P R E F A C E .

THE Genealogy of the PEABODY FAMILY was originally published in the New England Historical and Genealogical Register for April and October, 1848, and October, 1849, by the late C. M. ENDICOTT, Esq., of Salem, Mass., where it is stated that "he spared neither labor nor expense to make it as perfect and complete as possible. He consulted the early records of Towns, Parishes, Probate and Registry of Deeds. Nevertheless, from the imperfections of some records, and the conflicting and sometimes almost irreconcilable testimony of others, and sometimes from the want of any record at all, relying in such cases wholly upon traditionary evidence, which is frequently found more delusive than any other, such a memoir cannot be expected to be entirely free from trifling errors. By those only who are accustomed to such investigations can the difficulties to be encountered and overcome be rightly understood or appreciated." At the time of the publication, the limited number of copies was found insufficient to supply all who sought them, and the compiler, not expecting pecuniary compensation, did not continue it: hence the present attempt has been made to print another edition, with such additions and corrections as could be readily obtained; some of which have been made from the unpublished manuscripts of SAMUEL PEABODY, Esq., late of Andover, Mass., of the fruit of whose enthusiastic labors and extensive research the author (through the kindness of his widow, still living at Andover) has been allowed the fullest benefit.

It is hoped that a more complete compilation of both branches, to include later generations, will be continued at some time, and as a preliminary aid to this end a few blank pages have been appended for corrections and such family record as may be sought for by a future compiler, and in whose behalf it is respectfully requested that some one of the family in the several localities will officiate as genealogist.

EXPLANATION OF THE PLAN OF THIS WORK.

THE figures in parentheses on the left, indicate the number of the family; the Roman numerals, the generation. The descendants are doubly numbered; first in consecutive order, and secondly by each family separately. The figures in brackets after the name, refer back to these numbers of the descendants, indicating the family and connections to which the individual belongs; while the figures in parentheses on the right and against the name of a son, are the number of his family in the next generation.

The portions of the pages which are between the short lines or dashes are the sons of one family; and those between the longer dashes are grandchildren of one family.

The record in this edition includes the families of six generations, while a few names have been added of the seventh generation, which are printed in italics.

THE PEABODY FAMILY.

HISTORIC ORIGIN OF THE NAME.

THE ARMS ARE THUS DESCRIBED :

"Party per fess nebule, Gules, Azure ; two suns proper, with a garb ; a crest, scroll, and motto, 'Murus arcus conscientia sana,' borne by the name of Peabodie."

THIS name is said to have had its origin about the year 61, in the reign of Nero, the tyrant emperor, at which time the ancient Britons who were tribes of the more ancient Cambri, were in a state of vassalage to the emperor. Parsutagus, in the right of QUEEN BOADICEA his wife, was reigning king in Icena, Britain ; and hoping to secure his family and part of his immense estate, in his will he gave one half of the estate to Nero, but to no purpose ; for no sooner was the king dead than the officers of Nero seized every thing in their power. QUEEN BOADICEA being a woman of great abilities and valor, opposed these vile proceedings, for which Nero ordered her to be publicly whipped. This so enraged the Britons, that the queen revolted, and with the assistance of her kinsman, a patriarch in one of the tribes, named BOADIE, put herself at the head of the Britons, fought many desperate battles with various success, made a great massacre among the Romans, and would have expelled them, had not Suetonius Paulinus at the critical moment reinforced them with ten thousand fresh troops. The battle continued with great vigor, and the event was doubtful, till at last victory inclined in favor of the Romans, upon which the queen, who had behaved with surprising bravery, determined not to submit to the tyrant, despatched herself with poison, leaving BOADIE to his fate, who with his men sustained the horrid massacre, in a desperate manner selling their lives for a high price to the Romans, till their numbers were reduced to a few, when BOADIE, after avenging himself by killing Galbuta, a Roman officer, and taking his helmet and armor, with a remnant of Britons escaped and took asylum beyond the craggy mountains of Wales, whence they made frequent incursions upon their neighbors in the low country, the Romans having reduced a great part of the Island to a state of servitude. Upon this helmet and armor was a Roman badge of honor and dis-

