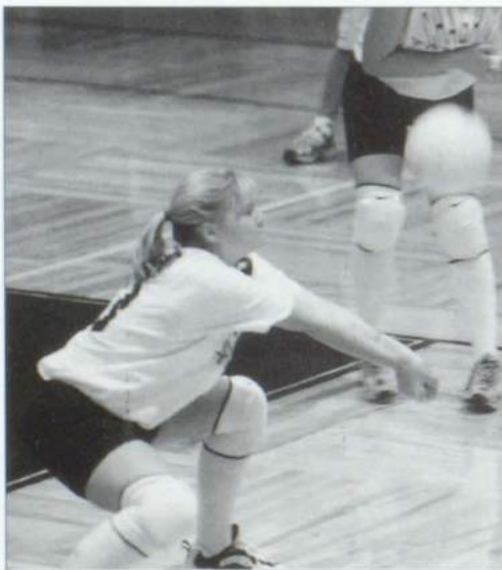

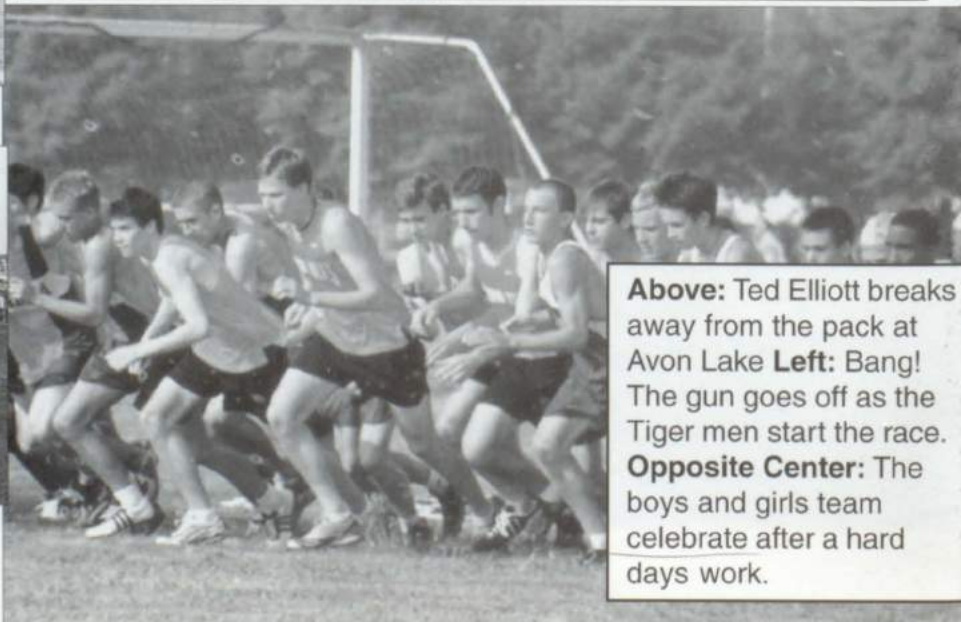

