WITH SPA MEET IN THE **BALANCE, NYRA ARGUES** FOR UPHOLDING **BAFFERT'S BAN**

With a July 12 federal court date looming to decide whether or not Bob Baffert's history of equine drug positives will keep him from entering horses at the upcoming and financially lucrative Saratoga Race Course meet, the New York Racing Association (NYRA) on June 30 filed a memorandum of law that opposes the Hall of Fame trainer's request for an injunction to lift the association's ban against him that has been in effect for the past six weeks.

NYRA told Baffert via letter May 17 that he was temporarily not welcome to stable or race at the association's three tracks (Saratoga, Belmont Park and Aqueduct Racetrack) in the wake of his shifting explanations after Medina Spirit (Protonico) tested positive for betamethasone after winning the GI Kentucky Derby. The initial drug positive was confirmed by split-sample testing at a separate lab approved by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission.

No ruling has yet been issued over those findings, and NYRA explained to Baffert in that letter that a more precise determination regarding the length and terms of his suspension would be based on information revealed during the course of the ongoing investigation in Kentucky. Cont. p3

MEAH ADDING HORSEPOWER TO CHROME FINISH

She's still only 28, and it isn't three years since she started training. Yet a first graded stakes success for Anna Meah last weekend was welcomed with a depth of perspective extending both forward and back.


On the one hand, she has always been a woman in a hurry: however crammed the automobile she drove south from Washington in December 2012, her heart set on finding a backstretch job in California, the years since have been no less packed with experience. Indeed, the veteran trainer of a small string at Hollywood Park who hired Meah as assistant the following April also launched another career that very same month: a Cal-bred chestnut by Lucky Pulpit, named California Chrome. 

On June 14, Baffert filed a civil complaint against NYRA, alleging that the association's ban violates his Fourteenth Amendment constitutional right to due process.

In the June 30 filing in United States District Court (Eastern District of New York), attorneys for NYRA wrote that the association believed it had to act swiftly to bar Baffert, lest his presence jeopardize the integrity and reputation of the GI Belmont S., the third jewel of the Triple Crown and the premier race of the year in New York.

"Plaintiff is a well-known Thoroughbred trainer, whose horses have won numerous significant races," the filing stated. "But, over the course of Plaintiff's career, his horses have been cited for drug-related violations at least 30 times. In fact, over the 12 months preceding this year's Kentucky Derby, Plaintiff has been fined four times for drug-related violations."

Two of those violations were for lidocaine, one was for dextrorphan, and another, like in Medina Spirit, also for betamethasone. Three of Baffert's five most recent drug positives came in Grade I stakes--the Arkansas Derby and Kentucky Oaks in 2020, plus the 2021 Kentucky Derby. The two findings at marquee events at Churchill Downs led the gaming corporation that owns the track to bar Baffert from the entire family of Churchill-affiliated tracks for a period of two years.

The NYRA filing continued: "Although Plaintiff did not then have any horses entered in races or stabled at [NYRA tracks], it was likely, if not certain, that Plaintiff would attempt to enter Medina Spirit in the Belmont scheduled for June 5, 2021...

"Given Plaintiff's history of drug-related violations, Medina Spirit's positive test, Plaintiff's contradictory statements, Plaintiff's [then-temporary] suspension from Churchill Downs, and the fact that the Belmont was fast approaching, NYRA took the only sensible action under the circumstances--it temporarily suspended Plaintiff from entering and stabling horses at its Racetracks." **Cont. p4**

The filing also pointed out that the May 17 letter had advised Baffert that if he wished to present to NYRA any information or arguments that might make the association reconsider its ban, he had seven business days in which to do so.

Yet according to NYRA, "Plaintiff never availed himself of this opportunity to be heard or raise any objection with NYRA. Instead, nearly a month after NYRA imposed the temporary suspension, Plaintiff commenced this action...and now moves for a preliminary injunction."

The NYRA filing outlined three chief legal reasons against granting Baffert the court ruling he seeks to resume racing at NYRA tracks:

"First, Plaintiff fails to demonstrate that he will suffer irreparable injury in the absence of emergency relief. Rather than allege any actual or imminent injury or irreparable harm warranting a preliminary injunction, Plaintiff offers only conclusory assertions of potential harm, speculates that he may lose unidentified clients if the suspension is not lifted, and fails to submit any evidence demonstrating that the speculative loss of clients would substantially damage his business.

"Even if the Court were to consider Plaintiff's potential client loss, such an injury could be remedied through money damages, rendering preliminary injunctive relief inappropriate. Furthermore, Plaintiff's nearly month-long delay in seeking this preliminary injunction undercuts the sense of urgency needed to remedy his alleged harm.