tion, consisting of two suns proper in bordure. There was also a miniature likeness of the Empress Poppæa, wife of Nero. The Roman badge was sacredly preserved by the patriarchs of the name of BOADIE, as a trophy of honor. BOADIE, among the ancient Cambri, afterwards Britons, signified "Man," or "a great Man," and "Pea" signified a large hill or mountain, which afterwards occasioned this patriarch leader to be called and distinguished among the neighboring enemies by the name of PEABODIE, or MOUNTAIN-MAN. This tribe multiplied considerably; and some of them by tilling the land, a part of which was fertile, became very opulent; but most of them remained in a rude state. Some of them were herdsmen and kept cattle; others supported themselves by ranging the forest, &c., having many bloody conflicts with their neighbors, which often reduced their numbers and left them in great distress; until in the sixth century, when they were so far reduced that a compromise took place; after which they began to assimilate to their neighbors. In the reign of King Arthur, the kingdom being invaded by the northern Saxons and others, a leader or patriarch of one of the tribes by the name of Peabodie, a man of much influence and wealth, by his prowess and exertion in the battle on the river Douglass, aided much in expelling the invaders; and, having in his possession the trophy that had been taken from the Romans and carefully preserved by his ancestor, the reigning king, Arthur, as a reward for his unshaken fidelity and heroic valor, ordered it to be registered with additions, so as to stand as above stated to the name of PEABODIE. While some of the name and family kept the name of BOADIE, which with some was afterwards *anglicized*, whence the name of Mann; while others kept the name of PEA, which being also anglicized, some were called Hill, others Mont, and Mountain. Hence those names: and there are arms to each name, but not so ancient.—[*Extracted from Ancient Records*, Vol. II., Folio 327, No. 109, and *transferred to Modern Records*, Vol. II., Folio 65, No. 97.] Signed, ROBERT N. It may be observed that the orthography of this name, like that of many others, was in a transition state at that early period; although registered in the Heraldry Office in London as *Peabodie*, it underwent many changes. At the present day the spelling but partially shows the line of demarkation between the descendants of Francis, and those of the youngest son William, who is believed to be the ancestor of all the "Pabodies" in this country.

The record of John Paybody, father of Francis, is found with the Rhode Island branch of the family in another part of this work.

The following is the Massachusetts branch:—

FIRST GENERATION.

LIEUT. FRANCIS PEABODY, St. Albans, Hertfordshire, England, born 1614, came to New England in the ship Planter, Nicholas Trarice, Master, in 1635. His name is enrolled in the following copy of a certificate dated April 2, 1635, found in the Augmentation Office (so called) in Rolls Court, Westminster Hall, London, and published in the "Gleanings for New England History," in Mass. Hist. Coll., 3d series, Vol. VIII, p. 253. He is there called "Husbandman, 21 years" of age.

"Theis underwritten names are to be transported to New England, imbarqued in the Planter, Nicholas Trarice, Master, bound thither. The parties have brought certificate from the minister of Great St. Albans in Hertfordshire, and attestacons from the Justices of Peace, according to the Lords order."

Mr. Peabody, it appears, first resided at Ipswich, and in the summer of 1638 was one of the original settlers of Hampton, old Norfolk Co., whither he went with Rev. Stephen Bachilor, and twelve others, and where he resided for several years, often serving on the grand jury and jury for "tryalls." He was made a freeman in 1642, and in 1649 he was chosen by the town of Hampton one of the three men to "ende small causes," and was confirmed in that office by the Justices of that Court.

