- Everybody is talking bad about the Pangolin because it is supposed to have spread the coronavirus in China, but it is not the pangolins' fault: it is the humans' fault because they disturb them in the jungle and after they sell them on the market.
- The Malayan Pangolin lives in the jungles of West Malaysia and also Borneo. When they are scared, they roll into a ball to protect themselves : the ball is very strong because their skin is covered by scales.
- Malayan Pangolins are small : they measure around 40 to 65 cm and they don't weight more than 10 kg. They live at night and eat insects and fruits that drop on the soil.
- The pangolins are hunted for the skin, scales and meat: skin is used for clothes, scales to make jewels and meat is eaten by the people who live in the jungle.
- Because of that, they say that the pangolins are "critically endangered" (it means that they are almost extinct).
- **WHY DID I CHOOSE THE MALAYAN PANGOLIN ?**
- It's because it looks funny and also because people think that it caused the coronavirus in China, so I wanted to know more about it.

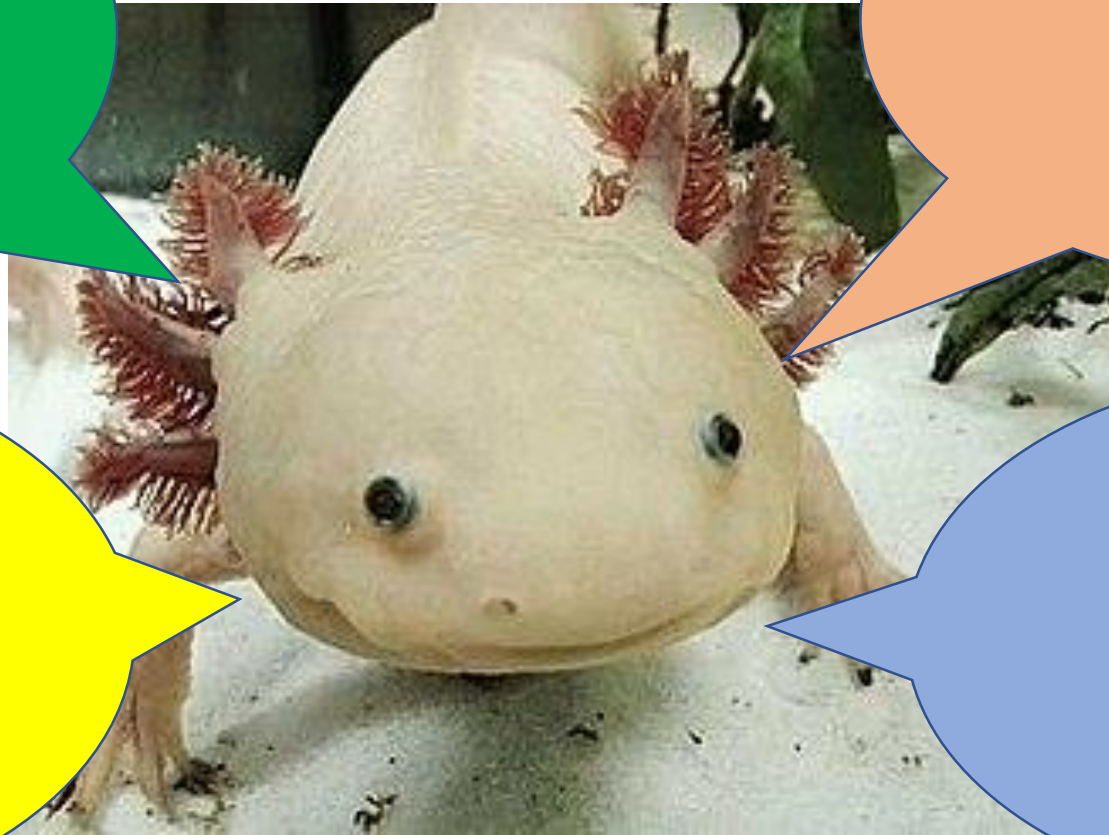

 If we want to save the *orangoutangs*, we need to cut less trees, like that they can eat and live normally.

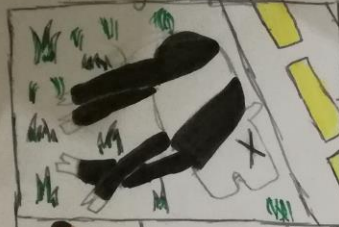
4) The result?

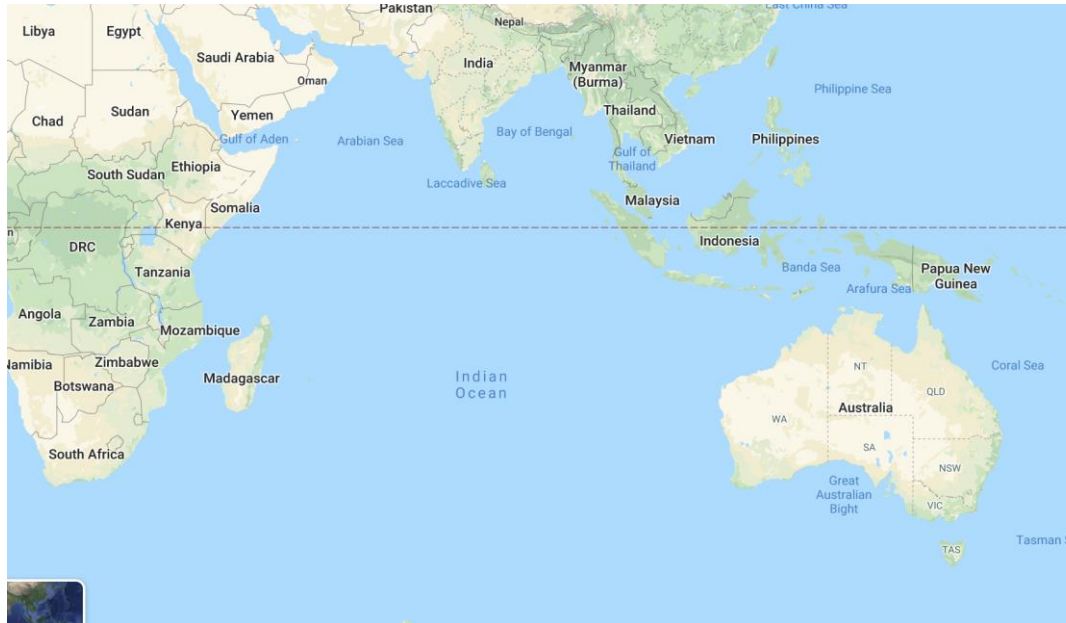