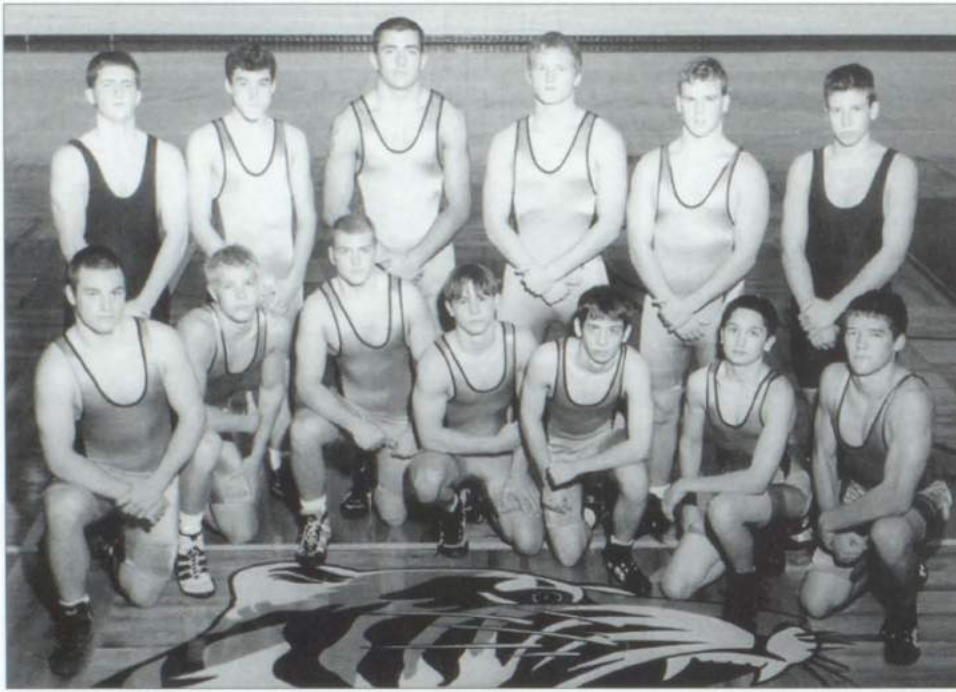

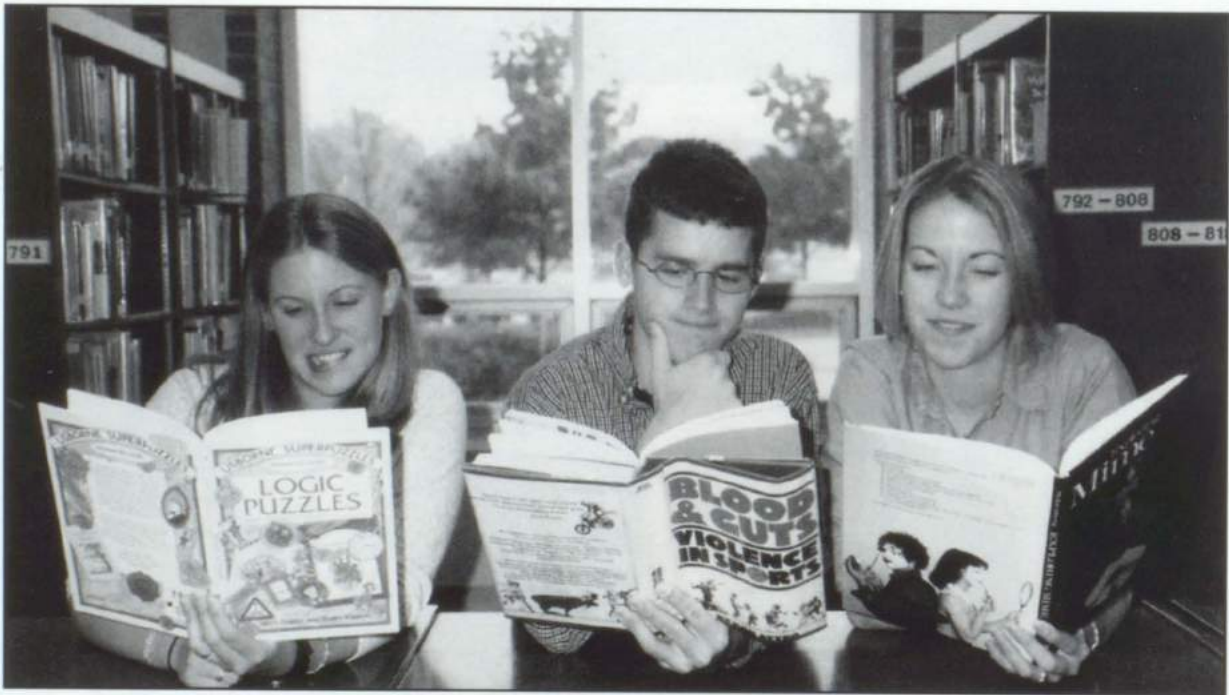