When the State lines were run, Hampton was found to be in Rockingham County, New Hampshire. "Being minded," as he said, "to live nearer Boston," he sold his estate in Hampton to Robert Drake, of Exeter, on the 25th of the 1st mo. (Mar.) 1650, consisting of a dwelling house and about 55 acres of land, for £25 13s., and must have taken up his residence in Topsfield almost immediately after, as we find in 1651, 3d mo. (May) 1st day, he owned a farm there, next to Richard Dorman's, also adjoining the farm of Mr. Symonds, part of whose lands he afterwards bought, as appears by his will.

We find him thus early permanently residing in Topsfield, in Essex County. He was one of the most prominent men of that town, both for property and enterprise; was a large landholder in Topsfield, Boxford and Rowley. Married Mary Foster. Lived to an advanced age; his will is dated Jan. 20, 1695, and proved August 7, 1698. Died Feb. 19, 1697-8. His widow died April 9, 1705. Among his descendants have been men eminent for piety, and distinguished for patriotism, literature, and science. His wife was dau. of Reginald Foster, or *Forster*, whose family is honorably mentioned in the "Lay of the Last Miunstrel," and in "Marmion." Children:—

"Here are deposited the remains of the Reverend OLIVER PEABODY, a man venerable for the faculties of his mind and for all needful learning. He delighted much in theological investigations. He discharged the pastoral office with great renown for thirty years;—ministering to the people of Natick, especially to the aborigines, in the cause of sacred learning. He was a model in social life. In benevolence and universal hospitality he was pre-eminent. In the firm expectation of a future retribution, he was called from his ministry on the 2d of February, A. D. 1752, aged 54 years." He married Hannah Baxter, daughter of Rev. Joseph Baxter, of Medfield, a lady distinguished for her piety and good sense. * GEORGE is the celebrated banker. The career of this gentleman has astonished the world. As a merchant and banker he has achieved wealth and reputation hardly equalled, and as a philanthropist his benefactions have no parallel in history.

He was a merchant first in Georgetown, D. C., then in Baltimore, with branch houses in Philadelphia, New York and London; and afterwards a banker in London.

Among his earlier public acts were hospitable entertainments, given in London for a series of years, with a view to cultivating sentiments of friendship and cordiality between citizens of the United States and England, which were attended by the nobility and most distinguished men of England and America, and recognized and patronized by the crown; the Duke of Wellington being present at one of them, and the Queen furnishing a portrait of herself to grace the occasion. These entertainments became justly celebrated, and were termed "International."

He rescued the credit of the State of Maryland when about to be sacrificed in a financial crisis, by volunteering, unsolicited, to meet its engagements to a large amount from his own means. He also contributed largely to several Arctic expeditions.

His pecuniary gifts have been immense. Besides giving to numerous relatives, to all whom his munificence could benefit, money which has made them affluent, he has given to public charities more than six millions of dollars. To benevolent institutions in his native State, about a million of dollars. Among others, for a public library in Danvers, his native town, \$50,000; for a public library in South Danvers, now embracing the place of his birth but at that time a part of Danvers, \$150,000; for a public library in Georgetown, the native place of his mother, \$12,000; to erect the "Memorial Church" at Georgetown, dedicated to the memory of his mother, and for the Society with which, in her youth, she worshipped, \$50,000; for a public library in Newburyport, where he lived a short time in his youth, \$15,000; to Harvard College, \$150,000; to the Essex Institute at Salem, \$140,000; to Phillips Academy (Andover), \$25,000; to the Natural History Society of Boston, \$20,000; also to Yale College, \$150,000. He gave to the City of Baltimore, Md., \$1,000,000; for education in the Southern United States, \$2,100,000; to the poor of the City of London, £250,000 sterling. The Queen of England acknowledged his "more than princely munificence to her poor subjects," in an autograph letter; offered him a title of nobility, or the Grand Cross of the Order of the Bath, and presented him a portrait of herself, of most elaborate art and exquisite beauty.

