The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The L.C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

## FARM CREDIT ADMINISTRATION

Note.—Under an Executive order promulgated by the President, Mar. 27, 1933, which order became effective May 27, the following existing agencies of the Federal Government, having to do solely with farm credits, were consolidated into a single agency to be known as the Farm Credit Administration: 1, Federal Farm Board; 2, Federal Farm Loan Bu-reau; 3, that portion of the functions of the Reconstruction Finance Corporations which has to do with the management of the 12 regional agricultural credit corporations and their branches; 4, Crop Production Loan Office and Seed Loan Office of the Agriculture Department. The chairman of the Federal Farm Board was continued in office as Gov-ernor of the Farm Credit Administration, and the Land Bank Commissioner, a member of the Federal Farm Loan Board (which was the executive head of the Federal Farm Loan Bureau), was continued in office subject to the jurisdiction of the Governor of the Farm Credit Administration. ### Topographic maps

Note.—The Geological Survey is making a series of topographic maps that will even-tually cover the whole United States, also Alaska and Hawaii. Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Hawaii, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, and West Virginia are completely mapped.