# Junior

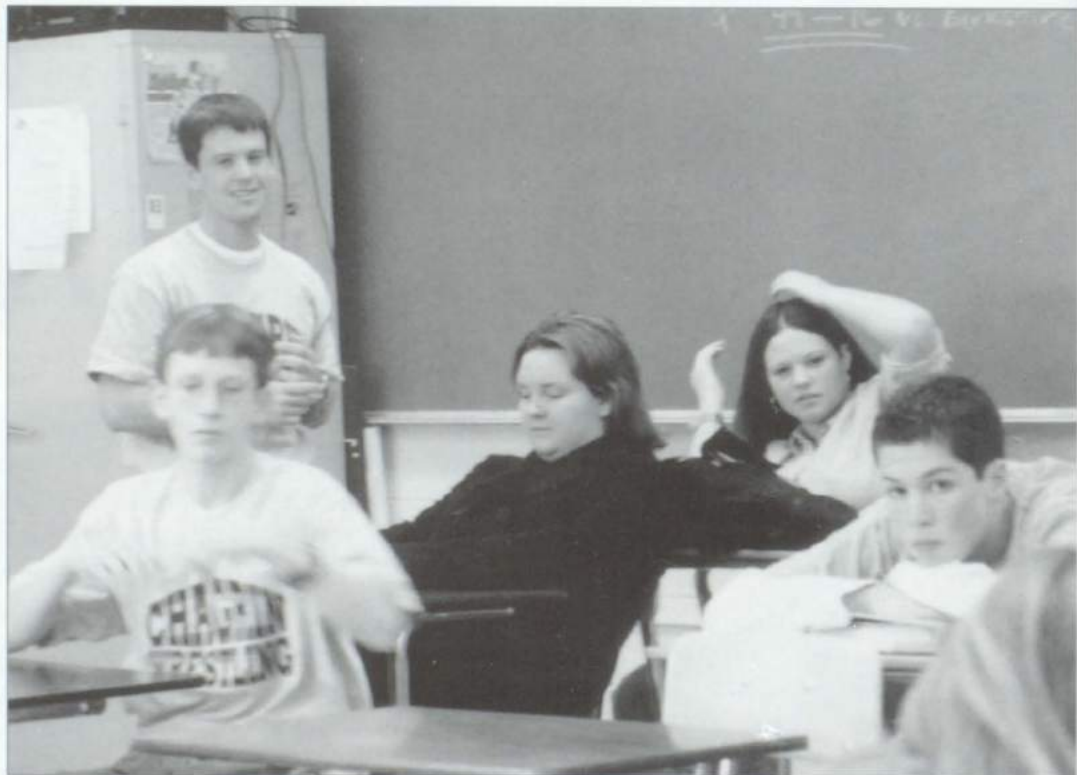

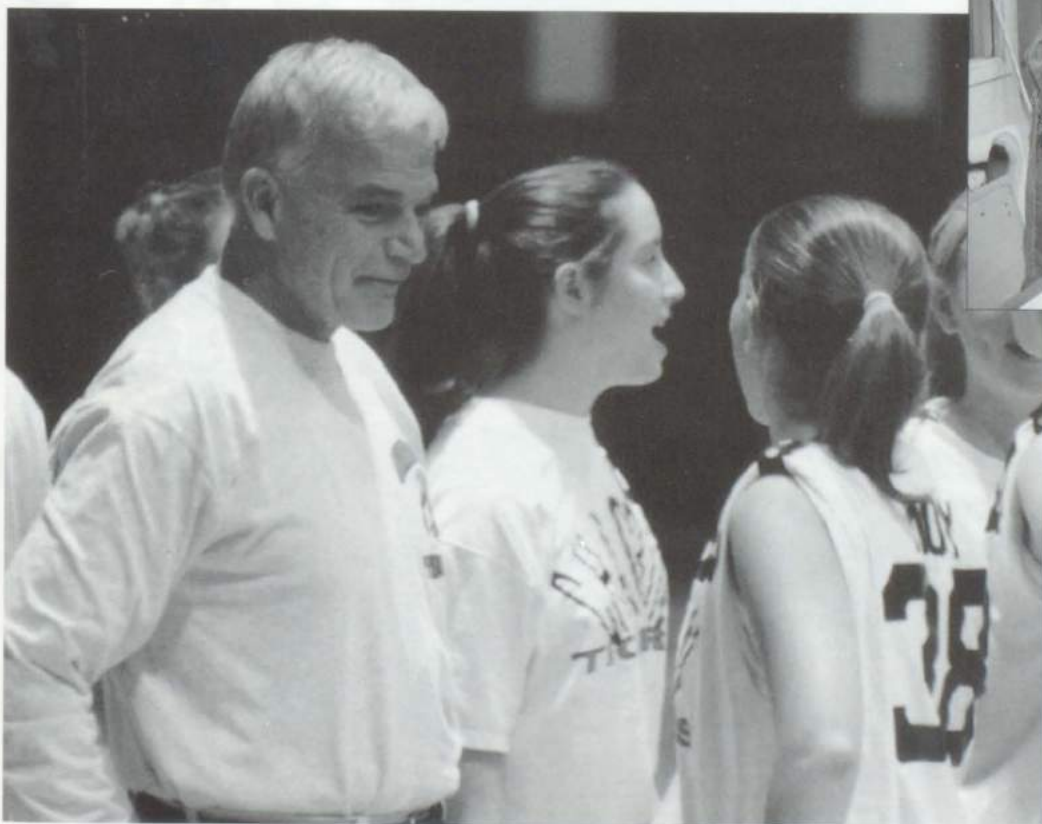