THE following advertisement, which is copied from the Boston Gazette and News-Letter of Sept. 20, 1762, shows that Capt. Francis Peabody (34) IV., probably went to the St. John River in the spring of 1763, rather than 1764 as mentioned in the account of him on page 14.

“These are to give notice to the signers under Capt. Francis Peabody for a township at St. Johns river in Nova Scotia, that they meet at the house of Mr. Daniell Ingalls inholder in Andover on Wednesday the 6th day of October next at 1 o'clock P.M., in order to Draw their lots which are already laid out, and to choose an agent to go to Halifax in their behalf, and also to do any matters and things that shall be thought proper by them. And whereas it was Voted at their Meeting April 6th, 1762, that each signer should by April 20th pay twelve shillings to defray the charges for laying out their lands, and six shillings for building a mill thereon, And as some of the signers have neglected payment, they must pay the amount at the next meeting, or be excluded and others admitted in their place.

RELICS.

“OUR ancestors, when they left their native shores, brought away with them all such weapons as were in most general use in England at that period; and among others was the *halbard* or *halbert*. It is said to be derived from the German *hallebaert*, signifying an axe. It was introduced into Scotland by the Danes, and carried by them on the left shoulder, and was in common use in the army during the reign of Charles I., and borne by sergeants of foot and artillery. It consisted of a staff about five feet long, with a steel head partly in the form of a crescent, and must have been a formidable instrument when wielded by a skilful hand.

“Lient. Francis Peabody at his death left his homestead, with all his goods and chattels it contained, to his fourth son Isaac, and among them was this halberd; and as Isaac's son [42—3] never married, it fell to his brother Matthew, and through Matthew's son and grandson John to Dea. Joel R. Peabody of Topsfield, of whom it was obtained by its present owner, Francis Peabody, Esq., of Salem, Mass., who is also a descendant of the fourth son Isaac.”

THE WILL OF LT. FRANCIS PEABODY.

[As copied by the late C. M. ENDICOTT.]

The last will and testament of Francis Pebody of Topsfield, in y^e county of Essex in New England: I, Francis Pebody, taking into consideration the uncertainty of my life and y^e certainty of my death, being of perfect understanding and memory, have seen good to make such a disposall of the temporall estate which God of his grace hath given me in this world, as follows:—

- Impr.* I committ my immortall soul into the hands of God, and my body to a decent buriall when God shall take me out of this world.
- Secundo.* I give to my son John Pebody and Joseph Peabody all that tract of land which I bought of merchant Joseph Juett of Rowley, which land lyeth in Boxford. I give to my son John two thirds of y^e aforesaid tract of land, and to my son Joseph y^e other third, which I do give to them and their heirs forever; and moreover I do give to them both in current pay (not mony) five pounds to each of them, y^t is five pounds apiece; besides what I have already given them.
- Item.* I do give to my son William Pebody all that land which I bought of John Tod Sen^r of Rowly and of John Perley (excepting one hundred acres) which land I do give to him and his heirs forever; moreover I do give to him five pounds besides what he hath had of me already, which I do the rather on the consideration of his being (by y^e providence of God) deprived of the use of one of his arms, wth five pounds is to be paid as is above specified.
- Item.* I do give to my son in law Daniell Wood* that hundred acres of land which is above excepted to my son William and is already in part possessed by my son in law Daniel Wood, which said land I do give to him and his heirs forever, it being in consideration of what I was obliged to do for him when come to age, and provided y^t he shall be satisfied therewith on y^t account, and give a discharge thereof to such as it shall concern; which land I have already promised, and do purpose forthwith to make him a deed of in a way of firm conveyance, in which deed I shall bound and limit y^e aforesaid hundred acres accordingly.
- Item.* I do give to my son Isaac Pebody all the land y^t I do now live upon which I bought of Mr. Simonds; and my will is y^t my son