"Second, Plaintiff fails to establish that he is likely to succeed on the merits of his claims. Contrary to Plaintiff's unsupported assertion that NYRA could not temporarily suspend Plaintiff from its Racetracks because it does not own the grounds on which they are located, settled law holds that NYRA had both the common law and regulatory right to exclude anyone, including a licensed trainer, who engages in conduct detrimental to the best interests of racing. **Cont. p5**

"Moreover, Plaintiff's assertion that NYRA violated his due process rights is incorrect. NYRA was not required to provide Plaintiff an opportunity to be heard before issuing a temporary suspension because NYRA's decision was based on probable cause that Plaintiff's actions warranted suspension and was necessary to protect the safety of the racehorses and their riders.... Plaintiff also fails to allege facts sufficient to show that he is likely to prove that NYRA's temporary suspension of Plaintiff was 'state action'--as required to implicate due process concerns.

"Third, the public interest and balance of equities weigh clearly in favor of NYRA. NYRA is obligated to protect its investment, brand and reputation, and supervise activities at its Racetracks in a manner that fosters the public's confidence in the safety and honesty of the sport.

"Plaintiff's speculative assertions that his business might suffer or that his temporary suspension could last for a significant period of time cannot override NYRA's compelling interests in upholding the integrity of horse racing... Accordingly, Plaintiff's motion for a preliminary injunction should be denied."

W. Craig Robertson, an attorney representing Baffert in this case, did not reply to an emailed request for comment on Wednesday.



Even since starting to train, however, Meah has been through enough--a terrifying trackwork smash, for one thing, not to mention a barn reboot in Kentucky on the very eve of a global pandemic--to view the success of Abby Hatcher (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) in the GIII Chicago S. at Arlington as a boost to the morale of her small, dedicated team, but otherwise only as a first milestone on what remains a long and challenging road ahead.


"When I started training, I had some funny luck," she says. "I don't want to say bad luck, because I know things can always be worse. But, yeah, funny luck. I thought I had my first winner in a stakes race at Del Mar. What a fairytale that would have been! But he was disqualified. It was one of those that could have gone either way, depending who you asked, but they took him down.

"Between starting out that October, and the end of the year, I had 16 runners. Eight finished second. I was thinking, 'Man, this horse-training business is not all I was hoping... Am I ever going to win a race?' That was a humbling experience--but it's also how this whole game is. So, yes, winning my first graded stakes felt amazing, and nothing will take that away. But at the same time, it's a reminder to stay humble. There's still so much to be done, so many goals to accomplish."

As such, Meah has found nearly as much satisfaction in the less conspicuous breakthroughs that assure her, in quiet increments, that she's heading the right way.

"I don't know what it was about June, but we hit a ton of milestones," she notes. "We finally won first time off a claim, having bumped up from \$30,000 claimer to maiden special weight; then the following week we won with a first-time starter, also for the first time; and I believe Jungle Juice (Ire) (Bungle Inthejungle {GB}) [a Churchill optional allowance winner last week] is the first to win three times for me. And then of course the graded stakes." **Cont. p7**

Meah continued, "So we had a huge month. We're not a huge crew,but the staff work so hard, some of them traveled across the country to stay with me, and I'm so thankful to them. It's been really rewarding for everyone."

That migration from California, early last year, was a huge decision so early in Meah's training career. Logically, there was no point bringing her Cal-breds. Leaving them behind, however, reduced the string to 11. But she now has 27 in the barn, and was able to build up support even after the shock that awaited her in Lexington.

"I have a lot of clients along the East Coast that were very supportive of the idea," she explains. "California was undergoing a bit of scrutiny at the time, and not many people wanted to send horses there. That was sad to see, I'd had a great run out there, but for a young trainer getting started, it was really hard to give it an honest go. You could enter a horse and if the race didn't fill you might be looking at another month. We have so many more options here.

"But yes, it was a bit alarming to move our stable from Santa Anita to Keeneland and be told, after our first day training, that they were cancelling the meet. 'What have I done?' I said. 'I've shipped my horses all this way for one day of training!' Obviously I soon saw that this wasn't a Kentucky problem,but a global one. And we made do with what we had. We shipped over to Oklahoma and won a race, for instance. But even during the pandemic,I was given a chance by a lot of new people, which just goes to show how Kentucky has helped my business thrive."

That Oklahoma winner, at Will Rogers Downs, was very dear to Meah. For it was Vallestina (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) she was riding round Santa Anita one morning in June 2019 when the pair of them were badly lacerated in a freak accident. The vets candidly doubted whether Vallestina would make it. "But long story short, she ended up pulling through," Meah says. "And she not only came back and won at Santa Anita,but also became the first to win for me after we moved out here. It's been a bit of a fairy tale--she has just had her first foal by Midnight Storm, and the plan would be to bring him into training someday--so let's hope it keeps panning out that way."

After that horrible drama, Meah reluctantly acknowledged that it was neither sensible nor necessary to continue riding trackwork herself. So began a new chapter in her relationship with the horse, which had first evolved in a backwater of Thoroughbred racing--Meah was born in Oregon and raised in Washington--and initially devoted her time to rodeos. Her ultimate vocation would only gradually come into focus.

In adolescence, she began shadowing Dr. Solomon Benneroch, the veterinarian who tended her rodeo mounts, but also had clients with a Quarter Horse barn. "I begged them for a job for two years," Meah recalls. "I just bugged them until they finally called and said, okay, this summer." She went on to study Animal Science at Montana State, but her real education would come in grooming and exercising at places like Portland Meadows, Emerald Downs and Grants Pass. A world away from Keeneland--her current base, though she's excited to be moving back into a renovated barn at Kentucky's Thoroughbred Center in October--but a perfect environment to learn the nuances of equine care.

"Working at those smaller racetracks, you learned a lot about what you can and can't do with horses," she says. "It was exciting to be a part of it, and I'm glad I was. You could really build a foundation that way, and I feel that's so important for everything in life."

The graduation ceremony awaited in the new, life-changing journey Meah began in tandem with California Chrome. Her four years with Art Sherman would span two Horse of the Year campaigns.

"Honestly, I have been so blessed," she reflects. "Coming into this game, and landing that job with Art, and becoming part of Chrome's entire career. The Shermans are still like family to me, to this day. They were the first people to really take me under their wing. And Art is one special horseman. Chrome wasn't a difficult horse--very sound, great mind--but Art is such a wonderful person, and loves his horses so much, I know he did everything right by that horse and gave him the very best opportunity to succeed. Maybe in some bigger barns, little things may have been overlooked. Every small detail needs to come together to make big things happen."

Just as when she had first cut her teeth on the racetrack, however, Meah feels that she learned as much from the lesser horses.

"Art trusted me to run the barn when he wasn't there," she explains. "At the time, I felt I was missing out on the fun a little, like when Chrome went out to Dubai for three months. But with a 12-hour time difference I couldn't call about every little issue. I had to figure things out."

Nonetheless Meah was also privileged to have a regular, hands-on connection with the champion.

"I breezed Chrome all the way into most of his races, unless of course Victor [Espinoza] was out for it," she says. "That was quite an adrenaline rush. It's not anything I could put into words. I just let him do his thing, he knew what he needed to do and how to do it, but the way he traveled, the way he covered the ground, he just had so much class about him. And it's not like his pedigree was outstanding: he just had such a big heart." That elusive grail, so hard to identify, remains ever in mind when stocking her own barn from limited resources. Likewise for husband David, as a bloodstock agent whose transatlantic partnership with Jamie Lloyd often targets horses off the track in Ireland or his native Britain. David has also had a fertile association with Richard Baltas, with whom Meah rounded off her apprenticeship after the retirement of California Chrome.

"Baltas probably had over 100 horses," she recalls. "So it was a totally different experience, and more demanding, both physically and in terms of time. More runners, more problems. Again, he trusted me, for instance to travel east with horses like Gas Station Sushi (Into Mischief). She was such a star to deal with, and that was also how I really fell in love with Kentucky as Horse Country."

David--who bought that filly, winner of the GIII Beaumont S., as a 2-year-old--can these days sometimes encourage clientele toward his wife's barn and indeed heads up the partnership that races Abby Hatcher, herself an Irish import.

"We'd actually been eyeing that race for a long time," Meah says. "As you know, in horse racing things rarely go to plan, but for once everything worked out. We thought we'd be happy just to get her some black-type, but to actually go up there and win was unbelievable. When she first came over here, I put some works into her and knew she had ability. But then I turned her out, gave her a bit of time to adjust and be a horse for a while. And that has really paid off. David has provided me with a bunch of horses from Europe that I've had success with, so it's really nice to have his support and his eye."

Her first debt, however, remains to parents with zero horse connection who nonetheless indulged their daughter's obsession. "Rodeo was obviously very different, though maybe suggested that I have a very strong competitive edge!" Meah says. *Cont. p9*

Meah continued, "It was every weekend, so I'm very thankful that I was sometimes allowed out of school early, or to miss a day for traveling. I always knew I wanted to spend the rest of my life with horses. But I didn't come into this business with the mentality that I wanted to be trainer. It's just how the stepping stones laid out until it became a no-brainer not to give it a try.

"I did try to make sure I had that foundation before branching out. I didn't want to start out with two or three horses, with me as owner, and piece things together as I went along. I had people ready to give me a chance. I don't run into too many young trainers, male or female, and I feel there are plenty of people out there who want a trainer that's young and hungry. I have put in a ton of work, but a lot of people do the same without having a graded success so early in their career. So when all that work pays off like this, I do feel very blessed."