Isaac shall have all y^e said land which lyeth on y^e south side of y^e brook running through the said farm, both upland and meadow so bounded. I give to my son Isaac Pebody, together wth my dwelling house and housing, orchard, mill, and mill-yard, wth all y^t I bought of William Evens; and moreover I give to my son Isaac from the bridge all y^e meadow downward on y^e northeast side of y^e brook w^{ch} runneth through Tho. Dorman's meadow; as also I do give to my son Isaac a rod and half of upland adjoining to y^e aforesaid meadow all along for y^e bringing of his hay from time to time, w^{ch} aforesaid land I do give to my son Isaac and his heirs forever, together wth Twenty acres of land on y^e south side of y^e river, near to y^e dwelling of Joseph Toun jun^r. Also I give to my son Isaac that bed with the furniture thereunto belonging which he now hath y^e improvement of, and this I would have noted, that I have given the more to my son Isaac on consideration of y^e providence of God disabling him by y^e loss of one of his leggs.

Item. I do give to my grandchild Jacob Pebody (y^e son of my son Jacob deceased) y^e house which his father dwelt in, together with all y^e upland on y^t side of y^e brook y^t is on y^e north side of y^e abovesaid brook, as also all the meadow on y^e same side of y^e brook from y^e bridge and so upward; my will is y^t in case my said grandchild Jacob Pebody do live to y^e age of twenty one years, y^t then he shall have as is abovesaid to injoy himself and his heirs forever. But in case y^e said Jacob live not to y^t age, y^t then any of my other sons shall have liberty to have the land and house abovesaid, provided y^t he or they shall pay unto my grandchildren Kesia and Mercy Pebody, y^e children of my son Jacob deceased, an hundred and twenty pounds in common current money (not silver) notwithstanding what is above said in case y^e said Jacob should have issue before he should arrive at y^e aforesaid age, y^t y^e said land shall be at ye dispose of y^e said Jacob Pebody, together wth y^e house aforesaid. Also I do give to my grandchildren Kesia and Mary Pebody, y^e children of my son Jacob deceased, I do give to each of them thirty acres of land apiece, provided they shall live to y^e age of eighteen years; which threescore acres of land lyeth on y^e south side of y^e river, in y^e southwest division beyond Mr. Endicott's farm, in y^e place called the stickey meadow, which land abovesaid I bought part of deacon Tho. Perkins about thirty acres, and about thirty more which I bought of Daniell Dorman; but in case y^t neither of y^e children Kesia or Mercy shall live to the age of eighteen, y^t then y^e abovesaid thirty acres apiece shall return to my next and immediate children to be equally divided amongst them; and in case one of the said grandchildren live to y^t age and not y^e other, that then y^e whole threescore acres shall fall to y^e survivor of them.

Item. I do give to my son Nathaniell Pebody, together with my grandchild Samson How, ail that four hundred acres which I bought of Mr. Stephen Sewell, lying in Rowley village now called Boxford, which land lyeth near Bradford, and was formerly Mr. Nelson's of Rowly. My will is that my son Nathaniell shall have three hundred and Sampson How y^e other hundred acres, which for quantity and quality y^e aforesaid Samson How shall have y^e said hundred acres, provided y^t y^e said Samson How shall be at my dispose till y^e age of twenty-one years. But in case my son Nath^l shall

dye without lawfull issue, that then the abovesaid three hundred acres shall fall to my other children by equal division, his widow notwithstanding enjoying the benefit thereof during life; and as to his moveable estate which he is already in possession of, I leave it all to be at his, y^t is, my son Nathaniell's dispose; here it is to be understood y^t what shall be left undisposed of by my son Nathaniell at his death of his three hundred acres shall be for y^e use of his widdow during her life as is above said, y^t is y^e life of her widdowhood.

Item. I do reserve for Mary my wife y^e south end of my house for her use to live in, as also y^e new cellar, as also y^e use of two milch cows which she shall choose out of my milch kine. Also my will is y^t my son Isaac shall pay to my wife Mary yearly twenty bushels of Indian corn, four bushels of wheat, four of rye and six of malt; also y^t my wife have liberty to keep two or three swine, as also yearly half a duzen pounds of wool; also my will is y^t my wife shall have pasture for her cows with my son Isaac's, as also y^t my son Isaac shall provide fodder for them in y^e winter: as also y^t my wife shall have liberty for an horse to ride on as she shall have occasion. Also my will is y^t in case my wife shall marry again, y^t then all y^e priviledges abovesaid shall cease, but during her widdowhood she shall also have (as benefit by my orchard) yearly a barrell of cider, as also sour apples as her occasions either in the summer or winter shall require. Moreover my wife shall have y^e use and dispose of two beds, together with needful fire wood provided her, for which end she shall have y^e use of such of my oxen as shall be needful. Also I do order y^t Samson How shall live with my wife till he come to y^e age of twenty-one years, and be at her command to be helpfull to her on all accounts as she shall have occasion; and in case Samson How shall be taken away by his father before he shall have served as aforesaid, y^t then my said wife shall have that hundred acres of land abovesaid (given conditionally to y^e said Samson) to provide for herself such help as shall be necessary: and in case my wife shall dy before y^e said Samson How shall arrive at y^e aforesaid term of years, y^t then he shall be at my wife's dispose to whom she shall see good, and in case y^e said Samson will not comply with such dispose, y^t then y^e said hundred acres of land intended for him shall be at my wives dispose.

Item. I give to my daughter Lydia Perley five pounds, besides what she hath already had of me.

Item. I do give to my daughter Mary Death five pounds besides what she hath had already.

Item. I do give to my daughter Sarah How five pounds besides what she hath had already.

Item. I do give to my daughter Hepsibah Ray five pounds besides what she hath had already:—all which legacies ordered to my children I do appoint to be paid in common current pay as is before specified to others of my children. Note y^t what legacies I do here give in my will shall be paid by my executors out of my estate which I do leave in my son Isaac hands and my wives, as corn or cattell &c., my debts and funerall expences being discharged.

And finally, I do appoint, constitute and ordain my wife Mary to be an executrix together with my son John and Isaac Pebody as execu-

tors of this my last will and testament ; and in case, after legacies are paid there be any estate left to be divided, y^t it shall be disposed of in a way of division as my executrix together with executors shall see good.

That what is here above written is y^e last will and testament of y^e abovesaid Francis Pebody, appears by his own hand and seal y^e day and date here mentioned, as also by y^e testimony of y^e witnesses hereunto subscribed.

The abovesaid premises were signed, sealed and declared to be y^e last will and testament of y^e said Francis Pebody, y^e twentieth day of January in y^e year of our Lord one thousand six hundred ninety and five or six, in presence of us,

It is to be noted y^t notwithstanding what is abovesaid concerning my son Nathaniel's three hundred acres returning to his brethren in case of his dying w^hout lawfull issue, it is to be understood by y^e three hundred acres, what he shall not see cause to dispose of before his death, I hereby, notwithstanding what hath been said giving him full power, in case he see good, to dispose of it either in part or whole, not knowing but divine providence may necessitate him thereunto ; otherwise what is above written to be of full force as is expressed.

THE PAYBODY FAMILY.

[Referred to as the Rhode Island Branch.]

COLLECTED BY B. FRANK PABODIE.

JOHN PAYBODY, who, as far as can be ascertained, is the progenitor of all of that name in this country, however varied the name may be from the original orthography, is supposed to have emigrated to New England in or near the year 1635.

It is most probable, by the absence of his name from the list of passengers, that he did not come in the same vessel with his son Francis, but at some other time, and most likely with his youngest son William, as we find them named together in the list of the original proprietors of Plymouth. In 1637 John was the owner of ten acres of land at Bluefish; he was admitted freeman January 2, 1637-8, and with William, was named as one of the original proprietors of Bridgewater in 1645. His will is dated July 15, 1649; he died about 1666.