AMENDMENT BANNING TRANSPORTATION OF HORSES FOR SLAUGHTER PASSES HOUSE

An amendment that would ban the transportation of horses across state lines or to Canada or Mexico for slaughter for human consumption passed the U.S. House of Representatives Thursday. The amendment is part of the Investing in a New Vision for the Environment and Surface Transportation in America (INVEST) Act, bipartisan legislation supported by President Joe Biden that now moves to the Senate for consideration.

The amendment, which would effectively ban horse slaughter in the United States if it becomes law, was sponsored in the House of Representatives by Troy Carter (D-LA), Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA) and John Katko (R-NY) and was supported by a number of U.S. Thoroughbred industry organizations, including the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA). In a press release, the NTRA said it will advocate for the inclusion of the amendment as part of any final infrastructure bill passed by Congress.



Canadian Horse of the Year Mighty Heart scored his first graded victory Thursday in Woodbine's Dominion Day S. Installed as the second choice behind March to the Arch, the one-eyed colt seized the early advantage, loping through a :25.23 opening quarter. The chalk turned up the heat a bit through a half in :48.49 and drew even with Mighty Heart approaching the far turn. Turning back that foe in the lane, Mighty Heart kept on finding to hold that determined foe at bay by 1 3/4 lengths.

"I thought [the Blame S.] just put him right where I wanted him," said winning trainer Josie Carroll. "In fact, he had two works after that, simply because he came out of it so well, we had to sort of take the high note off of him a little bit four days ago so he could settle in this race. I think he's just a good horse and he's maturing. We're pretty happy with him today."

Romping in last year's Queen's Plate, Mighty Heart followed suit with a victory in the Prince of Wales S., but failed to fire next out in the Breeders S. last October. MARYLAND OVERNIGHT PURSES INCREASE

A 15% across-the-board increase for overnight purses in Maryland has been instituted for the rest of 2021 after a Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (MTHA) Board of Directors meeting June 29. The increase goes into effect at Pimlico July 2, the next date of live racing in the state.

Overnight purse distribution levels will also be restored. First place will be 60% (an increase from 57%); second place is 20% (a decrease from 21%); third place is 10% (down from 11%); and fourth place will be 5% (down from 6%). Fifth place will be 3% (plus 1% for the fifth-through-last place bonus) and sixth place will be 2% (plus 2% for the fifth-through-last place bonus). The 4% bonus remains in place for horses that finish seventh through last.

HORSEMEN'S GROUPS PARTNER ON HORSEMEN U CONTINUING EDUCATION PLATFORM

The California Thoroughbred Trainers (CTT), Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (MTHA) and New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (NYTHA) have teamed up to provide a Continuing Education platform for Thoroughbred trainers and assistant trainers called Horsemen U, which offers approved online CE webinars and issues CE certificates after a course and a short quiz have been completed. Trainers and assistant trainers can register, free of charge, and maintain their CE records in their account at www.HorsemenU.com.

Continuing education has been adopted as one of the core

Best Practices developed by the stakeholders involved in the Mid-Atlantic Strategic Plan to Reduce Equine Fatalities. CE requirements have been implemented in California, Delaware, Maryland, New York, and West Virginia. Pennsylvania and Virginia are in the process of adopting CE regulations.

All licensed trainers and assistant trainers in the U.S. are eligible to register for a Horsemen U account. There are currently 12 webinars offered on the platform, on topics ranging from "Diagnostic Imaging of the Racehorse Fetlock" to "Equine Drug Testing" to "Equine Welfare, Horse Racing and the Social License to Operate." The webinars have been hosted by the California Horse Racing Board, the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation's Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit and the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association.



ECLIPSE WHITTLED DOWN TO FOUR

Saturday's G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown has been cut to four after Thursday's confirmation stage, with Aidan O'Brien declaring just **St Mark's Basilica (Fr)** (Siyouni {Fr}) from his three initial entries left in earlier this week. With David Menuisier also opting to wait with Christopher Wright's Wonderful Tonight (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}), that means that Ballydoyle's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero faces two main rivals in the multiple Group 1 winners **Mishriff (Ire)** (Make Believe {GB}) and **Addeybb (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}) plus the Jockey Club also-ran **El Drama (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}). John Gosden said he thinks that the small field stands up in terms of quality as he prepares Prince Faisal's homebred for a potential third toplevel success having garnered last year's Prix du Jockey Club and the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan on his last start Mar. 27, as well as the Saudi Cup.

"I know it is a small, elite, purist field but what people have to realise is that it is a lot of money to enter these races, it is a lot of money at the first forfeit stage and it is a lot of money to confirm," he said. "When you have the likes of the front three here, they are not easy to take on so I think people slightly take that view point."

"I've got tonnes of respect for Addeyyb," Gosden added. "I think he is a wonderful horse. He has won a Champion S. and he has won in Sydney." Cont. p2

After one start for local trainer Raffaele Biondi that resulted in a runner-up effort in the May 23 G2 Derby Italiano, **Juan De Montalban (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) is headed back to Britain and to the yard of trainer David O'Meara after O'Meara and his assistant Jason Kelly went a sale-topping €400,000 for the 3-year-old at Arqana's Summer Sale on Thursday. Juan De Montalban (lot 488) had been bought by trainer Andrew Balding for 85,000gns as a Tattersalls October Book 1 yearling, and sold privately to Italy after posting back-to-back wins for Mick and Janice Mariscotti.

"We've bought him for Sheikh Abdullah Almalek Alsabah, who is a longstanding client," said O'Meara. "He's a lovely looking horse. I think he still has a lot of room to improve and hasn't yet shown us everything he is capable of."

Italian Derby Runner-Up To O'Meara cont. from p1

Following on from a selective market Wednesday, day two of the sale saw the clearance rate jump up to 85.8%, with 242 sold on the day for \in 5,054,500. The final tally for the mixed sale was 411 sold for \in 8,572,000, at a clearance rate of 80%, a new record. The average was \in 20,859 and the median \in 10,000. The second session of the Summer Sale included breeding stock and horses in training, but was dominated by the horses in training and The Channel Consignment likewise sold the winning 3-year-old **Parmenion (GB)** (Soldier Hollow {GB}) (lot 490) to Pierre Boulard, Harold Kirk and Willie Mullins for €230,000. Parmenion is a full-brother to the G3 Prix de Royaumont victress Pelligrina (GB), and their second dam is the recently deceased G1 Prix Vermeille scorer and influential broodmare Pearly Shells.

"He'll join Willie Mullins," said Boulard. "We're very happy. There's nothing not to like about him, he's a lovely horse that won his debut really well."

Another headed to Ireland is the Wertheimer et Frere-bred 3year-old **Zileo (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), who won over 2650 metres at Chateaubriant on Apr. 26 and was fourth in the recent Listed Derby du Languedoc. He is headed to Irish trainer Michael Halford after being bought by BBA Ireland's Michael Donohoe for \in 150,000. "He'll go to Ireland to be trained by Michael Halford," Donohoe said. "He'll be gelded and we'll give him a bit of time. His new owner wishes to run in Dubai, so that'll be his objective next year."

Saiga (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) (lot 356B) likewise heads to Ireland after her sale, but she has a different objective, purchased as she was as a broodmare in foal to Le Havre (Ire) by Horse France on behalf of Castlehyde Farm for \in 190,000.

COMMONWEALTH CUP RESULT STANDS

Connections of **Dragon Symbol (GB)** (Cable Bay {Ire}) have lost their appeal to have the colt's disqualification from victory in Royal Ascot's G1 Commonwealth Cup overturned.

Dragon Symbol and the American-trained filly **Campanelle** (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) fought out a thrilling stretch duel in the six furlong contest on June 18, with Dragon Symbol, ridden by Oisin Murphy, crossing the wire a head the better, but the placings were reversed on account of Dragon Symbol bumping Campanelle, ridden by Frankie Dettori, on numerous occasions during the run and taking her off her line. Stewards on the day deemed the interference was enough to have prevented Campanelle from winning, and a British Horseracing Authority disciplinary panel agreed on Thursday, dismissing an appeal brought by Dragon Symbol's owner Yoshiro Kubota and trainer Archie Watson.

The hearing involved the panel viewing the race from a variety of positions and hearing evidence from both jockeys, and a brief submission from Watson.

Dettori said he thought there were three instances of contact in the race, and that although he did not have to stop riding, the interference had caused Campanelle to lose her balance and combined with Dragon Symbol's "intimidation" had made Campanelle "unable to win the race" as the jockey was taken off his true line and "had no chance of keeping my horse straight." Dettori said he thought the interference cost he and Campanelle about 15 metres.

Graeme McPherson, representing Dragon Symbol's connections, said he thought the distance lost was more like six or seven metres, though all parties agreed Campanelle had been forced to move about six horse widths across the track. Murphy said he recalled two instances of contact, with the last occurring more than 100 metres from the line and Campanelle not heading Dragon Symbol inside the final half furlong. Murphy said he felt Dragon Symbol still had more to give "while Campanelle had given her all" and "had every chance to win the race."

Murphy also described an alleged conversation with Dettori outside the stewards' room, which Dettori said was "misheard or misinterpreted." Murphy said, "After the race, Frankie going into the stewards' inquiry, he didn't say to me either way he felt he was going to win the race in the stewards' inquiry, but he did say to me 'sorry kid, this is horse racing, you were on the best horse but that's life.'"