I would say that in the record, as here printed, I shall notice but few incidents in the lives of those named, except the births, marriages and deaths. But in a fuller and more extended genealogy of the descendants of William, upon which I am now engaged, and which I hope to publish hereafter, I shall strive to incorporate all such facts in the history of the Pabodies as may be interesting to their descendants. I shall be very thankful if all those who are descended from the Pabodies named below will forward to me such facts in their family history as they may deem worthy of publication. I would also request, if there are any of the name of Pabodie, Peabodie or Peabody, into whose hands this may fall, who may not be able to connect themselves with any of the Peabodys named in the preceding genealogy, that they would communicate with me, giving all the names and dates of their family records which they can obtain, as I shall thus be enabled to complete the record of many branches of the family which I now have in an unfinished state, and shall be able to prepare, for those who desire it, a complete record of the past history of our family, which each one can hereafter extend at his pleasure.

I have followed the plan adopted by Mr. Endicott in his original genealogy of the Peabodys, in numbering the various generations.

JOHN PAYBODY, b. in England about 1590; d. at Bridgewater about 1667. Married Isabel —, who survived him. Children:

(2) I. WILLIAM PAYBODY, b. in England 1619-20; d. in Little Compton, Dec. 3, 1707. Married Dec. 26, 1644, Elizabeth Alden, b. 1624-5, d. May 31, 1717. He settled at Plymouth with his father, afterwards removed to Duxbury, where he held many offices of trust and responsibility, and was generally much employed in public affairs. He owned considerable land in Duxbury; was one of those to whom Bridgewater was set off in 1645; was one of the first proprietors of Freetown in 1659, and was also one of the original purchasers of Sakonet, or Little Compton, in 1675, whither he removed with his family about 1684.

His wife Elizabeth was the third child and eldest daughter of John Alden and Priscilla Mullins, the story of whose marriage is so happily described in Longfellow's "Courtship of Miles Standish." Elizabeth is said to have been the first female child born after the landing of the Pilgrims. Her death is thus recorded in the Boston Newsletter, June 17, 1717. "Little Compton, 31 May. This morning died here Mrs. Elizabeth Paybody, late wife of Mr. William Paybody, in the 93d year of her age. She was daughter of John Alden, Esq., and Priscilla his wife, daughter of Mr. Wm. Mullins. This John Alden and Priscilla Mullins were married at Plymouth in New England, where their daughter Elizabeth was born. She was exemplarily virtuous and pious, and her memory is blessed. Her grand-daughter Bradford is a grandmother."

The next one to be recorded, and the last in the third generation, would be (7) Benjamin (22—9), the son of William by his second marriage. We should be glad to find an account of any descendants of his, as it might aid us in unravelling the entanglements by which we find the record of the Newport Peabodys surrounded, whom we can connect neither with the family which we are tracing nor with that chronicled by Mr. Endicott. But the circumstances surrounding his birth, and the death of his mother so soon after it (only three weeks), induce us to believe that he died an infant.

blessed for it, doe ordain and make this my last Will and Testament,

Imprimis. I bequeathe my soule to God who gaue it, hoping to be
saved by the Merritt of Christ my blessed Saviour and Redeemer,
as for my Worldly goods as followeth ;

Item. I giue and bequeath unto Thomas my eldest Sonne one Shil-
ling.

Item. I giue and bequeath unto Francis Paybody my second son one
shilling.

Item. I giue unto William Pabody my youngest son one shilling.

Item. I giue and bequeath unto John Rouse, the Son of John Rouse,
my lands att Carswell in Marshfield after my wifes decease.

Item. I giue unto John Paybody, the son of William, my lott of land
att the new plantation.

Item. I giue and bequeath all the rest of my goods that are knowne
to be mine, leaving a Dead unto my wife Isabell Paybody whom I
make my sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament.

Memorandum. All these legacies before set down are to be payed
by William Paybody my youngest son, when they shall be demanded.