Watson in his evidence outlined Dragon Symbol's inexperience, how he has progressed in a short period of time and was having his first run in front of a significant crowd. He said the horse has never hung at home or in previous races. The Dragon Symbol team will have their deposit refunded.

Brian Barker, representing the panel of himself, Tim Etherington and Steve Winfield, said after the panel announced its decision, "We have given careful attention to the rules and guidelines and taken great care to consider the factual matters and arguments placed before us. Our conclusion is that the stewards did come to the right conclusion and that the appeal fails. In our view this was absolutely a debatable appeal, something which should have been given careful consideration and in our view the deposit should be returned."

Harry McCalmont, chairman of the IHRB, said, "Denis has made a huge contribution to our organisation, and indeed to the Irish horseracing industry in general both at home and abroad. He is highly regarded throughout the world of horseracing and has served the sport well both in Ireland and internationally. Announcing his decision now allows us to identify his successor in a planned way and we will commence this process soon. While we are sorry to see him leave, we fully respect his decision and would like to wish him well for the future."

BHA WHIP CONSULTATION OPENS

The British Horseracing Authority on Thursday opened a 10week open, public consultation on British racing's whip rules and penalities. The consultation, a recommendation of the industry's independently chaired Horse Welfare Board, aims to gather and assess the views of industry participants, stakeholders and wider audiences regarding the rules, use, and penalties for rule breaches.

The first part of the consultation is an online questionnaire that will be available until Sept. 6 and is open to anyone. The second part of the consultation will involve detailed discussions with relevant parties and focus groups.

Upon conclusion of the full consultation process the data, views and suggestions gathered will be considered by the Whip Consultation Steering Group, which includes representation from across the racing industry and wider sectors including politics, horse welfare and the media. Recommendations will be presented to the BHA Board for consideration and approval in early 2022.

The BHA has published three explanatory videos on how the consultation will work: how the process will work, about the whip and how the whip is used. A Q&A document is also available.

Julie Harrington, chief executive of the BHA, said, "At a time when societal and political views are constantly changing, the future health of our sport will depend in part on the maintenance of social licence and the trust that the public and politicians have in us. The racing industry must be willing to listen to and understand a range of perspectives if it is to prosper and safeguard its long-term future. Moreover, we must have rules and a penalty structure which are viewed as fair to participants and the betting public, which encourage riding within the rules and which deter rule breaches. By carrying out this consultation we are looking to signal and facilitate a positive, open debate about this important issue for our sport from the viewpoint of perception and fairness. We encourage everyone with an interest in the subject to take part in the consultation. This is your opportunity to be heard."

Brant Dunshea, chief regulatory officer for the BHA, said, "The consultation process will be open and transparent, and the views of all parties are welcome and will be considered. The decisions that result from this process are then racing's to make, guided by the consultation responses and the significant expertise that exists within the Steering Group. We encourage all respondents to make use of the supporting information in the consultation, which explains the current design of the whip, and the rules and penalties relating to its use, to ensure that anyone responding to the consultation is informed by the facts.

"This is a complex issue and not a binary one. The consultation will cover a broad range of ground regarding the use of the whip for encouragement, the rules under which the padded whips are used for this specific purpose, and the penalties for breaches of those rules. We ask everyone involved to take part in this debate constructively and respectfully."

FORMER JOCKEY JEREMY MAHOT HONORS LIAM TREADWELL

Former jump jockey Jeremy Mahot will honor the late Liam Treadwell by participating in the cross-Alps bicycle race. Mahot, 39, rode more than 70 winners before retiring in 2016 and now acts as head lad at the Oxfordshire yard of Noel Williams. Treadwell, winner of the 2009 Grand National, suffered a head injury following a fall at Bangor in 2016.

The Transalp Race spans 355 miles over (570 kilometres) seven days, including uphill ascents that total more than 18,000 altitude metres. Beginning on Sunday in Nauders in Austria and crossing both the Austrian and Swiss Alps, the race finishes in the Italian town of Riva del Garda.

Mahot set himself a fund-raising target of £5,000, with proceeds donated to brain injury charity Headway in memory of Treadwell, who died tragically June 23, 2020.

"I had my own personal battles with mental health at the start of the COVID pandemic, and a friend suggested mountain biking," said Mahot. "I knew then that I wanted to do something to raise more awareness about the link between concussion and depression, particularly within the racing industry--then I heard about Bike Transalp."

MARIANAFOOT CONTINUES MOMENTUM

Confirming the form of the May 30 G3 Prix du Palais-Royal, Jean-Claude Seroul's Marianafoot (Fr) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) again turned back Duhail (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) over the same ParisLongchamp track and seven-furlong trip to stretch his admirable and impressive winning run in Thursday's G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot. Breaking from the widest draw as he had last time, the 6-4 favourite again took it all in his stride with customary professionalism with his stable's Elusive Foot (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) instantly relieved of pacemaking duties. Beginning to apply the pressure from the 300-metre marker, the homebred lowered his head and powered to the line to make it seven wins on the spin from his old rival, who had a sizeable deficit to make up from the top of the straight and was never nearer than the 1 1/2 lengths that separated them at the line. "It will be very interesting now to go for the [G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest [at Deauville Aug. 8]," commented trainer Jerome Reynier, whose annus mirabilis continues. "We've always had that race in the back of our mind if he did everything expected of him and that is exactly what he has done so far. We've already tried him on the straight course at Deauville and he handled that very well and the [6 1/2-furlong] trip will be very good for him." Cont. p8

"I just hope it doesn't rain too much at that time, but he's been so good to us he deserves to try for something bigger. We hope for the best, knowing there will be very good horses in the race and whatever happens he'll come back here for the [Sept. 12 G3 Prix du] Pin to prepare for the [Oct. 3 G1 Prix de la] Foret and then we'll try and find a good home for him at stud."

Threatening to steal a large amount of the thunder from connections' Skalleti (Fr) (Kendargent {Fr}) with his relentless progress, Marianafoot is now 11 wins from 16 starts since joining his current stable including two renewals of Deauville's Listed Prix Luthier, Chantilly's Listed Prix Servanne Apr. 26 and Doha's Irish Thoroughbred Marketing Cup in February 2019. The chestnut has needed time to mature and is in the right hands when it comes to the patient approach.

Pedigree Notes

Marianafoot's dam Marianabaa (Fr) (Anabaa) has already produced the 4-year-old Padron (Ire) (Gris de Gris {Ire}), who enjoys the same slowly-improving profile and took the Listed Prix Altipan and was third in the G3 Dusseldorfer Fruhjahrs-Meile this season. The second dam is the Listed Prix des Lilas scorer and G3 Prix Chloe runner-up Maria Gabriella (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who produced the listed scorer Mariafoot (Fr) from a mating with Marianafoot's sire Footstepsinthesand. Maria Gabriella is kin to the Listed Prix Volterra winner and G3 Prix d'Aumale and G3 Prix Miesque runner-up Night of Light (Ire) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) and to last year's G2 Dante S. runner-up Highest Ground (Ire) (Frankel {GB}). Marianabaa's 3-year-old full-sister to Marianafoot named Marianansand (Fr) was fourth in the recent Listed Prix Aymeri de Mauleon, while she also has the unraced 2-year-old colt Mariananchic (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}).

FUNSTAR SET TO SELL ON INGLIS DIGITAL

DARLEY FLIGHT STAKE

The connections of G1 Flight S. winner **Funstar** (Adelaide {Ire}) are confident sales records can be re-written when they offer the star mare through the upcoming Inglis Digital July (Early) Online Sale. Inglis has confirmed that Funstar, who hails from one of the most current families in the Studbook as a half-sister to G1 Queensland Oaks winner Youngstar (High Chaparral {Ire}) and being out of a three-quarter sister to triple Group 1 winner Tofane (NZ) (Ocean Park {NZ}), would be the star attraction of its next Digital Sale.

Unbeaten as a 2-year-old, Funstar won five of her 18 starts for trainer Chris Waller, including her victory in the Flight S. and wins in the G2 Tea Rose S. and G2 Phar Lap S. She was also runner-up in the G1 Surround S., G1 Queen of the Turf S. and G1 Epsom H., earning over \$1.1 million in prizemoney.

Managing owner Olly Koolman is helping oversee the sale of Funstar and has high expectations of where the market will assess her.

"She's a very, very strong filly, she has a great hindquarter, a beautiful shoulder, angles and a deep girth. She's a very strong and athletic mare to be breeding from," he told *TDN AusNZ*.

"The main thing about these prospective broodmares is that they aren't emptied out on the track. She's retiring as a 4-year-old. She's sound and hasn't been over-raced. "She has been well looked after, was given time when she needed it and she had short preparations. For a mare to translate from a racehorse to a broodmare, it is important that they are not left empty. There's plenty of gas in her tank."

Those looking for a gauge as to what Funstar might be worth only need to look to her half-sister Youngstar, who was secured for \$1.4 million by Katsumi Yoshida when offered at last year's Inglis Chairman's Sale. There are few people better placed to assess the comparison between Youngstar and Funstar than Koolman, who picked out both through the Inglis sales ring as yearlings at the Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale and Australian Easter Yearling Sale respectively.

"They are quite different horses. They are similar to look at but Youngstar stood over a lot more ground and we treated her as a bit of a stayer. She ran in two Melbourne Cups, but it is clear in hindsight, that her best performances were over that 2000 metre range, where she won the Queensland Oaks and ran second to Winx in the Turnbull S.," Koolman said.

"Youngstar was a proper 2000 metre horse, Funstar was a little bit stronger and has a far superior turn of foot. Her better performances were over 1400 to 1600 metres."

From the Top Shelf

Inglis' General Manager Bloodstock Sales and Marketing, Sebastian Hutch, said there was much anticipation about bringing a mare of such quality to the Digital Platform and said Funstar fulfilled the criteria of being a top-end broodmare prospect.

"She was a top-class race mare and it's not just about producing the occasional top-class performance, she was consistently very, very good," Hutch said. "Her second start, she beat a horse called Leviathan, who went on to be a really top-class horse in Hong Kong (as Healthy Happy). Her 3-year-old form was bombproof. She had an immense record through that spring of her 3-year-old season.

"She used to regularly beat a high-class filly in Probabeel, who came back and squared the ledger later on, but certainly in the early parts of their career, Funstar had a very evident advantage over her."

Hutch described Funstar's pedigree as 'arguably the most progressive in Australasia', boosted further by Tofane's recent Group 1 double in the Stradbroke H. and Tatt's Tiara.

"That pedigree has bred up hugely in recent years and there is more to come. There's a Pierro sibling yet to go to the races and a full brother to Funstar to come. Tofane also has a full sibling and races on through next season," he said. "I saw Funstar recently on the farm and she's a beautiful mare, has lovely quality and a fantastic temperament. Youngstar was a good-looking mare, but I'd venture to say Funstar is an even better-looking mare and it's very exciting to be able to put her on the market."

International Appeal

The global appeal of the pedigree is clear from the fact Youngstar is now beginning her broodmare career in Japan at Northern Farm having visited Kizuna (Jpn) earlier this year. Hutch sees no reason why international interest won't come for her half-sister when bidding in the July (Early) Online Sale begins on July 9 and finishes on July 14.

"Our broodmare sales series this year has seen international interest in the best stock. The domestic buyers have been very strong and it hasn't been easy for those international buyers to land a blow, but certainly there's been interest and I'd fully expect that of a mare of this quality," he said.

"She is a granddaughter of Galileo, out of a mare by Danehill, out of an international family that has proven itself in Australasia and around the world, you would have to think she satisfies all the criteria that people look for."

New Zealand G1 Rundown Australian Bloodstock Buys Biscayne Bay Criminal Defence Sold To HK Camelot's Hosier Impresses Koolman also expects global interest for the 4-year-old, but points to the recent record-breaking broodmare sales in Sydney and the Gold Coast as evidence of the strength of the local buying bench. "It was internationals that fought it out when it was Youngstar's turn in the ring but having said that, the real money is here in Australia at the moment. Our industry seems to be the envy of everyone and we are quite confident she will stay on our shores," he said.

A Digital Endorsement

The growth in the Inglis Digital platform and the way in which Inglis handled the virtual and digital sales formats during last year's COVID-19 shutdowns has impressed Koolman. He and the other owners, which include Inglis Deputy Chairman Arthur Inglis, have every faith Funstar will realise her full value.

"They have really shown themselves as leaders in the game. Obviously, we are close to the Inglis family and they are part of the ownership group of Funstar, but I'm honoured to think we can produce a horse and sell it on the Digital platform to show everyone how well it can work," Koolman said. "If she realises the sort of money that her half-sister did, she will be a record-breaker."

The previous record on the Inglis Digital platform was the \$800,000 realised by Members Joy (Hussonet {USA}) at the Inglis June (Early) Sale, while the highest price achieved on any digital platform in Australasia is the NZ\$1,202,500 paid by Daniel Nakhle and Darren Brady for Spanish Whisper (Lope De Vega {Ire}) on Gavelhouse Plus last October. Hutch said that with the great opportunity to sell Funstar comes the responsibility to ensure she gets the best price and his team would leave no stone unturned in its bid to secure competition for her.

"It's going to be contingent on us delivering a positive result or a result the market deems as a positive one. It's a fantastic opportunity for us, but by the same token it comes with a certain degree of responsibility," he said. "We have had fantastic results with lesser-credentialled race fillies and mares. At our Digital Sale this week we had fillies sell for up to \$320,000 and the Sale prior up to \$355,000. They were race fillies who were stakes winners or stakes placed, but to offer a filly like Funstar is stepping into another league all together.

"The \$800,000 for Members Joy was an indication of the capacity of the platform to achieve those sorts of results but Funstar will be the next test of it. I would say with a fair degree of confidence, a very big result is in the offing."

The Funstar news comes off the back of a very successful June (Late) Online auction, which concluded on Wednesday and grossed just short of \$6 million. It was confirmed on Thursday that Randwick Bloodstock and Bellview Park had paid \$220,000 for stakes-placed Gem Of Scotland (Rothesay), who had initially passed in short of her reserve.
